

In 2008, this idea came into fruition with the launch of the Global Compact Gulf States Local Network, one of only two regional networks in the global level; and in 2014 it gave way to the UAE Local Network.

We strive to not only educate, raise awareness and pioneer science communication programmes in environmental sciences but also actively engage the population of the UAE across every sector in grass root initiatives. The UAE's President, **His Highness Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan** declared 2018 as the **"Year of Zayed"**, celebrating the centennial of the founding father, the late **Sheikh Zayed Bin Sultan Al Nahyan**. With his exemplary efforts at laying the foundations of sustainable development in the country, he urged for building the capacity of the youth through education, awareness and empowerment. Sheikh Zayed said, "Education is like a lantern which lights your way in a dark alley." Indeed, our visionary leader was right; it is through education and awareness that a culture of responsibility, ethics and accountability can be inculcated.

EEG's waste management programme is considered among the most effective vehicles of achieving environmental sustainability in the UAE and it has mobilised all members of society to actively propagate sustainable practices and the importance of reducing, reusing and recycling. In 2018 alone, a total of **1,998** entities took part in the six recycling programmes and in doing so **1,228** tonnes of cumulative wastes were collected, **4,565** metric tonnes of CO₂ emissions were mitigated, **7,040** m³ of landfill area spared, and **24,867** trees saved.

EEG's educational programmes are amongst the most popular across the MENA region. The workshops, competitions and outreach programmes provide the youth with the opportunity to learn and adopt environmentally responsible behaviours. As an advocate of Education for Sustainable Development (ESD), EEG aims to equip the younger generation with the tools and know how pertaining to changing trends, future challenges and the imperative for sustainable living.

EEG's banner slogan 'Together for a better environment' reflects the spirit of collaboration and inclusivity that it has championed since its inception. In 2018, EEG created several valued added partnerships with global civil society bodies, government bodies, academic institutions and corporate entities in pursuance of the mutual objective of environmental preservation. Being a strong believer and implementer of the Sustainable Development Goal (Goal 17), EEG has aligned with environmental networks at the local, regional and international levels. As an accredited organisation of the UN Environment (UNEP), EEG joined global leaders, policy makers and environmental enthusiasts under the movement of #BeatPlasticPollution, by embedding it into its recycling programmes for the year.

All of the above would not have been possible but for our members, partners, volunteers and supporting entities. I would like to thank all of them for their continued participation and engagement in our programmes. The Annual Report is a testament of our perseverance, collective efforts and hard work; and a recognition of your commitment and contribution to EEG's achievements. I hope the report motivates you to continue your journey with us along the path towards environmental sustainability. Finally and most importantly, I thank the exemplary leadership of our country for their vision and mandates for sustainable development and for creating an enabling environment which allows us to grow, excel and innovate in our quest for sustainability.


EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES





Confidence is key when it comes to effectively getting your message across. Powerful oratory skills can prove to be a great asset for students in their future careers and we at EEG, help them hone these to perfection. EEG provides these passionate and bright students with a platform to share their knowledge, ideas and creative solutions on the environmental topics and issues under discussion.

The 18th Annual Inter School Environmental Public Speaking Competition aimed to transform students into eager and enthusiastic environmental advocates, by guiding them towards environmental research, improved team work and developing their public speaking and leadership skills.

Held at the Dubai Knowledge Park, the 2018 Cycle was successful in bringing on board more than **600** participating students of diverse nationalities from the best government and private schools. The schools were from all the seven Emirates in order to maximise the potential for sharing knowledge and ideas.

The students were judged on a set of criteria by a bilingual jury of environmental experts which included representatives from ENOC, Abela & Co, Dubai Creative Clusters Authority and The Sustainable City. Other esteemed attendees included EEG's devoted corporate members, consul generals, strategic educational partners and high level government representatives.

EEG carried out the Competition as a carbon neutral event as part of its continuous efforts to minimise the carbon footprint of its operations. It proudly made a sustainable contribution towards voluntary climate protection by offsetting 12.55 metric tonnes of CO_2 , as part of My Climate's - carbon offset project.



Every Year, EEG hosts a series of workshops for the student community in order to allow young minds to be involved in their learning progression through first-hand participation. These workshops are based on an environmental theme which opens up an array of opportunities for the students to learn from in the form of discussions, brainstorming sessions, debates and practical activities.

EEG hosted the 18th series of its annual workshops in the month of November from the 5th-7th 2018 hosted by Rashid School for Boys. The successful three-day event saw the participation of 287 students and teachers from a wide network of 67 schools across the UAE, with the participants between the age brackets of 10-18 years. The theme set for the workshops was 'Elements Define Us #EDU' which aligned itself with the four major elements that are present on our planet: Water, Fire, Land and Air. The theme chosen allowed the students to reflect on the issues that pertain within the elements that are crucial for everyday life. It allowed them to contemplate further on the concept of finite resources and its impact on future generations.

Activities such as 'What's on My Tray' allowed students to understand the concept of food miles and how their food choices impact the environment. 'Build Your Eco-Hero' was another activity thoroughly enjoyed by all the participants, which involved them creating a superhero who could tackle an energy challenge being faced by different geographical locations around the world.

Each activity for the workshop was specifically designed and related to the elements within the theme. As a result of their strategic involvement, the students were able to identify key issues and provide solutions that they considered the best options for the situation. EEG invited their corporate partners, ENOC, the Sustainable City, BIC and Dgrade to provide insights and allow experts to discuss the topics further to expose students and teachers in attendance of the various initiatives taken by them to achieve environmental preservation. The programme was well received and everyone in attendance thoroughly enjoyed the different activities plotted for them and overall, the feedback received was excellent.

Inter College Environmental Public Speaking Competition



Emirates Environmental Group annually provides undergraduate students in the Arab World with an opportunity to showcase their knowledge and public-speaking skills to express their opinions and propose tangible solutions towards pressing issues related to sustainability that our communities are facing today. Sustainable Development Goal 4 focuses on the importance of quality education as the core aspect of centralising sustainable living. The Inter College Environmental Public Speaking Competition finds itself within the realm of SDG 4 since it helps create sustainably conscious and aware citizens. The Competition also establishes effective partnerships with public and private entities thereby, supporting SDG 17 which focuses on establishing effective partnerships to propose workable solutions.

