To expand and fortify the Social Responsibility culture, work groups were organized, its first work plan was made, communication tools were used and an internal Social Responsibility evaluation was made to each factory or area in which 21 Organizational Units participated.

To fulfill the commitment established, we sent to the offices of the UN Global Compact in New York and Mexico, the report of the activities.

Lala obtained for the fourth consecutive year recognition as a Social Responsible Company as part of the CEMEFI-Aliarse (Centro Mexicano para la Filantropía y Alianza por la Responsabilidad Social Empresarial) (Mexican Center for Philanthropy and Alliance for a Social Responsible Company).

A group of milk producers founded the Milk Producers Credit Union of Torreon, whose objective was to create an association with a common objective for all the producers, who produced and distributed dairy products using traditional methods, offering financial help needed to buy supplies and fodder. In 1950, Pasteurizadora Laguna was founded in Torreon; in order to market the milk from all the associated producers with the mission to "Offer a quality product to contribute with the nourishment of the Mexican people and to deliver safely to the consumer, the best milk in the country".

Obtaining results which scientifically support that:

This kind of milk helps to maintain an adequate level of cholesterol.

The study was made with the support of Dr. Adolfo Chávez Villasana, from the Instituto Nacional de Nutricion y Ciencias Medicas Salvador Zubirán.

"The effectiveness of yogurt with probiotics and prebiotics in helping intestinal function of the Mexican population".

Instituto Lala also offers information to health professionals, participating in different congresses

of nutrition, gastroenterology, pediatrics and cardiology, among other specialties.

A magazine campaign was launched, communicating the "How are you? Your health matters"

program benefits and the results of the scientific study of Lala yogurt and Lala Vive with Fiber.

Conferences to different public and private schools throughout the whole country are held to

provide information about food types and groups.

Consumer Health and Safety

Consumers' health and safety are the most important things for us, that's are why we have

procedures in the products cycle of life that allow us to make sure that they always get the best.

Lala has an integrated Safety Food system based on the requirements and guidelines of certifying

organizations like Quality Chekd and Mexico Calidad Suprema.

HACCP System:

We have the following certifications:

HACCP: Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Points.

It's a preventive tool to protect food from the reception of raw material and packaging to the consumers' table. Its application is compatible with safety procedures like the regulations of ISO 9000.

The main benefits are:

- a) Waste, rejection and incidents reduction during production or service.
- b) Productivity increase.
- c) Increasing commitment to the client requirements.
- d) Encouraging continuous improvement.

Quality Chekd: Is an organization focused on continuous counseling to dairy industries, to insure the quality of the processes and their products. It was founded 60 years ago and has over 35 members in Latin America; the organization counsels, assesses and validates their performance through auditing programs, training and independent tests made by third parties.

KOSHER: This is a certification given by the Jewish community and it's given to products made with natural origin ingredients.

FDA: This is a certification given by the Food and Drug Administration. The FDA is an agency of the United States Department of Health and Human Services and is responsible for regulating and supervising the safety of foods and drugs, dietary supplements, among others.

The official Brand "Mexico Calidad Suprema" is given by the Mexican government to the agricultural products of the country that fulfill the strict Mexican regulations and that have a superior quality guarantee.

The basic principles of the Supreme Quality brand are:

Sanitation: Trusting that the products have been produced, transformed, packaged and distributed under adequate conditions of hygiene and sanitation.

Harmlessness: Insuring that the consumption causes no harm to health.

Quality: Certainty that the products stand out for their superior quality, due to their qualities, properties and nature.

SGS: Management System Certification based on the BPM, HACCP and Codex Alimentarius

requirements.

We have procedures to produce, liberate, handle and store products, supervised by the Quality

Control and Research and Development areas.

Bacteriological, physiochemical and sensory analysis are being implemented in the Good

Manufacturing Practices. Certified external laboratories validate these. We maintain the cold chain

to its maximum level so that the product doesn't lose lifetime and we can guarantee its quality

when it gets to our final client.

