Update from Kasese Humanist Primary School - BIZOHA

In an effort to ensure my staff, family and the schools have an inflow of food, am working so hard to ensure all the gardens at the BIZOHA Farmland are maximum utilized for active farming.

We concluded the harvesting of beans, some tomatoes, plantains, cabbages and currently the farm workers are working the soils to prepare it to plant beans again in the banana plantation. The sweet potatos, bananas, mangoes are very fine. The eucalyptus at the extreme left of the property are steadily growing.



Am spicing the farmland with more cabbages, avocados, mangoes and oranges.

At the BIZOHA Site, farming works is at high gear too, we have been pruning the maize, beans and ground nuts, some work which we have just concluded today. I have planted mango trees at designated points at the site.

To ensure that there are enough tree shades, the famous acacia trees are already thriving at different spaces within this site.

Am speculating in the forthcoming harvest to yield higher which will be an advantage to ensure maximum food security for the Kasese Humanist Primary Schools and am optimistic even the Andrea Vogt Road site stand will be functional after the harvest period.
