FXBIS was registered in 2007 as a Section 8 company under the ,Companies Act, 2013 with an objective of assisting people to lead a life of dignity by creating safe, healthy and productive environment. Today, FXBIS with its annual revenue of close to 50 million INR works in different pockets across 329 villages and 5 slums of 12 states and 1 union territory, and reaches out to over 500,000 people through its community-based programmes and interventions.

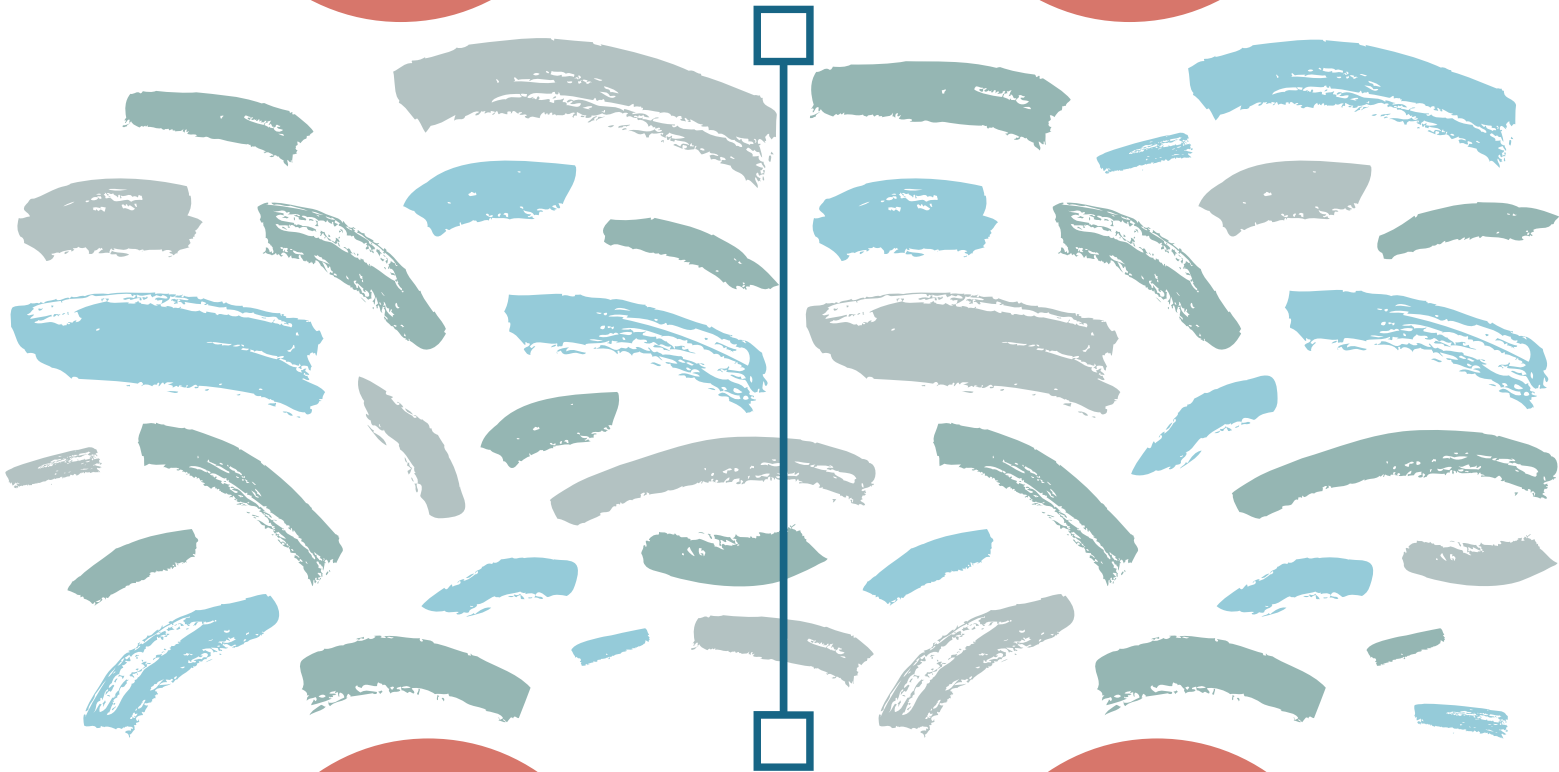

ACHIEVEMENTS & NEW COLLABORATIONS

- FXBIS impacted a total of **93,625** lives through its programmes running in **14** locations across 9 states and 1 UT of India. The programmes centered around the organisation's four core domains of livelihood, health, education and protection & safety.
- After witnessing the successful manning of Childline 1098 in Gautam Budh district of Uttar Pradesh, FXBIS was entrusted with the task of establishing **Childline service in Ukhrul district** of Manipur. Manipur all know, is plagued with a high incident rate of child trafficking and child abuse. Both helpline services are functional 24*7, seven days a week.
- In a joint operation with Manipur Police, the state's Anti-Human Trafficking Unit and Social Welfare Department, FXBIS rescued and repatriated **179 victims** of trafficking in February 2019. The victims were repatriated to their home country, Nepal.
- FXBIS **collaborated with "Level-Up Education"** (UK based NGO) to bring STEM learning to the under-privileged students from Jaipur and Visakhapatnam slums through online learning. Over 130 children benefitted through this knowledge exchange programme.
- FXBIS **launched the 'Life Skills Education' programme** at all its project locations in its endeavor to make education an all-inclusive rounded package for the adolescents and children we work with – be it government schools, FXBIS' Suraksha Education Centres or the rural/ urban slum community youth clubs. Within the inception year, 1259 children and adolescents combined were trained in the 10 essential life-skills recognized worldwide and listed by the UN.
- FXBIS' **collaboration with Mobile Creches (NGO)** has led to the establishment of two day-care centres for children of daily wage labourers, working at the construction sites in Greater NOIDA. The centres provide a safe space to the children along with meals and primary education facilities. .

FXB India Suraksha as part of its project 'Mukti', an anti-trafficking project to address issues of human trafficking and child sexual abuse organized a one day training programme for Taxi Union and Drivers of Ukhrul district to ensure protection and safety of children in the district at NERCOMP/UDC/IMS Conference Hall, Ukhrul today.