All the raw materials that are used in our processes, as well as the corresponding suppliers, are

subject to a period of analysis and quality control, to insure that the norms and specifications are

being met.

Self-Regulation Code

In order to have a better communication about the benefits of our products, we make previous

research work with Instituto Lala, Research & Development and with the Marketing areas.

This year we signed the adhesion letter to the "Self Regulation Code for Publicity of Food and Non

Alcoholic Beverages for Children" watched and carried out by the CONAR (Self Regulation Council

and Publicity Ethics). Instituto Lala has the endorsement of the Mexican Diabetes Federation for

the products, which can be taken by people who have this illness and obtained the recommendation from the Mexican Committee for Osteoporosis Preventions (COMOP) for the

extra calcium milk.

Having a source of talent with potential to cover long term and medium term needs is a priority. The program University Lala Students Projection, attracts, holds and develops talent proposed by the Institutions with which we have established agreements. During the first stage, 19 out of 200 candidates were admitted to the 2008 program.

Initiatives of the company to improve the quality of life at work

It's a privilege being a motor that thrusts progress for individuals and families that are committed with our mission.

The initiatives to improve the quality of life at work include:

A campaign to promote values, suggestion mailbox, study of the working environment with actions to improve it, awards to collaborators, a program to improve facilities and working conditions, ergonomic study using NIOSH system (it's a method that evaluates load limit recommended, and also determines the variables to be modified in each working situation).

Lala is aware of the people's dignity

In Lala we recognize each person's dignity. Nobody is discriminated by gender, marital status, age, religion, race, physical ability, political preference or social class.

Hiring processes are open and with no distinction. Promotion based on competences and not by gender.

Health and Safety at work

Safety is everybody's responsibility and in Lala it's an employments condition. We want to fortify a safety culture that allows minimizing the risks involved in the activities of the collaborators to prevent accidents and to preserve the environment.

We also have medical exams to new comers; annual check ups and special exams.

The company gives a personal protection kit (safety shoes, back support belts, ear plugs, safety glasses, leather and synthetic safety gloves, pants and shirts, etc.) to collaborators whose job requires it.

In collaboration with the unions, Hygiene and Safety Commissions are organized in the working centers.

Industrial safety and occupational health

During 2008, the program STOP (Safety Training Observation Program) was strengthened in all the facilities. This industrial safety program is based on people's conduct and its fundament is that every lesion and illness can be avoided.

STOP is the basis of the program Occupational Health in Lala, and it helps us change bad habits at work; changing them into safe practices, making safe working conditions in every work center.

We also have the program named SOL (Safety, Order and Cleanliness), which consists on the detection of non-safe condition and the immediate adaptation.

Prevention

All working centers with the support of the IMSS's Preventive Medicine program, practice the health and safety week. These are preventive and early detection of chronic and degenerative illnesses like obesity, hypertension and diabetes campaigns. Also included are informative AIDS and breast cancer campaigns. Vaccines against, measles, tetanus and influenza are promoted.

Bonding activities with the families of the collaborators

In direct relation with the adequate balance between life and work, we have activities to bond collaborators and their families with the Values of Lala. Some of the daily activities are:

Good Neighbor

In Lala we want to have a respectful relationship based on the comprehension of the social and cultural characteristics, and the environment of the communities where we operate.

A permanent commitment

Lala foundation is joining the multiple efforts organized by the civilian society and the federal, state and municipal governments, to fight nourishment poverty, donating thousands of gallons of milk and tons of dairy products to Food Banks and it's mainly focused on the children whose situation is vulnerable.

Lala foundation programs 2008

Nourishing a hope

Through this effort, vulnerable youngsters or in a special situation, living in places as distant as Tijuana, Reynosa or Acapulco, receive two glasses of milk a day.

Some of these children are living in shelters located in small rural communities like Tehua in Durango or in big population centers, like Mexico City. Many of the beneficiaries are in native communities like the Tarahumara or Zongolica, or in urban centers like Guadalajara or Torreon, Gomez Palacio and Lerdo.

United against hunger

Poverty, and specially food poverty, is one of the government's, company's and society's challenges that have to be overcome.

