[Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation](#) is active member of [UN Global Compact Network in Serbia](#) since beginning of 2013. Foundation is dedicated in supporting and promotion of 10 principles of Global compact in areas of human rights, right to work, protection of environment and anti-corruption.

This is Communication of Engagement report for results in 2017 with information's about Foundation's contribution to the work of local network in Serbia and related to concrete project activities which are in line with 10 principles and SDG's of the UN Global compact network.

Ana and Vlade Divac Foundation is investing effort in support of work of local network as a member of Steering committee which directs work of the local network and involves new members, contributors and establish partnerships with stakeholders from diverse sectors (state institutions, international companies, SME's, civil society organizations, etc.). Steering committee is navigating work of the local network and its members are involved in many events in which we are presenting work of our network inviting potential partners for cooperation. Promotion of the SDG's is one of our priorities as a Foundation, especially in areas of fighting against poverty and hunger, improvement of quality education and decent work and economic growth.

During 2017, our Foundation fundraised 3,1 milion \$ and provided support for 44.000 people:

- 7 municipalities received equipment for urgent situation (generators, boats, etc.)
- 15 families received new home
- 17 objects for children were refurbished and equipped (schools, kindergartens)
- 105 families received economic grant and improved their income generating activities, mostly in area of agriculture
- 51 youth initiative received funding for implementation
- 2.657 socially vulnerable families have received huge food packages
- 1.500 migrants have decent housing solution on the camps
- 10.000 migrants received humanitarian assistance
- 13.850 packages of clothes were distributed to various social institutions across the country
