- With our 1000 changes program we have helped more than 100 young people looking for a
 job finding one and this will make an impact for life. Some of the attendees which we helped
 where discriminated on the Dutch labour market. Via our coaching program and network,
 they have find work (principle 6, the elimination of discrimination in respect of employment)
 by introducing them at employers who were asking for new employees.
- Many of our local chapters organized events, trainings and coaching sessions for refugees and status holders in the Netherlands. This is directly connected with the pillar Human Rights.
- We actively communicate about the SDG's and encourage members to link their project to these goals. With the implementation of the SDG's we encourage the realization of the SDG's in 2030 together with many others.

• In November 2017 we will organize the JCI World Congress. This congress is organized around four SDG's and has an import goal to realize sustainable positive impact. This congress will be visited by 5000 young active citizens from around the globe. Not only during the event, but also in the months and years of preparation we actively encourage 2500 members, non-members, more than 100 partners and organizations to contribute for positive change. Many organizations use the world congress as a platform to enlarge their networks and to contribute at a more sustainable world. For example, we are working close together with the plastic soup foundation. Which wants to clean the world from plastic (principle 8 and 9, environment).

We participated in the SDG summit of the Ministery of Foreign Affairs, connected NGO"s to JCI members and entrepreneurs (also in different countries) and will keep participating in the SDG cafe of the ministry of Foreign Affairs to stay in touch with NGO's, governments and others to look into further cooperation.

- In 2016 members of JCI the Netherlands participated in the Global Partnership Summit between JCI and the UN and signed a declaration stated their personal involvement in raising awareness about the SDG's, helping to set up projects in their communities and look into what they can personally, their business and their environment can contribute further, part of this experience is also used for setting up the program of the JCI World Conference in 2017.
- In 2016 members of JCI the Netherlands contributed to the EU Know How Transfer between JCI members in Europe and the European Parliament, JCI members signed a declaration, debated, discussed exchanged best practices about refugees and the labour market (amongst others SDG 8, the focus of JCI Europe will be the SDG's 4,8 and 16, as set in 2016), while shadowing a Member of Parliament (MEP) for three days the members raised awareness of the issues in their business and communities including the SDG's;
- In 2017 members of JCI the Netherlands will contribute to the Global Partnership Summit at the UN and the EU Know How Transfer again and raise issues about their communities and bring new information, ideas and inspiration home to be used to inspire our members and beyond.
- In 2017 the JCI #peaceispossible awareness campaign will continue and one of the members of JCI the Netherlands is part of the worldwide team that coordinates the campaign (SDG 16).

Part 3 - measurements of outcomes

In Part 2 we described the outcomes and results of our actions in 2016. It's a qualitatively description except the numbers we gave regarding participation of our members in activities and events. We formulate our actions as smart as possible and we want to continue that in the coming years.
