Dear stakeholders,

It is with great pleasure as Mentor Foundation (MMB) provides a summary of the activities and events from January 2016 to December 2017 to highlight our commitment towards the SDGs goals. The following SGDs were achieved; Goal 4 - Quality Education, Goal 5 - Gender Equality and Goal 17 - Partnership for the Goals over the past 2 years. We are also aligned with the 10 Principles of the UN Global towards sustainable business practices.

MMB is now operating in its 4<sup>th</sup> year in Bali, Indonesia. Since MMB started its Personal Money management program mid-2014, we also recognize the needs of today's youth to manage their personal finances more sustainably. We decided to collaborate with selected senior high schools and vocational schools; to offer our program to these students before they complete their college education. We have great responses and feedback from these students; the knowledge they have acquired are practical and assist them to be more aware of their spending habits. With these newly acquired skills in Personal money management, these students will be able to apply the practical knowledge in different work and social situation.

The SDGs took effect from January 2016 and MMB is also committed to fulfil the relevant goals. Our continued collaboration with BaliWise, a women empowerment program means that young women from marginalized communities will have better success to be financially sustainable once they enter the workforce. We also collaborate with 3 vocational high schools to instil similar opportunities to these students before they graduate. Apart from the practical financial education, MMB also include NLP (Neuro Linguistic Programming) topics to improve the overall learning experience. As a result, students are more engaged and better at processing information.



Our partnership with Yogurt Republic Indonesia is now in its third year as this social entrepreneurship program has proven to achieve many positive outcomes for the business, its staff and the community. Yogurt Republic will be opening more stores in Bali, thereby creating more job opportunities and local ownership for the astute managers.

At Mentor Foundation, we are always looking for programs to up-skill our mentors. We also participate in workshops and conferences to share awareness and the success of our programs for the local communities we support.

Since late 2017, Mentor Foundation has been working with our IT specialist to create a more user friendly eLearning platform, MentorHub to allow people from marginalized areas to access our programs; to improve their knowledge and skillsets; to become more confident and to be more sustainable.

In conclusion, Mentor Foundation is on the right track. We continue to work towards incorporating the Ten Principles with the SDGs to promote sustainability, transparency, accountability and collaboration.

It has been another exciting 2 years at Mentor Foundation. Since it started in 2014, we continue to provide basic financial literacy education to micro and small businesses. We also collaborate with senior high schools; to empower college students with skills and knowledge of personal money management prior to them finishing school.

Below are the highlights from January 2016 through to December 2017.

## January - March 2016

January - Collaborate with SMA Ngurah Rai to conduct Personal Money management program. The principal from this local high school has seen the value of our program and the students attend our workshop as part of their extra curriculum program. A total of 19 students participated in our workshop over 6 months.



February - Attended network gathering organized by the Australian consulate, Sanur. The Australian consulate in Bali has several events per year to engage local businesses and NGOs, to facilitate collaboration between businesses.







March - Senior Mentor, Ketut Wibawa attended re-take of NLP workshop. Pak Ketut is the senior mentor at Mentor Foundation and it is always useful to up skill NLP knowledge and technique. NLP has certainly facilitated better learning outcomes from our students.



We continue our ongoing education support to BaliWise students with 4 intakes per year. These girls were selected to receive hospitality scholarship training. Our Personal Money Management program will improve their financial sustainability. Intake #27 has 18 students for the next 3 months.



Ongoing mentoring support to Yogurt Republic 119 in Kuta. This is the second year of trading and the staff turnover rate is very low, less than 20% over 2 years. All junior staff have the opportunity and potential to become store owners; a unique model of 'giving back to the community' and providing every staff a career. The entire team of 15 staff participated in the fortnightly workshop.





## April - June 2016

Mentor Foundation receive many request for mentoring outside Denpasar area and within Indonesia. We are planning to create an online eLearning platform to allow other Indonesians to access this free education. Current eLearning platforms cater for many that are already educated. MentorHub aims to provide this eLearning platform for many who are less educated and from marginalized community. We aim to launch MentorHub in 2018.



April - There were 34 students for BaliWise Intake #28.



May - Participate in Ubud Royal Weekend 2016, focused on Entrepreneurship, Culture and Tourism. We were invited by MarkPlus and the Ubud Royal Family to participate in this event, where budding entrepreneurs share their journey of hardship to become successful. One of the keys to success is managing their finances in a sustainable manner.







### July - September 2016

July - Commenced a 3 month workshop on Personal Money Management program for a group of supervisors at Maya Resort, Sanur. The workshop was attended by 11 supervisors over 12 weeks.



August - Invitation to meet with Mr. Ir Adjie Sapta M Si, Chief CSR and Mr. Jufri Anthony, Assistant Manager of Corporate Social Responsibility from PT Toyota Motor Manufacturing Indonesia (PT TMMIN),. The meeting was co-ordinated by Mr. Desmon Ginting, author of 3 books "Etos Kerja, Komunikasi Cerdas, Supervisor Hebat". The purpose of the meeting was to discuss PT TMMIN CSR programs for Mentor Foundation.



BaliWise intake #29 had 31 students.

Collaborate with a vocational college, SMK Pandawa to conduct Personal Money management program. The school principal was very impressed with our program and created a compulsory curriculum for all their year 12 students to attend.





## October - December 2016

October - Collaborate with another vocational college, SMK Prada to conduct Personal Money management program to their year 12 students. Due to the large group of 75 students, we conducted our workshop in 2 classes.



Attended Engage Bali 2016. A Social Media conference to learn the latest trend and applications in the social media space. Our participation was kindly sponsored by Social Bakers from Czech Republic.



November - Financial Controller and Mentor, Wahyu Febriyanto attends NLP workshop for Practitioner certification.










BaliWise last Intake #30 for 2016 were attended by 27 students.

Yogurt Republic Legian - mentoring program every fortnight for 15 staff on Saturday Monitor piggery breeding program for marginalized families at Banjar Batu Bayan in Abiansemal.

Partnered with another vocational college, SMK Pratama Widya Mandala, to conduct our Personal Money management for 28 students per semester.



A school new semester with SMK Pandawa, Abiansemal with 57 students. Another semester with our collaboration partner, SMA Ngurah Rai for 17 students for the next school semester.



Yogurt Republic Legian - mentoring program for 15 staff every fortnight.

Yogurt Republic Seminyak - new store from the Yogurt Republic group - mentoring program for 17 staff every fortnight.







July - Informal gathering for NGOs based in Bali to understand Mentor Foundation's Personal Money management program, with the view to offer Train the Trainer workshop for their managers.



August - Invited to present and showcase Mentor Foundation at the Indonesia Development Forum, Jakarta.





August - Invited to presented a 3 hour session on the Importance and Principles of a Business Plan to an NGO group from Bangladesh

September - Meeting with director at Bappenas in Jakarta to showcase MentorHub. Followup with Skype video presentation of MentorHub to Bappenas Director of Small Medium Enterprises and Cooperatives Development, Bapak Ahmad Dading Gunadi with 3 senior staff.
