We also pledge to participate in and engage in with the United Nations Global compact in the following ways:


We seek to accomplish our mission domestically in Bronx, NY, and internationally in the West African nations of Nigeria and Ghana.

- ❖ Through the instruction of professional artisans, UBNLINKS trains local residents in the art of knitting/crochet and beadwork, as a form of therapy for those experiencing emotional and physical struggles, and for those who wish to express themselves through 'arts & craft.
- ❖ Through onsite mentorship, our program encourages the creation of economic opportunity for those who wish to produce income through the development of a new skill.

- ❖ . Working with community and government agencies through community-based projects/outreach to eliminate the disparity in access to basic needs to vulnerable families by collection and re-distribution of everyday household essentials and variety of goods, and highly needed items. Through the distribution of such 'everyday essentials', we assist low income families meet their needs, help parents provide for their children, give young students more confidence in their interactions at school, and aid adults in preparing for gainful employment.
- ❖ Provide families and individuals the opportunity to be part of the fight against malnutrition. Our Multiverse FarmShop is part of our Fit To Move project dedicated to the learning, the practice, and the teaching of sustainable based agricultural practices. The goal is to reduce scarcity of food ,water and land, so as to become a multi-purpose, seed structure and seed development integrated farming system that produces hybrid seed, healthy food, fiber, sell vegetable seeds, and other Improved Crop Varieties that are accessible and affordable to all farmers and can be cultivated successfully on a small scale because we believe that if a child eats very well; he/she can be FIT TO MOVE.
- ❖ In a determined effort to reduce hunger and malnutrition we provide rural farmers with training, counseling, IcyHot Pain relieving cream , IcyHot Lidocaine , financial assistance to individuals, families, Churches or groups and organize activities designed to help Christian Farmers and Fulani Herdsman in Nigeria cope with trauma of displacement and help them make a successful transition to nonfarm jobs so as to promote just, peaceful and inclusive society through our **Ecumenical Retreat, Research, and Wellness Centre (ERRWC)**

We recognize that a key requirement for participation in Global compact is the submission of a Communication on Engagement (COE) that describes our organizations efforts to support he implementation on the ten principles and to engage with the Global compact.
