Dear Mr. Secretary-General,

I am pleased to confirm that Interpipe Company is absolutely committed to the Ten Principles of the United Nations Global Compact on human rights, labour, environment, and anti-corruption. With this communication, we would like to express our intent to reenter the UN Global Compact. We are full of determination to make the UNGC principles a part of the strategy, culture, and day-to-day operations of our Company, to get engaged in collaborative projects that advance the broader development goals of the United Nations, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals, and to communicate its principles to our stakeholders and the general public.

We recognize that a key requirement for participation in the UN Global Compact is the annual submission of a Communication on Progress (COP) that describes our Company's efforts to implement the Ten Principles. Unfortunately, we had to adjourn the submission process and withdraw from Global Compact Network Ukraine due to its suspension. We are aimed at resuming our membership and submitting annual COP reports to the UNGC representative in Ukraine.

We support public accountability and transparency, and therefore commit to report on our progress within one year of joining the UN Global Compact, and annually thereafter according to the UN Global Compact COP policy. This includes the following:

- A statement, signed by the chief executive, expressing the continued support for the UN Global Compact and renewing our ongoing commitment to the initiative and its principles. This is an additional document to back up our initial letter of commitment to join the UN Global Compact.
- A description of practical actions (i.e., disclosure of any relevant policies, procedures, or activities) that the Company has taken (or plans to undertake) to implement the UN Global Compact principles in each of the four issue areas (human rights, labour, environment, and anti-corruption).
- A measurement of outcomes (i.e. the degree to which targets/performance indicators were met, or other qualitative or quantitative measurements of our results).
