- SIA supports IATA's three global climate targets and has adopted the four-pillar strategy in our operations to reduce our carbon footprint
- SIA has since 2011 been an active member of the Sustainable Aviation Fuel Users Group (SAFUG), which was established to accelerate the development and commercialization of Sustainable Aviation Fuels (SAF). SIA sees SAF as a long-term measure to support the aviation industry's carbon-neutral growth goal beyond 2020
- SIA does not source water from nationally or internationally protected areas. Water is sourced from Singapore's national water agency, the Public Utilities Board. Rainwater is also collected and reused

- SIA incorporates the three Rs (reduce, reuse, recycle) in our daily activities to improve our waste management practices and maximise efficient use of resources
- SIA welcomes proposals from suppliers that include bio-degradable or recyclable materials as alternatives to more commonly used raw materials
- SIA encourages and welcomes suppliers to submit environmentally friendly proposals and such proposals are favourably considered during the product assessment and selection stage
- Our Procurement department aims to ensure paper suppliers have an FSC certification or are able to show that raw materials are not sourced from errant suppliers blacklisted by the local government, where such a list exists
- SIA is committed to reducing the use of single-use plastics with alternative sustainable materials for more in-flight items
- SIA has been the exclusive airline partner since 2010 for the Hutan Harapan Initiative, an ecosystem restoration concession covering nearly 100,000 hectares of tropical rainforest in Sumatra, Indonesia
