A description of the practical actions that the organization has taken to support the UN Global Compact principles and to engage with the initiative:

STUF United Fund has been working with civil society organizations/non-governmental organizations, corporations, and various chambers of commerce to support the UN Global Compact principles of human rights, labour, environment, and anti-corruption:

-October, 2015: Participate in UN Global Compact webinar “Business Action Pledge In Response to the Refugee Crisis- Webinar for Companies” as STUF United Fund prepares to work with chambers of commerce in Europe to provide humanitarian aid to Syrian refugees.

-September, 2015:

(1) STUF United Fund provided grant to support a free community health clinic event in Cupertino, California. The event was co-hosted by local chamber of commerce and NGO Agape Asian Mission.

(2) STUF United Fund visited Banmu Tang Environmental Integration Group and NGO Wutong Foundation to learn and support the collaboration of diverse stakeholders (corporation, government agency, and NGO) in the field of environmental protection.

(3) STUF United Fund visited VAir Corporation and NGO Taiwan Black Bear Conservation Association to understand and support the partnership between the two institutions as the corporation demonstrates its commitment to protect the environment and ecology system.

-February, 2015: Since 2011, STUF United Fund has been supporting the Cambodia Taiwan Education Program (CTEP) to provide English, Chinese and computer educational courses to children in rural Cambodia. To further assist local families to walk out of poverty, STUF United Fund works with CTEP this year to reach out to corporations in Phnom Penh and Siem Reap for equal employment opportunity.

-July and August, 2014: STUF United Fund worked with chambers of commerce in 11 cities in North America to coordinate fundraising event for the ACC Goodwill Mission. ACC (Amitofo Care Center) is one of STUF United Fund’s affiliate NGO and is an international non-profit organization serving African orphans who lost their parents due to poverty, war, natural disaster, and/or HIV/AIDS.

-2013-2015 (three year project): STUF United Fund works with chamber of commerce members in Uganda and NGO Cherish Uganda to build Hope Clinic, a hospital that will provide much needed medical care to the people living in rural villages, including local at-risk children.

-2012:

(1) STUF United Fund worked with chambers of commerce in Asia to fundraise to provide immediate support for the typhoon victims in Thailand and the Philippines.

(2) STUF United Fund partnered with local chamber of commerce in Houston to provide house repair service in low-income communities.

-2011: STUF United Fund worked with chambers of commerce in Asia and North America to fundraise and help the victims of the devastating Japan earthquake.

-November 2010-2014 (annual project): STUF United Fund collaborates with local chamber of commerce in San Francisco, California to provide free Thanksgiving meals to the homeless.

-2010: STUF United Fund partnered with local chamber of commerce in Dominican Republic to provide free health clinic in Haiti to benefit the children and adult victims of the Haiti earthquake.

Measurement of outcomes:

-February to September 2015 (ongoing): STUF United Fund works with NGO Cambodia Taiwan Education Program (CTEP) and local corporations on employment opportunity. The program has helped 4 people work in factories in Phnom Penh and 23 people work in restaurants in Siem Reap. The goal is, through partnership with various stakeholders, help 2,000 people find employment in three years.

-September, 2015: STUF United Fund partnered with local chamber of commerce and NGO Agape Asian Mission to hold a free community health clinic event in Cupertino, California. The health clinic benefited 85 people with an average age of 60.

-July and August, 2014: STUF United Fund worked with various chambers of commerce in 11 cities in North America to coordinate the ACC (Amitofo Care Center) Goodwill Mission Tour and raised more than US \$350,000 for ACC. The donations will help ACC build new orphanages in various countries in southern Africa.

-2013-2015 (three year project): Through partnership among STUF United Fund, local chamber of commerce in Uganda, and NGO Cherish Uganda, the Hope Clinic will be completed this November and will benefit more than 5,000 residents in the local villages.

-2012: STUF United Fund worked with chambers of commerce in Asia to fundraise to provide immediate support for the typhoon victims in Thailand and the Philippines. As a result, US \$5,000 was donated to both countries.

-2011: STUF United Fund worked with chambers of commerce in Asia and North America to fundraise and help the victims from the devastating Japan earthquake. US \$31,000 was raised and was personally delivered by STUF United Fund CEO to the victims in Japan.

-2010: In response to the Haiti earthquake, STUF United Fund partnered with local chamber of commerce in Dominican Republic and the Fundación Sol Naciente to provide free medical services in Jimaní and Fonds Parisin to the people in the disaster area. The effort was joined by more than 40 doctors from the local area and more than 1,200 people benefited from the effort. In addition to the free medical services, US \$20,000 was raised and donated to help the sufferers.
