III. Human Rights

Principle 1: Businesses should support and respect the protection of internationally proclaimed

human rights; and

Principle 2: make sure that they are not complicit in human rights abuses.



The Foundation supports in its day-to-day activities the basic principles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and other generally recongnized norms of International Law.

Over the period of this report the National Projects Foundation did not receive any complaints connected with non-observance of human rights.

IV. Labour Rights


Principle 3: Businesses should uphold the freedom of association and the effective recognition

of the right to collective bargaining;

Principle 4: the elimination of all forms of forced and compulsory labour;

Principle 5: the effective abolition of child labour; and

Principle 6: the elimination of discrimination in respect of employment and occupation.



The Foundation considers its people as the most important value of the company. The Foundation does it utmost to create conditions for optimal use of potential of human resources and observance of labour rights of human.

During the period of this Report we have not received any complaints connected with non-observance of human rights.

Any cases of discrimination, child labour, forced and compulsory labour, bans of association and collective bargaining over the report period did not occur.

V. Environment
