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Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand is a professional body comprised of over 100,000 diverse, talented and financially astute members who utilise their skills everyday to make a difference for businesses the world over.

Members of Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand are known for professional integrity, principled judgment, financial discipline and a forwardlooking approach to business.

We focus on the education and lifelong learning of our members, and engage in advocacy and thought leadership in areas of public interest that impact the economy and domestic and international capital markets.

We are represented on the Board of the International Federation of Accountants. Our global network also includes the 800,000-strong Global Accounting Alliance and Chartered Accountants Worldwide, which brings together leading Institutes in Australia, England and Wales, Ireland, New Zealand, Scotland and South Africa to support and promote over 320,000 Chartered Accountants in more than 180 countries.

Communication on Engagement

During the last year, we have engaged with, supported and promoted the principles of the Global Compact in a number of ways, as described below.

Areas of engagement	Our actions and outcomes
Deliver education on topics related to the Global Compact	 Behaving ethically is part of our Capstone model for the CA Program. All candidates are required to pass this module prior to being admitted to membership. Our CFO of the Future course includes a session covering risk management, ethics, sustainability and integrated reporting. This was held twice during the period as well as 2 intensive sessions which also covered these topics, they were attended by a total of 371 delegates. Business Forum 2014 included sessions on corruption, wellbeing, integrated reporting, diversity and building a sustainable business in 4 locations attended by 652 delegates in total. Business Forum 2015 included sessions on sustainable procurement & supply chain and diversity in 6 locations attended by a total of 126 delegates.
	We also held 2 webinars on sustainability and environmental reporting with nearly 30 delegates.
Conduct research and thought leadership in relation to the Global Compact	 We provide academic grants on an annual basis up to \$20,000. In 2013 and 2014, 2 grants were awarded for individual research projects on integrated reporting. Additionally final reports were received on a number of related topics including water, integrated reporting, human rights and environmental accounting. We are a partner in Australian Research Council (ARC) Linkage projects on both carbon modelling and non-financial assurance. These projects are on-going and have not yet delivered their final report.

	We published the thought leadership paper - Why ethics matters to your bottom line. The paper has been
	downloaded thousands of times, nearly 2,000 hard copies have been shared and the blog on the topic has over
	2,500 views. It has also been reused by other organisations in educational and other publications.
	 We issued Audit committee guides on Assurance of Greenhouse Gas Emissions in December 2013 and on
	Integrated Reporting in May 2014.
	• In September 2014, we published thought leadership paper - <i>Is policy making measuring up</i> ? which looks at the
	need for measures of national success beyond GDP. This was launched at a dinner attended by over 200 guests,
	including the Federal Minister for Education. We have distributed over 2,000 hard copies, with 500 web downloads
	and 1,500 blog views.
	 We published our thought leadership paper - Fast Forward, Leading in a brave new world of diversity in May 2015.
	The paper looks at the traits needed for inclusive leadership. This was launched in Sydney to 60 high level guests
	and a further 1700 attended the launch in New Zealand in person and online. Over 2,500 hard copies have been
	distributed with over 500 web downloads and over 700 blog views. The video clip on diversity has received over
	400 views. Further events have also taken place since June 2015.
Disseminate the Global Compact	We continue to promote the IFAC code of ethics to our 115,000 members and students as this represents part of
principles	our professional designation and a requirement for membership.
	• Lee White hosted a roundtable in December 2014 on ethics with CFOs, which was published in the Australian
	Financial Review.
	We have published a significant number of blogs on topics connected to the principles:
	 One blog on the UN SDGs attracted over 1,600 views.
	 3 blogs were published on topics related to ethics, bribery and corruption with total views of over 6,700.
	 5 blogs were published on diversity with over 9,500 views.
	 A further 12 blogs were published in the period on sustainability and environment related topics with an
	average of over 2,000 views each.