There are times when the difference between eating or not eating at all, for one of the people beneficiated by this program, is exactly the dairy product they are receiving.

Every week, and through the food bank that belongs to the Mexican Association of Food banks (AMBA), products from our company are delivered to 1956 communities, associations and institutions throughout the country.

Lala's Foundation Mission is to "Contribute with nourishment of poor, unprotected people, especially children".

Overcoming marginalization

This year we made official the program "Overcoming marginalization", through which we contribute to nourish people who live in marginal communities, especially children, by delivering some of our products.

This way, through other foundations, we are present in the following highly excluded zones: Sierra Tarahumara (7 municipalities), Cuatro Cienegas Semi Desert (1 municipality), Mixteca de Oaxaca (31 municipalities), Zona Mazahua (12 municipalities), where they have beneficiated 27,224 children with 36,000 monthly kilos of Lala products during 2008.

We also collaborate with other projects like "Chispitas", through which we encourage the participation of 2,080 Mixtec children in productive and commercialization projects, reforestation and cultural activities in their communities.

In Cuatro Cienegas Coah. we help 985 children and 60 teachers from the municipality schools and 4 common lands, which constitute the reservation, participate in environmental education workshops to preserve the valuable patrimony of Cuatro Cienegas.

Propelling La Laguna Region

Besides the children and adults living in 35 shelters or the people who benefit through the 2 food banks that exist in La Laguna Region, the Foundation assigns economical and other kind of support to fortify the activities undertaken by many organizations or groups from the civilian society.

Just like in the past 8 years, culture, education, health, social assistance, community development and environmental issues have integrated the main cause of the projects we support.

Some associations and institutions have received our contribution: Museo Arosena, Cruz Roja, Instituto de Desarrollo Integral, Asociación Pro Niños con Leucemia de la Laguna, Fundación Down, Cáritas de Torreón, Tecnológico de Monterrey, DIF Torreón, among others.

The Foundation helped 18 projects with economical contributions, to strengthen the infrastructure and operation of these groups, among them are: Museo de Arte Popular –Mexico City, Fundación de Empresarios por la Educación Básica, Museo Bebe Leche –Durango, Hospital Universitario –Nuevo León, Reforestemos México, A.C., Fundación Pro Mixteca, A.C., Mexico's, Fndación Teleton, among others.

Godfather program

The donation of time, talent and economical resources from different companies of the Group, is added to the tasks of Lala's Foundation, and is now a permanent allied.

Contingencies and emergencies

Without having the magnitude like the one from Tabasco 2007, this year has been characterized by a larger number of events of a lesser magnitude, non the less, leaving thousand of victims.

Fundacion Lala has been present in the following communities that were affected: Floods in Tlaltenango, Zac. Calvillo, El Llano in Aguascalientes, Parral Chih., San Pedro, Matamoros, Madero and Torreon Coah., victims in Tabasco and Minatitlan Ver.

A committed team of volunteers that makes the Foundation's task possible supports these programs.

Social Responsibility Alliances

We made an alliance with the government of Coahuila State, in order to support the population with low resources through the program "Hand in Hand with Nutrition" and with the program "Nutri People". It consists of a subsidy of millions of pasteurized milk.

Also, through the Social Founding of Milk Producers of Gomez Palacio, Dgo. 360 thousand pesos were granted in a joint effort with the Municipality.

We maintain alliances with the Municipal Presidency of Cuatro Cienegas Coah, the CONAFE, Asociación Mexicana de Bancos de Alimentos (AMBA), Instituto para el Desarrollo de la Mixteca, Fundación de Empresarios por la Educación Básica y el Proyecto Concentrate A.C.

Supporting the community

We are supporting the improvement of the infrastructure of the neighborhoods and municipalities by rehabilitating parks, making contributions for waste deposits, platforms and sacks, cleaning canals and surrounding areas, repairing schools, public lighting, forestation, responding to the needs of the surrounding communities of our facilities throughout the country.

We also maintain the traditions of Mexico and support communities with their celebrations, parades, and popular festivities.

