2. NIDAA In Brief

2.1 Introduction

NIDAA is a non-political, non-governmental, non-profit and non-discriminatory organization, established in 1998 and registered in Khartoum, Sudan under the auspices of the Humanitarian Aid Commission (HAC) in 2000. NIDAA joined UN Global Compact in 2010 and has been actively engaged in relevant activities since then. Partnerships were developed over the years with a number of Private Sector Companies to implement activities in deferent sectors with a focus on capacity building for both community members and civil service personnel. NIDAA is still working in building partnerships with more private sector companies to support communities through improving the Environmental context of local communities.

2.2 Our vision:

2.3 Our mission:

NIDAA is dedicated to serve, mobilize and motivate the Sudanese society, longing for desirable change through training, advocacy and sustainable community development.

2.4 Fields of Work

NIDAA organization works generally in the fields of development and capacity building, particularly in the following sectors:

- a. Education
- b. Protection
- c. Food security & Livelihoods
- d. Economical Empowerment
- e. Health
- f. Water sanitation and hygiene
- g. Peace building and conflict transformation
- h. Recovery returns and reintegration



3. Activities:

1- Enhancing self reliance of Economically vulnerable people of North Kordofan State – (Jun. 2016 – Ongoing)

Partners: Norwegian Church Aid, Ministry of Social Welfare Small scale enterprises were established in the Local Community with consideration to gender representation.

Indicators:

- A number of three enterprises were established and provided with means of production and technical assistance.

Relevancy:

- Members of the enterprises received awareness on anti-corruption measurements including financial management and transparent reporting among others.
- b. Support the registration of these enterprises in order to be able to join the relevant business trade unions.

2- Unstructured Business sector Workshop (Oct. 2016)

Partners: Arab NGO Network for Development, Federation of Sudanese Businessmen

Indicators:

- 15 attendants participated in the workshop representing civil society organizations, academia, businessmen and journalists.

Relevancy:

a. The workshop aims to discuss the issues related to Human rights, anticorruption and environment in the unstructured business sector.

3- Regional Workshop on Business and Human Rights. (Sep. 2016)

NIDAA attended the workshop as the Focal point for the ANND in Sudan, Mr. Medani Mohammed the Director General represented NIDAA in this workshop.

The workshop promotes the Human Rights in businesses in MENA region.

Indicators:

- Attending the regional workshop that promotes of the UN GC principles
- Establishment of means of communication (e-mails, meetings) with the Federation of Sudanese Businessmen.

Relevancy:

- a. Encourage businesses in the region to support and respect the protection of internationally proclaimed human rights
- b. Start communication regarding the workshop subject with the Federation of Sudanese Businessmen.



4- Algoz Child Protection Project (May 2013 – Ongoing)

Partners: War Child Holland, Ministry of Social Welfare
The project aims to improve the child protection conditions in South
Kordofan State through awareness programs and establishment of
child friendly spaces and capacity building for children and local
communities.

Indicators:

- At least 100 participants representing the local community, women and child protection authorities were trained in the child protection issues
- Children and young people have their knowledge and life skills developed and their sense of integration, inclusion, confidence and knowledge of their rights is enhanced. (1,000 persons were reached)

Relevancy:

- a. Child labor issues were highlighted in a training workshop on Child Protection. Accordingly a network was established from the local community and authorities to report child labor cases to authorities and further spread the awareness and knowledge on the topic.
- b. Child Protection Walk was organized to draw the attention of the public and media to the challenges facing the children generally and child labor particularly.



4. Future Plans:

1. Better Education Environment in Aljeel Basic School (Proposed)

Partners: Haggar Holding Company (Haggar Foundation), Ministry of Education.

The project aims to improve the environmental conditions in the Lima Basic School through establishment of a water point and improve the sanitation and hygiene inside the school.

Indicators:

- Children in Aljeel School (700 pupils) will show improvement in their health regarding water born diseases.
- The general environmental context will be improved.

Relevancy:

- a. The project is proposed partnership on corporate sustainability.
- b. The project supports safe environment.

2. Establishment of "Platform for SDGs - Sudan" (Proposed)

The platform shall organize the NGOs and Corporate efforts in the support of the SDGs.

Indicators:

- Number of NGOs and Corporate joining the platform.
- Partnerships between NGOs and Corporate
