1. Statement of continued support for UN Global Compact

2. Our mission and vision

Article 25 (A25) is a UK based charity that works domestically and around the world. Our vision is a world where buildings are designed and constructed to provide sustainable solutions to disease, poverty and need.

We provide the skills and knowledge to make safe and appropriate building projects possible – taking into account the opportunities and constraints in the local environment. Our buildings are designed using passive design strategies where possible, including maximising natural daylight, natural ventilation and solar energy. Over the past 10 years we have developed specialist skills in designing buildings for earthquake resistance.

Our projects are delivered with in-country partners to ensure that local knowledge and relationships are maximised for successful delivery. Skills training and capacity building are integral to our approach to also ensure that projects are sustainable after our involvement has ended.







3. The impact of Article 25's activities



Burkina Faso – Solar Mamas (with Barefoot College)

Design of a training centre to teach local female elders how to install and maintain solar technology in their villages. Trainees are often illiterate or semi-literate grandmothers who play a major role in community development, bringing sustainable electricity to remote, inaccessible villages.



Nepal – Anandaban Hospital (with The Leprosy Mission)

Design of earthquake resilient facilities for the redevelopment of the hospital following the earthquake in 2015.



Niger - College Amadou Hampate Ba

Addition of a pre-school, primary school and high school which would provide protection from the extremely hot climate using locally sourced materials. This includes 'green' classrooms which keep workspaces cool and light without the need for costly power sources.



Myanmar – Yangon General Hospital (with RGHR)

Redevelopment of the hospital site to address issues such as earthquake resistance and poor water management.



Haiti - Petionville School (with Outreach International)

The earthquake in Haiti caused the original school to collapse in 12 seconds. Article 25 has designed a new, more resistant school to allow hundreds of children to return to full-time education.
