Dear Mr. Secretary General,

I am pleased to confirm that the LAMTIB Foundation supports the ten principles of the UN Global Compact with respect to human rights, labour, environment and anti-corruption. With this commitment, we express our intent to support the Global Compact advancing these principles, and will make a clear statement of this commitment to our stakeholders and the general public.

We also pledge to participate in and engage with the UN Global Compact in the following way(s):

Our mission is to empower underprivileged populations, particularly living in coastal developing regions, through sustainable leapfrogging technologies and training.

LAMTIB and Partners will contribute to unleash unused human- and natural resources to improve knowledge and health conditions, job creations, food security and climate change mitigation.

Our contributions will instigate community resilience centers; providing a safe journey from crisis to prosperity. LAMTIB will provide replicable, scalable and transferable innovations in order to achieve maximum catalytic impact.

The Norwegian foundation LAMTIB was established end of the year 2022 with an initial equity capital of USD 500.000 provided as a gift from its founding partner Preco AS. We are working with global industry leading partners to deploy containers loaded with appropriate technology to qualified rural communities, to initiate development through job creation and training, building valuable skills and creating positive cashflows from each site within an average of three years. The converted ISO containers will be shipped anywhere to and between the focus regions by our logistical partners.

A main pillar for the utilization of the technologies is electricity produced by solar and wind systems.

Another main pillar provides groundbreaking satellite connectivity and WEB-RTC solutions, needed for global access and communication in difficult rural settings, allowing i.a. remote telemedicine diagnostics and e-learning.

LAMTIB is not selling these technologies, but rather provides communities with the output of same, as well as relevant training, resulting in job creations to boost the local communities, spurring on further grassroots development.

Another main technology provided by LAMTIB in close cooperation with specialized partners is within the sector of mariculture, i.e., micro-hatcheries and grow out systems for aquaculture species.

Agricultural field laboratories and seedbanks in collaboration with the World Agroforestry program, that will increase the production of sustainable food, and bio-commodities, improving local ecological conditions for synergistic activities.

Through improved water quality and sanitation facilities we will contribute to the eradication of illnesses related to contaminations, whilst freeing up time for productive efforts and education. Crucially, empowering women and helping keep children in school.