Emergency Brigades

Emergency brigades integrated in Lala's Working Centers, collaborate with the Civil Protection office, Corporate Organizations and Educational Institutions to attend emergencies in the places where we are present. This year we made the first Macro Chemical Drill in Azcapotzalco, Mexico City.

In La Laguna Region we participated in local and national competitions of emergency brigades, winning second place for extinguishers' handling and health attention. We also trained firemen in the use of autonomous and encapsulated air to handle dangerous material.

The emergency brigades are part of the coordination organisms like GAME (Enterprise Help Group), CELPE (Coordination of Organizations in la Laguna for Emergencies), OSPI (Construction Work and Services for La Laguna's Industrial Park) and the CICA (Institutions with Environmental Certification Committee).

Lala and the culture

The Cow Parade in Tijuana

The third edition of the countries most important urban art exhibition called Cow Parade was held in Tijuana, Baja California during June and July 2008. Over 1,500,000 people attended to appreciate the 70 artistic pieces on fiberglass cows. 220 thousand pesos from the proceedings of the auction were donated to the DIF Tijuana.

Cultural Promotion in La Laguna Region

We attend and support the main cultural and sport events of the Region. Among others: temporary expositions in the Arocena Musem, Coahuila Cultural Festival, Sport Galery and regional Fairs.

Lala and sports

In March 2008 the twentieth edition of Lala's International Marathon, was held. This marathon holds the second place in participation in Mexico, and the most important in the country. This year more than 4,200 people from different countries participated.

Lala's International Marathon is known for having the biggest number of spectators along its route. The enthusiastic motivation from the population of the La Laguna Region is one of the reasons that many runners come back to participate.

To organize this sport event, collaborators from Lala volunteer in all the areas of the organization like logistic, attention to the runners, special guests and authorities. Obtaining a high quality race and the warmth of the people is what that characterizes this event.

Sponsoring sport teams

Lala supports sports as one of the main activities that favor a healthy life style.

We still sponsor the Mexican Soccer Federation and all of their national teams, the national team, Sub 20, Sub 17 and women national team.

National Referee Commission

In Lala we are sure of the importance of encouraging the fair game inside and outside the field, that's why this year we started giving support to more than 600 referees in the country. We are doing this through an exclusive sponsorship to the National Referee Commission, in order to help training and to improve the performance of the Mexican referees.

Club Santos Laguna

Lala is a fighting, passionate institution, just like Club Santos Laguna. We are the team of a whole Region, for this reason and because we are proud of our origins in this Region, we support this winning soccer team.

Mexican Olympic Committee

We support the Mexican athletes as a way to promote a healthy life style, through exercising a sport. That's why this is the third year that we sponsor The Mexican Olympic Committee, in order to give the high level athletes the quality and nutrition of our products in their daily nutrition.

The factories also sponsor sports and leisure activities among the collaborators. They have teams that compete in amateur leagues, and organize Inter Lala tournaments as well as between other companies.

Every negotiations and collaboration with government authorities, made in representation of the company, with offices or government representatives, are done according to the applicable laws.

All the necessary licenses and permits are obtained to run projects such as non-hazardous solid remnants handling, waste collection programs, environmental impact research, civil protection program, exclusive Federal and State environmental licenses, among others.

In a joint effort with Television Azteca, a reforestation campaign called "Un Nuevo Bosque" (A New Forest") was launched. This was done in order to preserve and create more green areas throughout the whole country. This year we were present in Cuernavaca, Zapopan and Aguascalientes, and planted 16,500 trees in these regions.

Environment

Deterioration of the environment is one of the greatest worries of humanity and for Lala too. This is the reason why the company is making a series of initiatives oriented o promote sustainable development in all the communities where it operates.

During the period of the report, the work of the committees and the environmental groups in each work center, was strengthen, as well as diffusion of the relevant information and interchange of the best practices in the subject.

Clean Industry

The factories of the group participate in the Clean Industry voluntary certification program, which takes place by the Procuraduria de Proteccion al Ambiente (PROFEPA) (Environmental Protection Office). Up to now, eight of them have been certified and the rest are in the process.