EEG held its 18th Annual Inter College Environmental Public Speaking Competition on the 27th - 28th of November at the Dubai Knowledge Park. The Competition was initiated in 2001 and is considered as one of the most popular environmental educational programmes in the MENA region. The engaging and thought provoking event was conducted bilingually in order to give the participating teams equal opportunities to compete. The representation of students from diverse cultural and educational backgrounds coming together to compete on a regional platform is a noteworthy achievement for EEG. In 2012, EEG entered into a partnership with the Environment Society of Oman to conduct a National Competition annually in the Sultanate of Oman. As a result, every year, there are a number of teams that participate in the Competition and in 2018 we welcomed 7 teams.



Higher Colleges of Technology - Al Ain Women's College



The academic institution awarded EEG with a crystal trophy as a token of appreciation for participating in the event.

Campus Outreach with Emirates Global Aluminium (EGA)

EEG's recycling centres serve as the collection points for all main recyclable waste produced in schools: Paper, Plastic and Aluminium Cans. EEG is delighted to work in partnership with EGA in implementing the programme across the UAE, enabling young students to be directly involved in segregating waste at source and diverting it from the landfill, thus reducing the local carbon footprint. A total of 3 recycling centres were established through the fruitful collaboration. On the 19th of April the first recycling centre was inaugurated at the Dubai National School Al Barsha in Dubai. The second centre was inaugurated in Al Samha Secondary School for Girls in Abu Dhabi on the 9th of July. On the 21st of October the third recycling centre was placed at Ibn Seena School in Abu Dhabi. EGA and EEG also planted trees at the school to create more green spaces locally.

WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRAMMES

EEG's robust Waste Management Programme consists of six recycling materials and is considered one of the most effective pillars of environmental preservation as it positively contributes to sustainability in the UAE. EEG continues to put in hard work and dedication and with the active participation of members of the society the goals are achieved and surpassed, which mirrors the level of awareness and perception that our society has reached. EEG in 2018, exceeded targets in two of its recycling campaigns, reducing the accumulation of waste across the country and bringing people together for the common cause of enhancing their surroundings. EEG engages the community in meaningful acts and raises awareness on the effects of environmental proaction which provides for a clean and healthy environment to live in and reducing their environmental impact.

As an accredited organisation to UN Environment, EEG embraces the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals by effectively implementing them in the various programmes. The waste management programme embraces the UN SDG No. 12 in particular, which focuses on sustainable consumption and production. Its implementation helps to achieve overall development plans, reduce future economic, environmental and social costs, strengthen economic competitiveness and reduce poverty.



February and 27th October respectively. Both these were nationwide events with active sites across the country. The campaigns successfully brought in a combined total of 239 entities from all sectors of the society including academic institutions, corporation, government bodies, individuals and families. The participants of the campaign, brought in a total of 4,000kg of Aluminium Cans on the Day and 4,355kg during the Drive. This resulted in a collection of a total of 8,355 kg of Aluminium Cans, and the mitigation of 125.4MTCO₂e, saving of 1,901 million BTU of energy and saving of 202.7m³ of landfill space.

Your Can For a Tree (YCFT): Dates: 18th April - 18th June

EEG rolled out its annual "Your Can For a Tree" campaign on 1st April 2018. In 2018, a total of 22 entities participated with a deposit of 2,971kg of Aluminium Cans for recycling. This resulted in the mitigation of 44.6MT of CO₂e, saving of 676 Million BTU of energy and saving of 72m³ of landfill space. The Participants who achieved the target goal were eligible to plant 12 trees under the banner of "For Our Emirates We Plant".

EEG rolled out the **Quick Race** as a subsidiary project, to celebrate Earth Day, for its student members. The Quick Race duration was 2 weeks starting from **8**th **April** and ending on **22**nd **April**. The students who deposited **15kg** of Aluminium Cans during this period were given a certificate of appreciation.



The Paper Collection Campaign was initiated in 2001; in a step to help reduce global deforestation that occurs due to the demand for paper and paper products for various purposes. Since its inception, EEG has managed to successfully collect and recycle **17,120,694 kg** of paper. In 2018, EEG collected and recycled **1,079,405 kg of Paper**. This mitigated of **4,177** MT $\rm CO_2$ e from the atmosphere, saved **24,230.50** Million BTU of energy, saved **3,408** m3 of landfill space and saved **18,350** trees from being felled.



Proper disposal of toners and cartridges is necessary to avoid leakage of any harmful toxins into the air and ground water supply. The Toner Collection campaign was launched in 2001; to provide individuals and corporations a safe and harmless way of recycling their unwanted products. Since 2001, EEG has managed to collect over **97,673** pieces of toners for recycling. In 2018, EEG collected **7,033** pieces of toners which resulted in the saving of **2,399** gallons of gasoline.



Plastic is one of the most difficult materials to recycle as once dumped in a landfill, it does not begin the degradation process until **400-700** years later. Plastic degrades and releases smaller toxic materials and gases which are harmful for the biota as a whole. Since 2005, EEG has managed to collect **1,012,195 kg** of plastic. In 2018, EEG collected and recycled **72,786** kg of plastic. Through this collection **120 MT CO**₂**e** has been mitigated, a total of **4,234 Million** BTU of energy was saved and **3,091 m**³ of landfill space has been saved.



Glass can be recycled in about 30 days and serves as a model material to be eligible for recycling since it can be effectively recycled forever without causing any significant impact on its characteristics. A total of **2,341,140 Kg** of glass has been recycled since 2005. In 2018, EEG collected and recycled **50,386 Kg** of Glass resulting in the mitigation of greenhouse gases (GHG) to the equivalent of **16** metric tons of $\mathbf{CO_2e}$. A total of **118 Million** BTU of energy has been saved as well as **128 m³** of landfill space.



The Mobile Phone Collection Campaign was launched in 2009 initially. Due to the exponential increase of mobile phone usage in society, it is imperative to recycle any unwanted Mobile Phone materials that can be recycled. EEG has successfully managed to rally the local community to drop off their mobile phones to be recycled. The total number of mobile phones collected by EEG since 2009 are **51,486** pieces. In 2018, EEG collected and sent for recycling **7,979** pieces of mobile phones, which resulted in the mitigation of Greenhouse Gases equivalent to **1.34 MT CO.e**, a total of **27,825 gallons** of oil was saved as well as **6,551** trees.



