Dear Mr. Secretary General,

I am pleased to confirm that Ohaha Family Foundation supports the ten principles of the UN Global Compact with respect to human rights, labour, environment and corruption. With this commitment, we express our intent to continue to support the Global Compact advancing these principles, and will make a clear statement of this commitment to our stakeholders and the general public.

To this end we write to communicate our engagement thus far as follows;

- 1- In December 2013, when we launched our first major outreach, it was to defend human rights and provide well being services to a rural displaced community, where we provided access to free medicals to the local community, donated learning and teaching materials to the make-shift school, donated food and non-food items to the residents.
- 2- We have implemented various other health campaigns to communities in 3 states of Niger, Kaduna, and Nasarawa, where affected population received free healthcare from our medical team.
- 3- Throughout 2014 - 2015, we reached out to various communities hosting internally displaced persons affected by the Boko haram crisis in the north east, that are migrating through the FCT, providing them with access to quality healthcare, donated food and non food items, advocating for improved well being services and protection of the rights of migrants.
- 4- Currently, we have acquired a 4 hectares piece of land for the construction of a 500 bed hi-tech hospital in Ancha, Sanga, LGA of Kaduna State, where we organized the ground breaking ceremony in December 2015. To commence construction in 2016, to possibly commence operation in 2017.

- 5- We also have donated medical supplies to other organizations and communities in Madella, Niger State, kujipi, Nasarawa State, Agatu, Benue State, NA d Durumi, FCT to bridge the gap in health care delivery in rural 'cut-out' communities.

Since inception, we have impacted the lives of an estimated 5,000 people directly or indirectly, implementing 16 outreach programs in 3 states and the FCT.

We also plan to scale-up interventions and programs to reach more communities and people throughout Nigeria.

Because we support public accountability and transparency, we are therefore committing to report on progress within *two years* of joining the Global Compact and *every two years* thereafter according to the Global Compact COE policy.