All of the Plants and Distribution Centers have energy saving and effective use of energy programs and campaigns.

Biodiversity care

Preserving the existing resources and using them in a sustainable way, are two lines of action required by biodiversity.

Besides of the actions relative to the use of the responsible use of the natural resources and energy preservation, in Lala we want to contribute with our effort in the areas where we operate.

Facility Initiatives

Lala Irapuato: Care of the protected area of the Temascatío River and the construction of a plant for residual water treatment.

Lala Mazatlán: 380 green turtles were liberated in front of the Aquarium in Mazatlan. Beaches, canals and estuaries were cleaned. Accumulated reforestation during the year consisted in 650-planted trees.

Transportadora de Alimentos: Emission to the atmosphere from permanent sources (cauldron) and waste treatment discharged to the municipal sewer verification program.

Nuplen Alimentos: Planting trees and collection and disposal of used batteries.

South Pacific Region: Restored 200 yards of the National Park El Veladero.

Emission Control

To minimize the environmental impact of the transportation used with logistic goals, Lala has a strict maintenance system, that controls mileage and fuel consumed, and it calculates whenever the unit requires calibration. The system is programmed so that every 3,000 miles the unit is serviced. This prevention allows the units to be in optimum work and safety condition, and also complies with the environmental norms established by the federal and state organisms.

Energy saving

All the Plants and Distribution Centers have programs and campaigns to use efficiently and save energy, some of them have it implemented since a few years back.

Water care

100% of our factories comply with the Mexican official water norm NOM 127SSA-1994. This Mexican Official Norm establishes the quality permissible limits and the treatments to be used and consumed by humans, which the public and private supply system or any organization that distributes it in has to comply with.

Some initiatives that reflect the adequate use and care of the water are: Water saving projects that helped decrease 13% the consumption, recovering water from condensations and machine drains, investment in a residual water treatment Plant, use of extracted water fro the retro wash of the sand and carbon filters and from the cooling molds.

Lala Tizayuca: Recuperation from drains of the lubrication equipment, from condensers and frozen water.

Elopak: Generated 9,276,490 lbs of waste, 84% were recycled.

Derivados Lácteos Yoghurt and Lala México: Recycles 48% from solid waste, like plastic, wood and cardboard.

Quesos: Recycles 70% of plastic, wood and cardboard.

Tecnopak Laguna: Recycles from 25% to 30% del polyethylene.

Lala Derivados Lácteos Irapuato: Uses high-density polyethylene and recycles 35%.

Lala Veracruz: Recycles 35% de material like brik, corrugate and plastic containers.

Setylsa: Recycles paper sheets and according to the consumption of this material, a 15% reduction from last year was noted.

Lala Mazatlán: Recycles 10.47% of all the materials used.

Nuplen Alimentos: Recycles 47.6% of the waste generated during the year (250 tons)

Lala Torreón: Recycles cardboard used for raw material and packaging destined for our distribution centers. Recycles 70% of plastic waste. The platforms are 100% recycled.

Nuplen Químicos: Recycles 8.89% (cans and containers).

Tecnopak Laguna: 30% of the materials for the process and packaging are recovered and re utilized. 99% of the material used to produce the canisters is recycled and used again.

Ultra Lala: Recycles 100% of the wood, plastic, cardboard, glass, steel pieces, aluminum, copper, etc.

South Pacific Region: Recycles el 80% of the cardboard and wood and 60% of the plastic used.

Lala constantly recycles waste from the materials used in the processes and only sends to the dumpsites the materials and waste that is not recyclable, previous classification.

Hazardous waste, classified as such based on the CRETIB analysis, is handled according to the Mexican environmental laws.

During the year, Lala made considerable investments for the environmental protection, for the construction of water treatment plants, cauldron conversion, changes in order to use natural gas, environmental research, environmental audits, waste disposal, changed delivery units from fuel to

gas, cauldron maintenance, residual water neutralization, among others, and also has continuous improvement plans.