Quick Race Challenge!

In honour of the momentous Earth Day, EEG rolled out a special "Quick Race Challenge" project wherein the student members were asked to collect a minimum of 5 kg of Aluminium Cans for recycling over a period of two weeks. A total of 14 student members participated and 301 kgs of Aluminium Cans were collected. Participants were issued special certificates upon reaching the target and their contribution counted towards the "Your Can For A Tree" campaign, bringing them a step closer to planting an indigenous sapling in their name on 18.12.18

The Green Call

Targeted towards EEG's student members and mobile phone recycling, the Green Call Project was initiated in 2016. However, due to its popularity, in 2018, the Project was declared open for all entities. It officially began on the 18th of March and lasted until 18th April. The main aim of the project is to encourage mobile phone recycling to reduce e-waste. The recycling of various materials from mobile phones is directly linked towards creating a more circular economy which focuses on reusing and recycling materials as many times as possible. The project was a huge success drawing in 63 registrations, effectively doubling the amount of participation since 2017. The project managed to collect a remarkable amount of 966 mobile phones for recycling, saving 793 trees and 3,369 gallons of Gasoline. 22 participants demonstrated commitment towards achieving the set targets within the one-month period and became eligible to plant a native tree sapling under their name at the ceremony in **December** on 18.12.18.



Recycle. Reforest. Repeat

The Recycle. Reforest. Repeat (RRR) project aims to effectively educate people on the need to practice sustainable waste management; with a specific focus on rethinking, reducing, reusing and recycling as many products as possible. It highlights the need to more action platforms to take initiative and engage members of the society to contribute to the reduction of pollution.

The project also serves as a means to strengthen and advance EEG's effective partnership with the United Nations Convention for Combating Desertification (UNCCD); which serves as a reminder that land degradation neutrality is achievable through co-operation from all sectors of society. RRR is a one-month project that was conducted from 18th of June to 18th of July in 2018, and witnessed a participation of 216 entities who collectively deposited over 132,709 kg of paper during the one-month period leading to a staggering 173% increase in collections compared to 2017. On the 15th of September, EEG rewarded the outstanding achievers of the project with a certificate of achievement and the invitation to plant a tree as part of EEG's initiative "For Our Emirates We Plant".





Green December

The final project rolled out by EEG for its student members for the year 2018 was Green December. The enthusiastic student members of EEG were asked to specifically collect minimum quantities of certain recyclable products. The highest collector in each category was awarded with a certificate, while other members who achieved the target were given e-certificates. The programme saw an increase in participation in 2018; effectively showing the dedication of our young student members in becoming responsible, sustainable citizens of society.

EEG received a total of **35** registered participants who collected a total of **7,601** kg of Paper, **66** kg of Aluminum Cans and **54 pieces** of Mobile Phones as part of this campaign. The programme helped in the mitigation of **30 MT** CO_2e , conserved **186 Million BTU** of energy, saved **26 m³** of landfill space, prevented the felling of **174 trees** and avoided the combustion of **188 gallons** of gasoline.






CORPORATE AWARENESS & OUTREACH PROGRAMMES

The aim of the collaboration was to encourage and raise awareness of recycling with a particular focus on plastic bottles within the various departments of DEWA. The innovation Week continued to receive plastic bottles until the **4**th **of March**, after which the EEG team successfully recycled them.

EEG and National Geographic Abu Dhabi celebrate Earth Day

The EEG team and National Geographic UAE met to discuss a collaboration in celebration of Earth Day 2018. The meetings took place in the Dubai Media City and EEG office on the 23rd and 29th of March respectively. The meetings witnessed fruitful discussions on the areas in which the two entities can come together to raise awareness on local environmental issues. The EEG chairperson had the opportunity to share the journey of EEG so far and highlight the significant local and regional accomplishments which sets them apart as pioneers in environmental sustainability.

The National Geographic team highlighted the ethos and spirit of their channel and discussed how their global tagline "Further" is strongly connected to the vision and values of EEG. Both entities agreed to unite their efforts to join forces on numerous platforms throughout 2018.

Waste Management Training with Apparel Group

On the **24th of May**, the EEG team visited its devoted corporate member, the Apparel Group at its headquarters in the Jebel Ali Free Zone. In the presence of more than **30** employees, the EEG team gave an effective training session on the importance of recycling materials and introduced EEG's waste management programmes. The informative session was followed by a tour of the Apparel office building which consists of a partially automated warehouse that successfully manages to recycle large quantities of cardboard boxes monthly.



Meeting with Al Najeh Honey

On the 10th of June, EEG received Mr. Mohammed Al Najeh, founder of Al Najeh Honey and his team to the EEG office for a significant meeting which discussed the potential of a positive collaboration between the two entities. EEG and Al Najeh Honey further discussed plans to join hands for EEG's annual tree planting ceremony on 18.12.18. **In November**, EEG visited the site for the upcoming Hatta Honey Farm – a part of the Al Najeh Honey Group, corporate member of EEG. The EEG team was shown the facilities at the farm including the hives and breeding process, the extraction of honey and royal jelly. It was an interesting and insightful trip that provided more information into the process of honey production. EEG will work in collaboration with the farm to organise trips and educational field visits as part of its educational and awareness programmes to all sectors of society after the inauguration of the farm in early 2019; in line with EEG's mission to spread awareness on the protection and preservation of food systems.



Meeting with the General Directorate of Airport Security

On the 1^{st} of July, EEG Chairperson visited the Dubai Police General Directorate of Airport Security and was received by H.E Brigadier Ali Atiq Bin Lahej in the presence of numerous department heads. The fruitful meeting discussed ways to enhance cooperation between EEG and Dubai police to further the mission of environmental sustainability. EEG also commended the efforts of the department for their collection of recyclable materials in celebration of the momentous World Environment Day on the 5^{th} of June. The meeting ended with a positive note whereby the EEG chairperson was presented with a crystal of appreciation and a framed certificate of appreciation was provided to the entity for their efforts and contribution towards recycling.



Collaboration with Dubai Municipality Waste Management Department

Emirates Environmental Group visited the Waste Management Headquarters of the Dubai Municipality on the **2**nd **of July**. The impactful meeting allowed both entities to discuss and share the initiatives carried out by the respective organisations in their efforts to minimise waste production. The noteworthy meeting discussed means of cooperation and enhancement of the fruitful partnership between the two entities in light of common goals and objectives.

