- b. EDASI creates problem-solving and decision- making skills to help women assess their risk for STI/HIV/AIDS, (BCC youth friendly services, condom programming), take protective actions; and create an enlightenment forum for issues of gender discrimination and rights, promote gender equality, combats HIV/AIDS, Malaria and other diseases-this is in support of SGS 3 and 5( to "Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages.", "Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls.) most especially the Market Women. EDASI empowers women and enable them actively involved in development activities by advocacy and sensitization workshops for community, religious and women representatives and concerned bodies on gender equality, human rights (women's right) and revised family law.
