INTRODUCTION

We are delighted to present the report of the National Entrepreneurship Conference and Exhibition (NECE) 2018, held at Kano State Polytechnic (KSP) by Society for Economic, Empowerment and Entrepreneurship Development (SEEED). The event was carried through committee, constituted via a letter dated 24/04/2018. The committee was saddled with the responsibility to organize a National Entrepreneurship Conference and Exhibition. In line with a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed between Society for Economic Empowerment and Entrepreneurship Development (SEEED); and Kano State Polytechnic. THE CONFERENCE AND EXHIBITION EVENT

The conference and exhibition commenced on 3rd September, with registration of participants and putting final arrangement at venue of the event located at School

of Technology Annex. The event had an opening ceremony, well attended by participants, press and members of the general public. The opening ceremony had in attendance Dr. Masa'udu A Kazaure, mni, Executive Secretary, National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) ably represented by Alhaji Abdu Isa Kofar Mata, who delivered the Conference and Exhibition keynote address. Prof. Mukhtar A, Kurawa the Rector, represented by Hajiya Sadiya Abdu Bichi, the Deputy Rector, in declaring the Conference and Exhibition open. Mr. Patrick Anucha President, SEEED delivered a welcome address for the event. The Polytechnic Registrar, Dr. Sadiq D. Garba and Alhaji Dalhat, President, KACCIMA delivered goodwill messages on behalf of the Polytechnic and KACCIMA respectively, while vote of thanks was delivered by Dr. Bello Adamu Dambatta, Chairman, LOC. Participants thereafter visited the exhibition stands, which displayed various equipment, art work and produced by some departments of Kano State Polytechnic. The dignitaries were impressed with the volume and high quality of items displayed, and remarked that if properly explored they could maximally contribute to the transformation of trade, commerce and industry which will lead to high economic development, growth and sustainability in Nigeria. The exhibitors, especially Kano State Polytechnic was commended, as they were the only institutional exhibitor present on the day of the opening ceremony.

The conference and exhibition proceed evenly from the 2nd-4th day with well thought and challenging research academic papers presentation on various intriguing issues on entrepreneurship, education, economic, management and sustainable development. Nigerian Export-Import Bank (NEXIM) also made a presentation of their product and services and how to access them. Among the highlights of their presentation was making known to participants and Kano Business Community that the sum of N3 Billion Naira has been made available as a special funding facility to exporters that could enable them have better business.

The conference had a presentation of twenty-three (23) Articles on various topical issues from participants. The works of Arts, Textiles and Clothing Designs,

Furniture, Home Decoration were exclusively exhibited in a well provided auditorium of the Polytechnic in the School of Technology Annex. Exhibitors comprised of staff, students and corporate entities.

The 5th day marked as the closing ceremony of the NECE 2018. Participants and exhibitors expressed gratitude for the well thought and implemented National Entrepreneurship Conference and Exhibition 2018, and wished for a repeat and continuity of the event. They also suggested for more government support and participation in the event as that would provide further means to alleviate youth unemployment, through the revealing insightful presentations.

The closing address was delivered by Dr. Isyaku Ibrahim Director, School of Technology Kano State Polytechnic ably represented by Mal Jamilu Haladu.

UNGLOBAL COMPACT PRINCIPLES

The President reiterated to participants as entrepreneurship champions the importance of keeping to the principles' of the United Nations, centered on Human Rights, Labour, Environment and Anti-Corruption which principles we support through the UNGlobal Compact, as participants. The 10 principles were reaffirmed to members in the opening speech delivered in the conference as:

Human Rights

Principle 1: Businesses should support and respect the protection of internationally proclaimed human rights; and

Principle 2: make sure that they are not complicit in human rights abuses.

Labour

Principle 3: Businesses should uphold the freedom of association and the effective recognition of the right to collective bargaining;

Principle 4: The elimination of all forms of forced and compulsory labour; Principle 5: The effective abolition of child labour; and

Principle 6: The elimination of discrimination in respect of employment and occupation.

Environment

Principle 7: Businesses should support a precautionary approach to environmental challenges;

Principle 8: undertake initiatives to promote greater environmental responsibility; and

Principle 9: encourage the development and diffusion of environmentally friendly technologies.

Anti-Corruption Principle

10: Businesses should work against corruption in all its forms, including extortion and bribery.