Discussion on Green Sustainable Pharmacies

On the 4th of July, EEG chairperson welcomed a delegation from the Inspection and Control Department of the Sharjah Medical District to the EEG office. The first of its kind meeting between the two institutions discussed a proposal of collaboration between the two entities to implement a Green Pharmacy project. The discussion highlighted the dangers of discarding medical waste in landfill sites and its damaging effect on the environment. Both institutions expressed the need to activate their roles in order to tackle unsustainable practices within pharmacies.

Meeting with Aiman Municipality

On the **10**th **of July** EEG received a delegation from Ajman Municipality and Planning Department in order to discuss the mechanisms of cooperation which can be implemented in order to contribute to environmental preservation and rationalise expenditures. EEG provided a detailed presentation on the organisations wideranging impactful programmes and activities, followed by a discussion between the two entities on the economic dimension of environmental conservation.

Visiting Abu Dhabi Government Institutions

As part of Emirates Environmental Group's strategy to strengthen cooperation with various government entities throughout the UAE, on the **15**th **of July** EEG conducted meetings with two government institutions in Abu Dhabi. The **first** meeting was held with Al Ain Municipality, whereby a presentation was provided on EEG's extensive programmes and activities. The representatives from the Municipality welcomed the cooperation in light of common goals and objectives envisioned by both entities.

The **second** meeting was held with the Abu Dhabi Center for Waste Management (Tadweer) at the organisations headquarters in Abu Dhabi. The special meeting brought together a government and non-government entity working within the same field to enrich and strengthen environmental protection. The two entities exchanged views and experiences in the field of waste management and agreed on the necessity of continuing to develop recycling practices in order to preserve the environment.

Building synergies with the Department of Finance in Dubai

On the **18**th **of July**, the EEG team visited the Dubai Department of Finance at the Ruler's Court to discuss areas of cooperation and promote a fruitful relationship between the two entities. The aim of the Emirates Environmental Group to raise awareness and action for the achievement of sustainable practices in the UAE through a wide range of effective programmes and campaigns strongly aligns with the vision of the Department of Finance, which supports its economic path for effectiveness and efficiency. Hence, the potential of building of a strong and continuous partnership between EEG and the Department was discussed and the need for effective contribution of the UAE to the global efforts towards the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals.

Engagement with Department of Land in Dubai

Strengthening ties of strategic partnership with the Department of Land – Government of Dubai, the Emirates Environmental Group was invited on the **9**th **of September**, to raise awareness on current environmental issues at the latter's Environmental Forum. The aim of the forum was to highlight and discuss possible solutions to overcome barriers to achieve sustainable development and the measures that can be taken by their employees to become proactive about environmental protection.

On the **30**th **of October**, a memorandum of understanding (MoU) was signed with the Dubai Land Department (DLD). The MoU was signed by the Deputy Director of the Land Department and the Chairperson of the Emirates Environmental Group. Further to the signing of the MoU, a meeting was held at the DLD on the **26**th **of November**, where EEG chairperson presented information on the ongoing and remaining events of the calendar year, followed by discussions on how to transform the proposed cooperation between the two entities to achieve substantial outcomes.

EEG also collaborated with the Land Department in the month of September to organise the 'Why Do You Keep It' Campaign. As part of this campaign old books, a total of **1,748 kg** of paper and **46 kg** of Plastics were collected. The collaboration effectively demonstrated the actions taken by both parties since the signing of the MoU aimed at promoting waste reduction activities and initiatives from both entities, to work towards a more sustainable future.



Public Prosecution Workshop

On the 8th of October, the Emirates Environmental Group organised a workshop at the Dubai Prosecution office titled "Waste Management – Sustainable Practices". The main aim for creating the workshop was to raise environmental awareness and involve all sectors of the society in sustainable practices; as part of the institutions framework to becoming an environmentally conscious organisation. Mrs. Habiba Al Mar'ashi initiated the workshop with a presentation highlighting the economic, social and environmental benefits of recycling waste. She further discussed the various practices and solutions that can be undertaken to ensure proper waste management within the workplace. After the conclusion of the presentation, the attendees were provided with a group task which allowed them to effectively apply the knowledge they had acquired to create solutions for waste management in everyday situations by providing suggestions and best practices. The group task was thoroughly enjoyed by all the participants and brought forward many interesting solutions and suggestions.

What Works Journey to Expo 2020 Dubai

On the 12th of November, an exhibition hosted by KHDA as part of the journey to Expo 2020 called 'What Works' was brought together to provide an opportunity for its attendees to collaborate, innovate and explore how the Expo will create a better future for the nation, education in Dubai and young students. EEG attended the exhibition to support its corporate member – Expo 2020 and to create awareness in line with EEG's core objective of creating a more sustainably efficient nation.

Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Knowledge Foundation MoU signing

The Emirates Environmental Group signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Knowledge Foundation, as part of its "Knowledge Summit", on **December 5, 2018**. 100 Years One Legacy

EEG unveiled a brand new project to celebrate the "Year of Zayed". The project was conducted in association with EEG's corporate member Etuix, and supported by Footprint Advertising and Kore Productions. The unique project highlighted the possibilities of a circular economy in the UAE, while simultaneously providing young children a platform for engagement in environmental issues.

Paintings and drawings of EEG's popular Environmental Drawing Competition were effectively utilised for the campaign. The drawings created under the topic of "Year of Zayed" were photographed and printed and installed on a billboard which was displayed on Sheikh Zayed Road until the 28th of October after which it was removed and sent to Switzerland to be converted into 200 high-end luxury bags for men and women. In December 2018, the luxury bags created finally made their way back to the UAE. The bags were unveiled for the first time in the UAE to the public at Fairmont the Palm on the 20th December. All the proceeds collected from the sale of the bags will be contributed to various vocational training programmes at partnering schools for special needs. Through this initiative EEG and its collaborating partners were able to honour the legacy of HH Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nayhan, father of UAE; through the incorporation of education, promoting special needs initiatives, conserving resources and truly establishing the premise of a circular economy.

