

In a busy city like London, we all can become too busy to engage with the spaces of the city. People with disabilities and long term health issues in particular can be left isolated and unable to do things that are often taken for granted. Transforming little spaces inside the city is a way of inviting people to stop, rest and revive themselves during a busy working day. The venue, St Mary's secret garden, is in the midst of a very creative and vibrant part of the city, close to its commercial roots. The event will feature a lecture on the how urban 'wild' spaces are an essential part of a city's workspace which impacts on the continued evolution of the city. Working with St Mary's secret garden and Hackney city farm and several local organisations- Counterpoints Arts, Shoreditch Trust, Metropolitan Housing, Turning Earth, stone sculptor Gareth Shiels and a local photographer, Marcia Chandra, the architectural charity, Charushila, is transforming small spaces in the area. The lecture will be about this collaborative work in the transformation of the city and the people who work and live near it and the role of designers, architects and architecture in that process. A visit to the site of the latest work (a few minutes walk) nearby would be arranged after the lecture. Locally grown and sourced plants, herbs and bottled jams and chutneys will be available to buy at St Mary's secret garden.
