Dear Mr. Secretary-General,


I am writing to express Terrestrial Energy's firm commitment to the Ten Principles of the United Nations Global Compact on human rights, labour, environment, and anti-corruption. As an organization, Terrestrial Energy prides itself on its ongoing efforts to develop technologies that will provide widespread clean energy, and in turn, advance the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). With this letter, Terrestrial Energy pledges to continue to make this, and the Ten Principles, core to its business strategy and operations, and to engage in partnerships that will advance the Sustainable Development Goals.

Terrestrial Energy acknowledges that as a part of its commitment to the UN Global Compact, it must submit a Communication on Progress (COP) on an annual basis, outlining Terrestrial Energy's efforts to implement the Ten Principles of the United Nations Global Compact, and the outcome of these efforts. Terrestrial Energy commits to doing so within one year of joining the UN Global Compact, and annually thereafter, according to the UN Global Compact COP policy. This will include:

- A statement signed by the chief executive expressing continued support for the UN Global Compact, and renewing Terrestrial Energy's ongoing commitment to the initiative and its principles. This is separate from its initial letter of commitment to join the UN Global Compact.
- A description of practical actions (i.e., disclosure of any relevant policies, procedures, activities) that the company has taken, or plans to undertake, to implement the UN Global Compact principles in each of the four issue areas (human rights, labour, environment, anti-corruption).
- A measurement of outcomes, i.e., the degree to which targets and performance indicators were met, or other qualitative or quantitative measurements of results.

Terrestrial Energy sincerely looks forward to collaborating with the United Nations Global Compact in implementing the Ten Principles, and in pursuing the SDGs.
