Part II: Description of actions

In two years our intention to improve the welfare of community especially children has been reaffirmed through the initiation of Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and supported Ten principles of the United Nations Global Compact. This spirit will continue to become the commitment of World Vision as an international Christian humanitarian organization serving in almost 100 countries including Indonesia to enable children to live a life in its fullness.

The world's development including technology advancement has motivated all organizations including World Vision Indonesia to be more innovate in conducting more effective and efficient ministry. The development of system that will support the accountability of programs becomes one of the priorities to do. For example the application of m-Posyandu (Mobile Integrated Health Service Post) has become one of the smart technology-based practices that bring better and more quality health services for children.

Let us maintain our spirit in carrying out development for the community especially children. A hope for the improvement of children's welfare will continue to exist. World Vision Indonesia is sure that through synergic collaboration of all parties, these children, who are the next generation, will be able to live a life in its fullness.

World Vision Indonesia (WVI) main objective of transformational development programme is Child Well Being. WVI keeps contribution in Six Child Well Being priority areas and also related with 10 Principles in UN Global Compact:

I.Children are Well-Nourished Related with Human Rights principle in UN Global Impact

WVI prioritizes the nutrition intervention in the first 1,000 days of life that begins from pregnancy up to two years old as it preserves the critical window period for growth and development through three main interventions: Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF), Growth monitoring and Malnutrition Rehabilitation.

2.Children are protected from Infection, Disease related with Human Rights Principle in UN Global Compact

Children represent the future. Therefore ensuring their healthy growth and development ought to be a prime concern of all societies. Children particularly newborn, are vulnerable to malnutrition and infectious diseases that can be effectively prevented or treated at home or in primary health facilities. Our programs focus on prevention efforts through Behavioral Change Communication since the root causes of infectious diseases mostly are behavior.

3.Children access and complete basic education related with Human Rights Principle in UN Global Compact

WVI implemented 52 education projects in 29 Area Development Program (ADPs) across Indonesia, consisted of 14 Early Childhood Development (ECD) project, 18 Formal Basic Education projects, 16 Non-Formal Education projects and Project Non-Sponsorship.

4. Adolescent readiness for Economic Opportunities related with Labour Principle in UN Global Compact

The increase number of youth engaged in vocational training and entrepreneurial groups starting their own business and/or gaining employment is encouraging. There are 379 youth participate and get benefit from our programme.

5.Loving & Safe Families & Communities related with Human Rights and Environment Principles in UN Global Compact

There were 255,513 children enjoying their rights due to reducing their vulnerability resulted from district government made important decision to improve policy implementation on Child Friendly City/District.

6.Parents or Caregivers provide well for their children related with Labour and Environment Principles in UN Global Compact

Economic and agriculture development is vital in increasing household income which in turn affects parents/caregivers ability to provide well for their children.

The Local Value Chain Development (LVCD) approach has supported farmers to increase product quality particularly post harvest product which enable them to enter more profitable market. Household economic management including ASCA (Accumulated Savings and Credit Association) savings group used to support the household saving behavior.

In addition, World Vision Indonesia participated at the third Preparatory Committee at Surabaya and UN Habitat III at Quito, Ecuador, as accredited stakeholder to support the implementation of the SDGs in urban areas, specifically Urban SDG #11 "Make cities and human settlements inclusive, save, resilient and sustainable". Through partnership of World Vision International which was co-chair of Children and Youth Assembly together with UN Major Group, World Vision Indonesia which is partner of Wahana Visi Indonesia contributed one pilot urban project about Child Friendly Kampong at Surabaya City. It got support and collaborated action by stakeholders and partners.

Part III: Measurement of Outcomes

For results of measurement of outcomes:

- Children are Well-Nourished:
 - IYCF (Infant and Young Child Feeding): WVI has also trained 730 community health volunteers from 13 project areas on IYCF counseling; 29 from 2 project areas on Positive Deviance/PD-Hearth; and 346 from project areas on growth monitoring management. In addition, WVI also trained 120 health workers from 5 project areas on IYCF counseling; and 37 froorm 3 project sites on IYCF facilitator.
 - Growth monitoring: mHealth is the smartphone application that has the potential to overcome data errors during growth monitoring, lack capacity in delivering nutrition counseling, delays in reporting and others. Posyandu were positive with 91% of the caregivers feeling that the phone has improved Posyandu's service quality.
 - Malnutrition rehabilitation: The approach used in intervening malnourished children is Positive Deviance/PD-Hearth. PD-Hearth is a community-based rehabilitation and behavior change intervention for families with underweight preschool children. PD-Hearth preserves evidence of its effectiveness in rehabilitating undernourished conducted by their family without any food subsidy. 62,2% after 10 days of NERS (Nutrition Education and Rehabilitation Session) 56 children have gained their weight.
- Children are protected from Infection, Diseases and Injury:
 - WVI programs focus on prevention effort through Behavioral Change Communication since the root causes of infectious diseases mostly behavior. As a result of strong collaboration with community, government and other

stakeholders, 12 sub-villages and five villages in our programme areas were declared Open Defecation Free. 42,1% of household in ADP Nias I; 54,72% in ADP Nias 2 and 88% in ADP Singkawang with access to improved clean water source. 40,0% of household in ADP Nias I; 43.2% in ADP Nias 2 and 54% in ADP Singkawang using improved latrine for defecation. 52,86% in ADP Keerom, Comprehensive knowledge on HIV and AIDS

- Children access and complete basic education:

WVI implemented 52 education projects in 29 ADPs across Indonesia with achieved: 317 ECCD tutors were trained to apply high stimulating quality activities for the children; 406 schools were involved in creating learning communities for children; 312 teachers were trained on contextual life skills & character education; Successfully reduced teacher's absenteeism in Ternate ADP, and increased transparency of the national's annual in North Halmahera and Successfully improved parent's and government support ECD, and also increased ECD enrollment rate in the area.

- Adolescent readiness for Economic Opportunity:

• WVI has the project models conducted to achieve economic opportunity outcome are: The number of youth engaged in vocational training and entrepreneurial groups starting their own business and/or gaining employment is increasing. There are **379 youth** participate and get benefit from our programme.

- Loving & Safe Families & Communities:

- There were **255,513 children** enjoying their rights due to reducing their vulnerability resulted from district government making important decision to improve policy implementation on Child Friendly City/District.
- Children Group: A model of enabling children and the organization working with them to explore approaches to participation by providing a safe place for children to learn, play, and carry out activities that benefit their communities with 559 children group exist included 31,309 children in 27 ADPs.
- Among 130 advocacy actions taken by WVI and communities, 26% has successfully resulted in policy change-revising existing policy and/or enacting local policy and law. 2,163 children were involved in Child Forum in 30 ADPs.
- Birth certificate advocacy: There are were 76 advocacy actions conducted by children and community for pro-child policies, program and budgeting and 54 advocacy actions conducted by WVI in 32 ADPs

- Parents or Caregiver provide well for their children:

- Agriculture development for rural area and business incubator for urban area which mainly aim to improved products quantity and quality: Household resource management wereis conducted in both urban and rural setting to increase the capacity in financial management. 39,38% from 165 household mentioned they have improved product's quality which help them for market penetration through collective marketing. 5,675 farmers involved in collective marketing across 12 ADPs.
- ASCA (Accumulated Savings and Credit Association): ASCA is considered easy to access, develop mutual trust among members and hold the value of social capital. 1,214 members from 60 group and 5,999 adults were involved

in household management training (including ASCA) in 30 ADPs. The increase numbers of member subsequently increase the total saving which amounted to **\$66,005**.

During UN Habitat III "New Urban Agenda" on October 2016, World Vision International was co-host of Children and Youth Assembly together with UN Major Group as the main host. World Vision Indonesia was invited to speak during Networking Event to share about urban project of Wahana Visi Indonesia which is partner of World Vision about one pilot urban project regarding Child Friendly *Kampong* at Surabaya City and its collaboration action together with stakeholders and partners. World Vision Indonesia was also invited a girl as representative of children from Indonesia as speaker at Children Assembly to share advocacy engagement by children to create Child Friendly City.

Conclusion: World Vision Indonesia holds that Companies is an essential partner in collaboration to the efforts to of achieve a sustainable to end to poverty. WVI works with companies partners to implementing implement the Sustainable Development Goals. WVI has confirmed to continued support for the 10 principles of the United Nations Global Compact, as our organization continues striving- towards sustained of child-well-being of children, especially for the most vulnerable.
