The Affum-Darkwah Mission International (TADMI) Inc. is pleased to be part and supports the ten principles of the UN Global Compact with respect to human rights, labor, environment and anti-corruption during the past 2 years. With this commitment, we express our intent to support the Global Compact advancing these principles, and will make a clear statement of this commitment to our stakeholders and the general public.

Our participation in the UN Global compact has been very much rewarding as conferences and monthly bulletin enlighten us on how to tackle the continual growth of poverty and hunger in the world

TADMI Inc. is now a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, with the aim of providing hope to the needy & care for orphans to end the cycle of Poverty for them to be self-sustainable. Donations are tax deductible.

Currently, TADMI focus in the following major areas:

- ❖ **Education:** Providing books and supplies to schools and individuals.
- ❖ **Social Welfare/Homes:** Providing support to orphanages homes and individuals
- ❖ **Hospitals / health care:** Providing hospital supplies to clinics and hospitals in Ghana
- ❖ **Soup Kitchen:** Provide monthly soup Kitchens to our community and the hungry
- ❖ **Food Bank:** Provide supplementary food supplies to the needy in the community.
- ❖ **Clean Up Activities:** Occasionally organize clean-up activities in any area we find necessary

Since TADMI began three years ago and despite the economic hardship, we have been providing monthly soup kitchens, clothing children, assisting orphanage homes, schools and hospital. We have also placed individuals in trade schools. We provide educational support to children who are not able to go to school and spend time by our office library to learn skills that will last them a life time.

We ask friends, co-workers, schools, Hospitals and the general public to donate their unused clothes shoes; books, computers etc to TADMI. Items that may be considered unwanted here in the US are brand new somewhere in Africa and it put smiles on people faces, which is our PRIDE.

In 2013 the total amount of capital, loans, personal contribution from Daniel and his wife, Batungwor, donations and miscellaneous monies received by TADMI was \$46,660 and \$25,000 loan to fund storage facility.

Being that this was the initiation stage of TADMI more funding was spent on the building the establishment than the actual program and services provided to the needy, orphans and those we want to help. More funding went into the Administrative cost, Bills, Utilities, and Program expenses.

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We spent \$15,980 to provide monthly soup Kitchens, support for orphanages, donation of clothes and shoes to orphanage homes, donation of hospital supplies to area clinics and providing support to families and paying school fees. A major success of the year was the establishment of a community library to help develop the reading skills of children in the Gbetsile, Ashaiman, No. 1 Kakasunanka areas and helping the schools in the area with books to facilitate effective teaching and learning in their respective schools.

We also started our successful Flagship Program for the first year running - our **"TADMI Monthly Soup Kitchen"** Project in Gbetsile and its environs. The public presentations of food to the homeless and struggling families have motivated parents to ask their children to be part of our activities. This has helped us in enrolling more children in the community library.

We spent \$11,450 on Administrative cost, which most of it went to the preparation of our registration and incorporation document. Some of this money was also used for compensation for our field staff and those who volunteer with us.

Most of the money generated, went to occupancy and building of our new office and warehouse in Ghana, storage fees for donated items in the USA and transportation to pick donated items.

Our promotional program and services which included advertisement, raising awareness of what we do, publications, printing of brochures and newsletters also consumed parts of the money raised during 2013.

In conclusion, in fiscal year 2013, TADMI raised \$46,660 out of this money, \$63,780 was spent on our total program and administrative expenses, and the balance left to enter into 2014 was \$5,760.00.

At TADMI Inc, we recognize that it is only with the help of many faithful donors and volunteers that we will be able to achieve all that was done. Thank you to all our team members and supports and we look forward to even brighter years ahead.

We also pledge to participate in and engage with the UN Global Compact by providing education and support to the poor and underprivileged in our society to alleviate the cycles of poverty, hopelessness and dependencies of many kinds, from people and to see their lives transformed to hope, joy and lasting prosperity. And also provide emergency relief assistance through humanitarian aides, clean water, medicine, educational materials, homes, support for orphans and aged, skills training and micro-enterprise development assistance.

We recognize that a key requirement for participation in the Global Compact is the submission of a Communication on Engagement (COE) that describes our organization's efforts to support the Implementation of the ten principles and to engage with the Global Compact. We support public Accountability and transparency, and therefore commit to report on progress within two years of joining the Global Compact and every two years thereafter according to the Global Compact COE policy.
