Part II. Description of Actions

Examples of actions include:

GREAT project: GREening the Ancient Terraces of Lebanon was a participatory approach to engage the communities, municipalities, and other stakeholders in the restoration of degraded terraces. Agro-forestry trees were planted in three locations Anfeh-Koura, Gebrayel-Akkar, and Bqaatouta-Higher Kesrouan. The project was financed by US embassy

Firewise: is a participatory approach to engage local communities in the protection of their forests from fires. SEPT was the local implementing partner in Ajaltoun. The project was led by Lebanese Reforestation Initiative (USAID project). Firewise was later expanded to several municipalities around Ajaltoun cluster.

ACSESS Plus: Advocate college students for the environment and sustainable society, is project implemented in 4 Lebanese universities to raise awareness and train future professionals to advocate Corporate Social Responsibility.

Decentralization and Networked Governance: SEPT is a partner in an active network of NGOs working on decentralization from the developmental perspective, emphasizing the inclusive participation of stakeholders. Tree planting in Sabbah-Jezzine: planting stone pine trees with local communities.

SEPT is actively participating in an action research project with a number of other NGOs to study the problems of cooperation among Lebanese civil society organizations, and to produce recommendations.

And a series of short conferences and panels revolving around social-economic management, networked governance, and corporate social responsibility.