EGBC has been collaborating with EEG in various initiatives and programmes throughout the year, most notable during the celebration of Green Building Week hosted from 24th - 30th September, EmiratesGBC, in partnership with Dubai Chamber of Commerce and Industry, also hosted a panel discussion under the theme 'Green Homes'. The event brought together key industry stakeholders and speakers who discussed and explored the best sustainable practices to create greener, healthier and energy efficient residential communities in the UAE. EEG Chairperson gave an opening speech and also moderated the panel discussion by engaging the speakers in crucial discussions related to green building practices.

5. The Sustainable City

Strategic Educational Partner: The Sustainable City joined EEG as a Strategic Educational Partner in 2016. The Sustainable City welcomed the visitors for a complete tour of the City and showcased the biodome greenhouses with a total capacity of over **3,000** square metres for urban farming, to diversify and grow a variety of fruits and vegetables.

The Launch of "My Hive" initiative: In celebration of World Bee Day on the 24th of May, EEG corporate members, the Sustainable City and the Apiculture and Nature for the Betterment of Health and Beauty (ANHB) held a joint event to celebrate the launch of "My Hive" initiative. EEG Chairperson was among the invitees of the launch. The unique programme aims to link producers and consumers to promote high- quality honey and bee products and maximise the production of pure honey in the UAE at the highest standard.

6. Environment Society of Oman

In November 2012, EEG committed to a meaningful strategic partnership with the Environment Society of Oman to organise the first ever national level competition in the Sultanate of Oman. EEG and ESO jointly signed a Memorandum of Understanding that entailed a public speaking competition to be held on the national level in the Sultanate of Oman and the winning teams to converge to UAE to participate in the Pan Arab Competition.

The 7th Annual Inter College Environmental Public Speaking Competition: Oman Cycle was held in the capital Muscat on the 22nd-23rd of October, the impactful event was organised by the Environment Society of Oman in partnership with Emirates Environmental Group. This was the 7th cycle of the competition which saw the participation from 40 colleges and universities. The enthusiastic and well informed students were provided with an excellent platform to contribute and communicate their ideas to provide their informed recommendations.

EEG chairperson, attended the event and expressed her appreciation towards the young and talented participants for their continued commitment to become actively involved, well informed citizens.

7. Emirates Global Aluminium

In 2018, Emirates Global Aluminium collaborated with Emirates Environmental Group in a sustainable partnership to install recycling centers in schools across Dubai and Abu Dhabi. The activity reflects on the strong partnership between EGA and EEG and provides an excellent example of multi-stakeholder engagement to help local communities promote sustainability in the UAE

Campus Engagements with Emirates Global Aluminium (EGA): Installing recycling centers serve as the main collection point for all recyclable waste produced in schools namely: Paper, Plastic and Aluminium Cans. EEG is delighted to work in partnership with EGA in implementing the programme across the UAE, enabling young students to be directly involved in segregating waste at source and diverting it from the landfill, thus reducing the local carbon footprint.

A total of **3** recycling centers were established through the fruitful collaboration. On the **19**th **of April** the first recycling centre was inaugurated at the Dubai National School Al Barsha in Dubai. The second centre was inaugurated in Al Samha Secondary School for Girls in Abu Dhabi on the **9**th **of July** and on the **21**st **of October** the third recycling centre was established at Ibn Seena School in Abu Dhabi, EGA and EEG also planted trees at the Ibn Seena school Abu Dhabi to establish more green spaces locally.

8. Sheikh Zayed Housing Programme

On the **25**th **of April**, Emirates Environmental Group conducted an impactful, thorough presentation which introduced its programmes and achievements to the Sheikh Zayed Housing Programme in Dubai. The meeting resulted in an effective collaboration between the two entities and an opportunity to sign a Memorandum of Understanding. The core mission of EEG is strongly aligned with sustainable built environment and green buildings which are strong pillars of the Sheikh Zayed Housing Programme as it aims to provide environmentally conscious, smart homes in the UAE.

There was a big turn up of volunteers for the campaign, people who managed to collect an incredible amount of waste. The campaign managed to bring together different entities that were all united for a common goal towards sustainability.



The 6^{th} edition of the campaign was in Umm Al Quwain, it was supported by the Umm Al Quwain Municipality. The campaign accomplished its goal of reducing waste around the city and educating individuals on the importance of regularly participating in initiatives to keep their city clean.

Ras Al Khaimah, 18th December 2018

The 7^{th} and final edition of the campaign was held in Ras Al Khaimah in conjunction with the tree planting activity. This edition of the campaign marked the end of the wider Clean Up UAE Campaign as a whole and fulfilled EEG's mission to spread awareness about environmental sustainability through contributing effectively to the country's sustainability agenda.



For Our Emirates We Plant



For Our Emirates We Plant is a unique campaign that provides a platform to combine the efforts of year-long activities that are held under the umbrella of recycling projects to raise a more environmentally conscious society; with the end goal of a meaningful tree planting ceremony as a gift to those who have achieved the targets set out for the year. This campaign has several initiatives that are carried out all year long which include 'One Root One Communitree', 'Your Can for a Tree', 'Recycle Reforest Repeat', 'Neighbourhood Recycling Programme' and 'Together We Plant'. By the end of December 2018, a total number of 2,096,702 indigenous trees were planted through various campaigns and initiatives hosted by EEG which has resulted in the mitigation of 12,358 MT of CO₂.

The campaign was held under the patronage and presence of **H. E. Engr.** Sheikh Salem Bin Sultan Bin Saqr Al-Qasimi, member of the Government of Ras Al Khaimah Executive Council and Chairman of the Department of Civil Aviation, in the Emirate of Ras Al Khaimah at a beautiful nature reserve in the Skheibar Area, Al Minei on 18^{th} December 2018. The campaign in 2018 witnessed participation from a total of 50 companies, 24 schools and 163 families in the presence of VIPs, government representatives, private entities and others. A total of 1,100 Sidra trees were planted and on maturity in 5-7 years the tree saplings will help mitigate 22 metric tonnes of $C0_2$ emissions annually. The trees have special named placards placed infront of them to serve as a reminder and mark of appreciation for the participants efforts to contribute to environmental sustainability.

