
In this Communication on Engagement, we describe the actions that our University has taken during the 2017-2019 period to support the UN Global Compact.



GAU is a signatory of the Magna Charta Universities Constitution to promote Academic Integrity and Freedom of Thought in universities. In this COE reporting period, GAU was represented at the Annual Magna Charta conferences, and discussed the threats and opportunities with its European counterparts.

Cooperation with other Stakeholders for Human Rights Awareness Building

Evaluation of Admission Policies - GAU partnered with the **US Embassy** for series of thematic talks including Women's Leadership, Entrepreneurship, Human Rights, and Climate Change. (2017)

- GAU partnered with the UN Accredited DMW Diplomats International to host the Annual Summit where leading thought-leaders were hosted on campus over the course of 2 days to discuss SDGs and Cyprus' preparedness. (2017)

- Chancellor of the GAU attended the **UN Global Compact Leaders Conference** to hear best-practices from industry leaders. (2017)

- Faculty of Architecture established the **De-Urbanisation Studio**, which looks at sustainable urban planning practices and offers thought-leadership on environmentally friendly design solutions. (2018)

- University signed a protocol of cooperation with SOS Children's Village, Kyrenia Youth Center and reaffirmed its long-standing agreement with the Cyprus Child Foundation. University has agreed to allocate Scholarships for at-risk youth groups. (2018)

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- GAU's Admission and Registrar's Offices regularly evaluate the incoming applications to ensure the presence of a truly diverse student body. A special focus is placed on ensuring 'gender-balance' in admissions to make sure the student body split is as close to 50:50 as possible. The policies in this respect have been standing for a long time.

- The student body across Associate Level all the way up to PhD level reflects a 40:60 split in favour of male students. The trend reflects a poor split in Postgraduate level with women in PhD programs composing app. 20% of all students. University took note of this trend, and shall put measures in place to ensure equal opportunity for women. (2019).



Strategic Planning

The University published its Academic Catalog for the first time in 2018-2019 Academic Year and it has been put in revision for the 2019-2020 Academic Year. Previously, the Catalog only contained the description of academic programs, whereas this time special emphasis was placed on expanding the contents to cover university policies. #### Labour Conditions

Transparency of University Policies	- University passed the decision to establish an ad-hoc committee and a working document to reflect and track milestones. The Committee has taken notice of the SDGs and University's affiliation with the UN Global Compact and has been mindful of reflecting the 10 Principles set out in the UN Global Compact.
Strategic Planning	-University regularly receives representatives from national and international accrediting agencies to ensure compliance with the regulations.

## ENVIRONMENT

#### Environment

- As part of the University-wide commitment to recycling and limiting carbon footprint, all campus printers' default setting was put on two-sided to cut down paper consumption. A reorganisation of all available printers was consolidated across floors to minimize automatic printing habits of employees. (2017)

Campus Recycling Program - Although not part of the campus recycling program, the University campus has an animal welfare policy, whereby the University students and staff provide huts for stray dogs and cats on the university's campus along with food and water.

- University Student Center has been teaming up with student clubs and local public schools to facilitate book and clothing donations. During this reporting period 3 public schools were select beneficiaries from this program. (2017 & 2018)
