UPEACE Centre The Hague contributed to higher education and research in the field of peace and conflict management studies by representing the University for Peace (UPEACE) in Costa Rica. The Centre promoted and facilitated the University's programmes and activities in the Netherlands and other European countries.

For this purpose UPEACE The Hague encouraged cooperation in the field of peace studies with other academic institutions. This has led to the creation of joint study programmes for Master students of UPEACE Costa Rica with inter alia The Hague University of Applied Sciences and with the IHE-Delft Institute for Water Education.