Recycling Campaigns

One Root One Communi-tree (OROC): In 2010, EEG rolled out the project OROC which challenges its participants to collect and deposit minimum targets set out for recyclable materials within a period of two weeks. The first phase of the project ran from 18th of January until 18th of May and the second phase rolled out from the 18th of September until the 18th of **November**. The campaign aims to mobilise the community and catalyse the growth of green spaces by allowing academic institutions, government bodies, private sector and families to participate and to be eligible to plant indigenous trees as a token of appreciation for their efforts throughout the year. EEG received a total of 173 participants who collected 125,277 kg of Paper, **9,898 Kg** of Plastic, **1,050** kg of Aluminum Cans, **699** pieces of Mobile Phones, 1,633 pieces of Toners and 7,868 Kg of Glass. The programme helped in the mitigation of 519 MT CO₂e, conserved 3,645 Million BTU of energy, saved **861 m³** of landfill space, prevented the felling of **2,704** trees and avoided the combustion of 2,995 gallons of gasoline. 319 trees were planted as a result of OROC, which will lead to the mitigation of 6 metric tonnes of CO₂ annually upon maturity.

Your Can For a Tree (YCFT): The main aim of YCFT Project is to educate and inform the community on the importance of the recycling of Aluminium Cans which are 100% recyclable; it takes less energy to recycle an Aluminium Can in comparison to creating a new one. Therefore, making it the perfect material to be recycled as many times as possible. YCFT is conducted during the months of **April-June** and consists of a set target of collection for all its participants which include academic institutions, families, government entities as well as the private sector. Upon the completion of the target the participants are subsequently involved in the planting of trees. This year 12 trees were planted by the participants which will on maturity sequestrate $\bf 0.2$ metric tonnes of $\bf CO_2$ annually.



Recycle. Reforest. Repeat (RRR): The champions of this project which was rolled out from the 18th of June to 18th of July were awarded with certificates and sapling of indigenous trees to be planted in their names. The remarkable collection of 132,709 kg of Paper during the one-month period lead to a staggering 173% increase in collections compared to 2017. Through the efforts of the 216 entities that participated in the project, the recycling of the collected paper resulted in the mitigation of 510 MT of carbon dioxide and saved 2,959 million BTU of energy, 416 m3 of landfill space and 2,243 trees from being felled. Through this project a total of 207 trees were planted on 18.12.18.

Neighborhood Recycling Project (NRP): The NRP Project is conducted during the summer months and has been specifically designed to engage EEG student members by allowing them to participate in a project to fulfil their social responsibility as part of the community. In 2018, the 8th cycle of the project was conducted and student members were encouraged to creatively engage their communities by creating their own recycling initiatives under the guidance of EEG. The successful project welcomed the participation of 130 students who collectively deposited 36,293 kg of Paper, 238 Aluminum Cans, 497 pcs of Toners, 70 Mobile Phones and 548 kg of Plastic; a total of 87 trees were planted as a direct result of this programme.

Together We Plant

The Together We Plant project was launched in 2011, and serves as an excellent platform to create awareness and appreciation of trees among the youth. Children are involved in the tree planting process at their respective schools which serves dual benefits by creating more urban green spaces and spreading awareness about the importance of planting native trees. In 2018, EEG collaborated with Emirates Global Aluminium and Sumitomo Rubber Middle East FZE and a total of **100** trees were planted across **3** schools across Abu Dhabi and Dubai.

Emirates Global Aluminium: On 21st October, EEG in partnership with EGA planted 30 indigenous trees at Ibn Seena School in Abu Dhabi. The trees planted include indigenous Samar, Ghaf, Sidra and well adapted Neem trees. These trees are well known for their medicinal properties, its bountiful shade, production of oxygen, its edible fruits and its cultural significance; the trees will help mitigate 661 Kg of CO₂ annually upon reaching maturity. The initiative aligns itself as part of the "Year of Zayed" theme by involving the local youth community in afforestation practices to create a more sustainable environment for the future generation.

Sumitomo Rubber Middle East FZE: On 25th November 2018, Emirates Environmental Group in collaboration with Sumitomo Rubber Middle East FZE, planted a total of 70 indigenous saplings at The Winchester School, Jebel Ali and Nibras International School, both active Academic Members of the Emirates Environmental Group. These saplings planted will upon maturity in 5-7 years be able to mitigate approximately 0.50 MTCO₂ emissions annually; thus effectively reducing pollution. The tree planting programme was conducted in the presence of EEG's Chairperson, who was accompanied by the management of Sumitomo Rubber Middle East along with the principal, faculty and the students.


Adopt a Tree: In 2018, EEG provided its corporate members who were unable to participate in other recycling programmes run throughout the year but were keen to plant trees under the respective names of their organisations with a unique opportunity to adopt trees. The main aim of the initiative was to allow the corporate sector to be more actively involved in becoming more sustainable. A total of **339** Sidr saplings were adopted by several corporate members; these saplings on maturity in 5-7 years will be able to mitigate approximately **2 MTCO₂** emissions annually.

Since its inception 27 years ago, the Emirates Environmental Group has always prioritised connecting with 'like-minded' individuals and entities at various societal gatherings to discuss EEG's mission and its successes and to provide inspiration towards creating and accelerating solutions for environmental sustainability. As a leader of sustainability in the region, EEG utilises its strong voice to advocate for positive environmental dialogue by attending, hosting, speaking and presenting at various conferences, meetings, exhibitions, forums and award ceremonies. These engagements allow EEG to function as an effective influencer in the region in the sustainability sphere. Finally, the efforts and achievements of the hard work is visible through the various awards and certifications that EEG receives nationally and internationally, serving as a testament to the integrity of EEG as a trustworthy, transparent and credible institution.



News & Events



LOCAL ENGAGEMENTS

January - December 18 Engagements EEG continues to spread its wider message of environmental sustainability through encouraging participation and volunteerism in its active programmes and initiatives that work towards preserving and protecting the environment. Over the course of 2018, EEG participated in numerous local, regional and international events in its capacity as an environmental pioneer.

Green Economy Report

The Dubai Supreme Council of Energy (DSCE), the United Nations Development Programme (UNEP) and Dubai Carbon launched the State of Green Economy Report on the 11th of January under the theme of "Youth and Building the Future". EEG Chairperson attended the launch of the meaningful report that aims to review the efforts of various organisations in the UAE to transition to a sustainable economy, one that results in improved human well-being and social equity without compromising the environment.



Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week 2018 (ADSW)

On the 15th of January, EEG attended the grandiose opening ceremony of the Abu Dhabi Sustainable Week held under the slogan of "The Future is in Our Hands #ButterflyEffect". The slogan emphasised on the role of youth in global energy systems transformation into sustainable energy to fight climate change. The main aim of the platform is to promote collaborations that accelerate sustainable solutions needed to support rapid economic growth and stimulate international dialogue and action.

Zayed's Sustainability Legacy

On the **31**st of **January** a series of panel discussions were conducted by the Emirates Vision Media Network in partnership with Abu Dhabi University. EEG Chairperson joined a discussion on the theme of "Future of Education in the UAE: Experiences and Visions" to speak on H.H Sheikh Zayed's legacy from the sustainability perspective in lieu of the "Year of Zayed" emphasising on his key achievements, which have built the foundation for sustainable development. The session celebrated the legacy of **H.H Sheikh Zayed**, who maximised his efforts and resources into building a well-educated and well-equipped generation, which will take the UAE to the global forefront in sustainable development.

UAE National Environment Day 2018

On the 4th of February, UAE came together to mark the 21st National Environment Day. A wide range of activities and events took place all across the nation to raise awareness on the importance of conserving our natural environment. The theme this year followed last year's topic of SDG 12 on "Sustainable Production and Consumption", which is significantly linked to the work conducted by EEG. In an attempt to facilitate the trends in production and consumptions patterns towards a more sustainable route, EEG organised effective panel discussions on the topic of SCP and joined the global SCP Clearinghouse to report on its programmes that relate to the mission of SDG 12. These reports were then uploaded onto the clearinghouse portal.



World Government Summit

From the 11th - 13th of February, the World Government Summit was held in Dubai at the Mina A'Salam, Dubai. The Summit welcomed world leaders and global thinkers under one platform to discuss and identify the highest-priority solutions to address growing global humanitarian issues with a particular focus on climate change. The session provided a broad perspective on how climate change is merging with humanitarian crisis and impacting global peace and prosperity. It further highlighted the emerging solutions to prevent and mitigate the damage of climate-linked disasters.

Pearl Initiative Roundtable on Philanthropy

On the **25**th **of February**, the Pearl Initiative organised a roundtable on the topic of "Excellence in Philanthropy: Frameworks for Sustainability" at Mina A'Salam, Jumeirah in collaboration with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. EEG Chairperson was one of the panelists in the session on successes and challenges of institutional philanthropy. EEG Chairperson along with the other panelists explored how foundations and businesses can increase the efficiency of giving in the region and shared views on how to overcome barriers to institutional philanthropy.

Symposium of Genomics

EEG participated in a noteworthy symposium organised by The International Center for Biosaline Agriculture (ICBA), in collaboration with the Beijing Genomics Institute and Khalifa University on the 1st of March, 2018. Under the theme of "Genomics: Application of Advanced Sciences for Food Security & Health", the Symposium welcomed key experts in the field of biology and sustainability for a series of Panel Discussions on the application of genomics for food security and health.

The Global Smart Energy Summit 2018

The first-ever successful Global Smart Energy Summit (GSES) was an event which began on the 6th of March. DEWA Sustainability Leadership Conference

On the 11th of March, EEG attended the DEWA Sustainability Leadership conference, as part of the DEWA Sustainability Week held at Mina A'Salam in Dubai. The conference witnessed a welcome note from Managing Director and CEO of DEWA who shared the Authority's groundbreaking achievements including the construction of 250MW pumped-storage hydroelectric power station in Hatta in order to diversify energy sources in the Arabian Gulf. Emirates Environmental Group values the platforms and events organised by the visionary leadership of the UAE for effective and efficient transition towards sustainability.



Launch of Phase - 4 of Dubai Solar Park

On the 19th of March, EEG joined the successful launch of the fourth phase of the Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum park, consisting of the biggest concentrated solar power (CSP) project in the world. His Highness Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE launched the second 700MW phase, which will provide clean energy for more than 270,000 homes and contribute to the reduction of more than 1.4 million tonnes of CO₂ emissions per year.

Identity Branding Forum Anniversary

On the **21**st **of March**, the 10th Anniversary Power Breakfast was organised by the Identity Branding Forum in Dubai. The theme of the event was 'Women – the 21st Century Economic Super Power!' and focused on women and their contribution as economic superpowers and their effect on companies, brands and decision making processes. President and CEO of Arabia CSR Network, Chairperson of EEG, presented two short presentations on the topic of 'It's Super Power Time – Corporate Social Responsibility' highlighting the importance of introducing and maintaining sustainable practices in corporations to not only achieve CSR goals but protect the environment in the wider scope.



Earth Hour

On the **24**th **of March** at the Al Marasi Promenade, Business Bay, EEG and its members joined the Earth Hour event organised by DEWA and set up a stand to contribute its share to the global movement. EEG conducted interactive activities and organised a special #Paper Walk Campaign to highlight the connections between climate change and recycling. EEG collected **2,310 kg of Paper**, which saved **39 trees** from being felled, **17MW of energy** and **7 m³ of landfill space**. It further saw the mitigation of **9 metric tonnes** of CO₂ emissions. EEG received a crystal and a certificate of appreciation for its contribution to the success of the event.

UAE - Korea Business Forum

On the **27**th **of March**, EEG attended the significant UAE-Korea Business Forum at the Armani Hotel. The main aim of the forum was to strengthen the economic and political ties between the two countries in preparation for the EXPO 2020. The event saw an attendance of a large number of experts from **42** of South Korea's largest firms. Heading the delegation, **South Korean President Moon Jae-in** gave a special address, focusing on the importance of smart transformation and innovation and expressed his gratitude to the UAE leadership for hospitality and the organisation of the Forum.



World Architecture Conference

The first of its kind two-day event, held on 20th and 21st of April served as a platform for professional and cultural exchange amongst the world's architects to achieve architectural excellence through exploring effective design techniques and materials. January - December 2 Engagements

NAL Global HSE 2018

From the 12th-14th of February, the Kuwait Petroleum Corporation in cooperation with major companies in the Middle East and Asia Pacific Region hosted the 6th International Conference and Exhibition on Health, Safety and Environment in the State of Kuwait, under the theme of "Creating Safe and Sustainable Future through Business Excellence". The impactful event provided a platform for stakeholders from around the world to discuss and share knowledge on the best practices that contribute to a creation of proactive and dynamic safety culture in the workplace. EEG chairperson further joined the technical session of the conference on "Sustainability" to share the link between environmental conservation and the challenges faced on a global level on the issues of health and safety.

INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENTS

January - December 10 Engagements

3rd Environmental Assembly Subcommittee Meeting

On the **6**th **of February**, EEG virtually joined the subcommittee meeting chaired by H.E High Commissioner and Permanent Representative of Botswana to discuss the lessons learned from the Third Environmental Assembly (UNEA-3). The meeting highlighted the important lessons and the need to improve planning and organisation in order to enable smaller delegations to fully participate and engage in deliberations and the need to implement better mechanisms and tools for monitoring and evaluation. The member states requested the secretariat to revise the note on lessons learnt in order to maximise effectiveness and scope of the upcoming Assembly.

Following the successful subcommittee meeting, EEG submitted a proposal of the thematic areas to the secretariat which stressed on the need to maximise the incorporation of Goal 12 on Sustainable Consumption and Production (SCP) into the upcoming UNEA-4. As a partner of 10YFP Sustainable Food System Programmes, EEG suggested that the UNEA-4 provides a platform for its Member States and other stakeholders to showcase their campaigns and activities related to the patterns of SCP, which will allow for the promotion of best practices, knowledge sharing and increased visibility of the Assembly. EEG also believes that UNEA-4 must conduct panel discussions and capacity building sessions to propel public and private collaboration in SCP implementation across the world.

Global Food Waste Webinar

Emirates Environmental Group, as a partner of the 10YFP Sustainable Food Programmes attended a Global Food Waste Webinar on the **9**th **of April**. The webinar witnessed presentations from representatives of Colombia, Netherlands and the United States of America who shared their success factors and challenges in the implementation of their food waste mechanisms. The webinar also featured a presentation on the Sustainable Food Systems Programmes core initiative which is aimed at providing technical and policy support to countries in their fight against food loss and waste.

Solar Geoengineering and Carbon Removal Webinar

On the **22nd of May**, EEG team attended a briefing session hosted by the Carnegie Climate Geoengineering Governance Initiative (C2G2) and the UN Environment (UNEP). The noteworthy meeting discussed the emerging frontiers in climate change known as Solar Geoengineering and Carbon Removal. The briefing provided an introduction to an innovative approach that witnessed virtual attendance of numerous private entities and non-government organisations around the world.

Subcommittee Meeting of the Committee of Permanent Representatives

In June, November and December 2018, EEG was honoured to attend four Subcommittee Meetings of the Committee of Permanent Representatives via a webinar. A highly interesting session outlined the draft concept note for the theme of the fourth session of the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA). The impactful meeting further discussed the resource mobilisation strategy of the UN Environment.

EEG had the opportunity to ask several pertinent questions and was also provided with updates on the planning and preparation of the fourth assembly.

EEG attended these meetings with the main objective of getting information related to the upcoming 4th UN Environmental Assembly on the 11th-15th of March 2019 in Nairobi and to contribute with valid inputs. The event also provided insight to the side-events and activities that are being organised for the March assembly. The meetings further discussed the themes for draft resolutions that are currently being prepared for the annual assembly

Strengthening collaboration with UNEP: #BeatPlasticPollution

Emirates Environmental Group has joined with **United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP)** in its Beat Pollution Movement towards a Pollution Free Plant. This serves as a symbol of the strength of partnerships that EEG has formed with UNEP in order to achieve environmental sustainability.

At the 3rd UN Environmental Assembly (UNEA-3) an online portal was launched where a number of tangible commitments to end the pollution of our air, land, waterways and oceans as well as safe management of chemicals and waste was created. EEG registered its waste management commitment towards a pollution free planet and began to implement the **#BeatPlasticPollution** concept in its campaigns and initiatives. On World Environment Day, EEG incorporated the theme of UNEA-3 named "Marine Litter and Plastic Pollution" as one of the three themes set out for the 2018 Environmental Drawing Competition. Over 65,000 students in 384 participating schools embraced the power of their artistic expression under the topic of "Ocean Pollution: Leave No Plastic" which aimed to spread awareness on the increasing levels of plastic waste in the ocean which in turn threatens biodiversity as a whole.

At EEG's 18th Annual Students' Workshop activities were implemented in collaboration with UNEP to create awareness among young people on the importance of recycling plastic waste and differentiating between plastics that can and cannot be recycled. The valuable lessons learnt as a result of the **#BeatPlasticPollution** activity will always serve as a reminder to the younger generation of their responsibility to recycle materials which should be carried out throughout their lives.

Eye on Earth Webinar

On the **20**th **of June**, EEG team virtually attended an **'Eye on Earth'** webinar organised by the World Resources Institute (WRI). The webinar introduced major groups and stakeholders of the UN Environment to the dynamic website platform that provides trusted and timely data for a sustainable future.

The website features hundreds of sets on the state of resources and wellbeing which allows users to visualise and analyse unprecedented challenges facing human society, and as result become more proactive members of society.



World Forum for a Responsible Economy

From the 16th-18th of October, EEG Chairperson was on an official trip to Lille, France to attend the 12th edition of the World Forum for a Responsible Economy. The impactful forum was held under the theme of 'Super Local' with a variety of international conferences, side-events, trainings and workshops which provided its attendees with an opportunity to effectively immerse themselves with information and effectively partner and collaborate with other like-minded individuals. On the second day of the forum EEG chairperson led a session titled: 'Multinationals, Regions and Cities: how to integrate local development into business development strategies'. A CSR network meeting was also held on the 17th of October which focused on identifying gaps in the network and familiarisation of members; in which she also took an active part.

Exhibitions / Forums & Workshops

Throughout its 27 years of establishment, EEG has remained socially and culturally relevant amongst the regional demographic by working together in pursuit of achieving sustainable development of the nation and region. We have been able to achieve this level of relevancy through our active involvement and engagement in local, regional and international events.

ECO Waste

Emirates Environmental Group actively participated in ECO waste as part of Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week held on the **15**th **of January**. Representatives from over **175** countries attended the Summit, hosted by Masdar. EEG set up a stand to represent the organisation, welcoming numerous visitors from the corporate and academic sector as well as young and driven students who showcased their keen interest in sustainability and environmental conservation.
