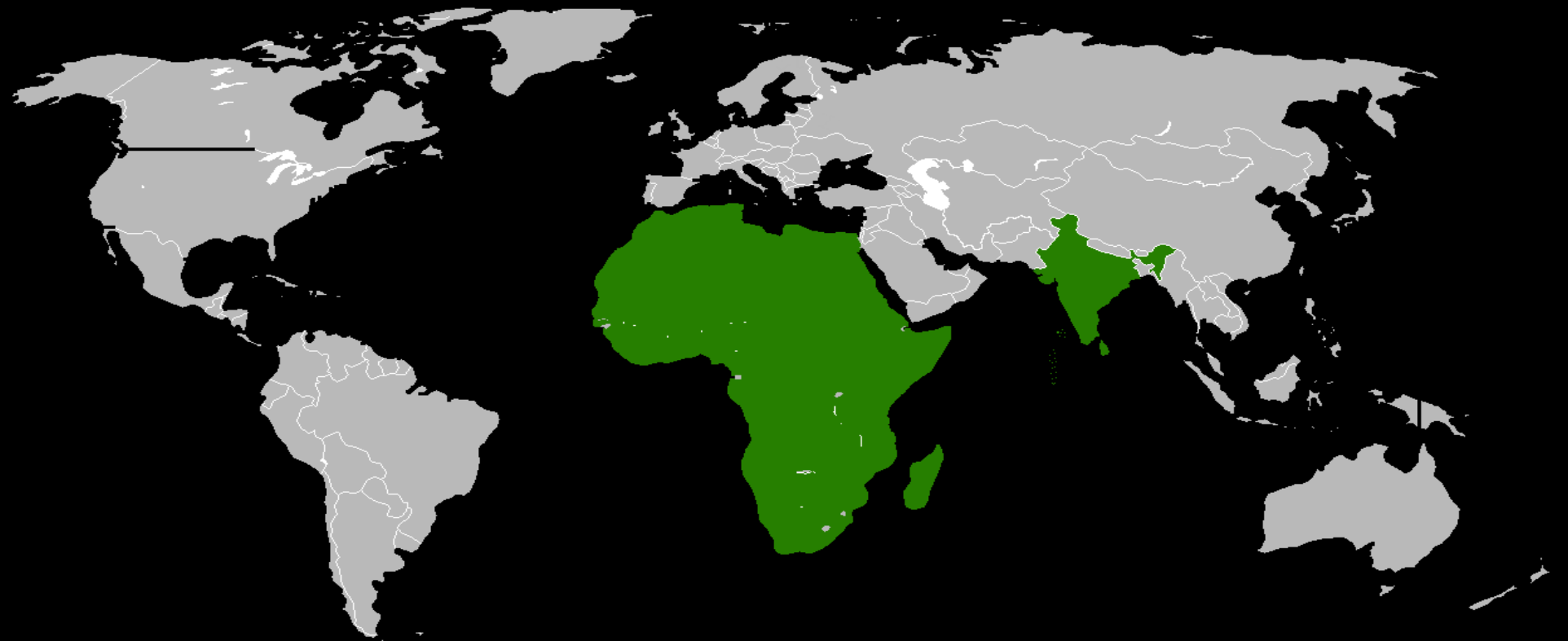

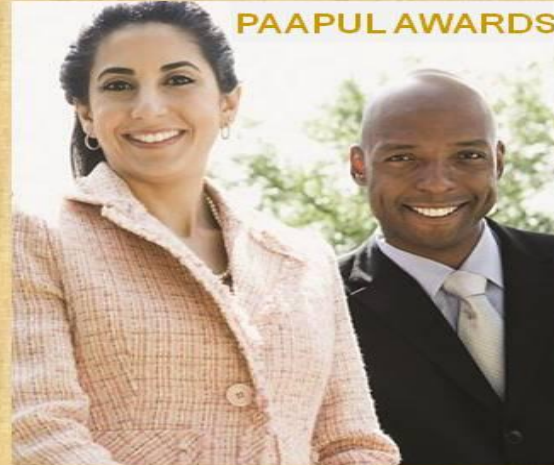

The United Nations is an international organization founded in 1945. It is currently made up of 193 Member States. The mission and work of the United Nations are guided by the purposes and principles contained in its founding Charter.

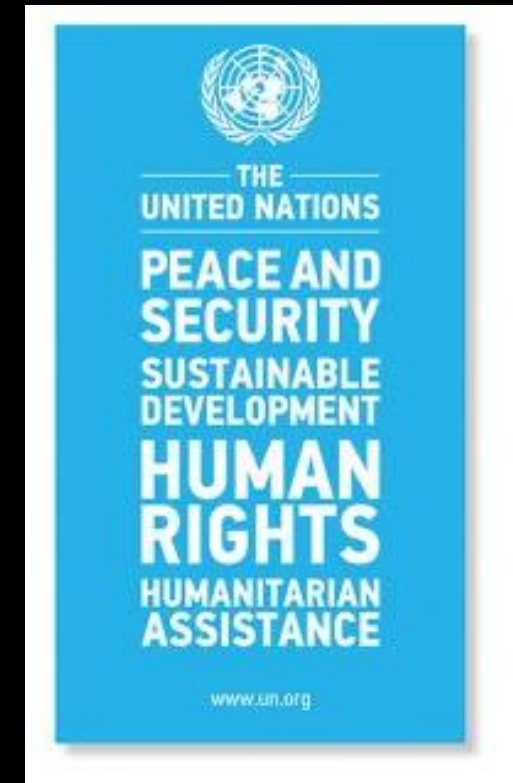
Each of the 193 Member States of the United Nations is a member of the General Assembly. States are admitted to membership in the UN by a decision of the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Security Council.

Main Organs

The main organs of the UN are the General Assembly, the Security Council, the Economic and Social Council, the Trusteeship Council, the International Court of Justice, and the UN Secretariat. All

were established in 1945 when the UN was founded.

The UN system, also known unofficially as the "UN family", is made up of the UN itself and many affiliated programmes, funds, and specialized agencies, all with their own membership, leadership, and budget. The programmes and funds are financed through voluntary rather than assessed contributions. The Specialized Agencies are independent international organizations funded by both voluntary and assessed contributions.

Crossing the Big Hurdle

“My major frustration with many actors in this process is that they are focused on one thing, and forgetting the foundation. The Post 2015 and Sustainable Development Framework will have one central pillar-known as the Strategic Vision.

This will be the main document that will form the foundation of what we do. It is on the basis of this Strategic Vision that we will build the goals as an annex. There is a strong and disproportionate emphasis and demand for goals when we have not even built the foundation.

- Then we have another problem-we have forgotten that there are other central pillars that were non-existent in the MDGs, and which will contribute to their failure. The success of the Post 2015 agenda will not depend on the goals, but on the Frameworks - the Financing Mechanism, and the Monitoring through the High Level Political Forum.

No one seems to be paying adequate attention to these areas-yet without them the Post 2015 Framework will be even less successful than the MDGs.