The programme was organized in association with ECPAT, Luxembourg conveyed a press release issued by programme manager FXB India Suraksha, Satya Prakash.

Ringling Hongchui, SDPO, Ukhrul addressed the programme as special guest while 75 taxi drivers along with the executive members of the Union participated in the programme.

During the programme, the participants were trained on the basics of child protection and safety, human trafficking, its forms and the modes operated by traffickers in luring children and other vulnerable groups on the pretext of better life opportunities to various places.

The need for discussion and action against child sexual abuse, which has become a burning issue across the country, was also discussed during the programme.



secretary, Ukhrul District Passenger Service Association (UDPSA) said that everyone has their own role to play in creating a safe environment for children in the district.

"It is important for us as taxi drivers to be vigilant and report cases to the authority concerned", he added.

Khayuli Raking, president UDPSA said the association will include 'prevention of crime towards women and children' in the charter of rule and regulation issued to each taxi driver at the time of registration.

The training programme also included participatory group activity where participants were given the task to share their thoughts on the role of community members in combating human trafficking and addressing cases of sexual abuse, composition of the vigilance committee, its role and responsibilities and the support they would re-

also. The Government of India is very sensitive towards the cause related to child protection and safety and therefore the district administration will provide its support to its community members in ensuring protection of children against sexual abuse in the district.

Rather than focusing on only 30 villages, such committees should be formed across the district in Ukhrul, he asserted.

Ningshen Worgam, SP said refraining such topics from reporting is a big issue in the district. "Online exploitation of children is a new trend taking place through social media which needs to be stopped too", he added.

It is welcoming that such kind of committee is going to be formed at the village level which will be helpful to the Police too in working on the issue.

Mamra Borgory, CEO, FXB India Suraksha said that the initiative of forming the committee is a precursor to facilitating and making Govt mechanisms on child protection and safety.

71 more victims of human trafficking rescued
IMPHAL: A day after NGOs, police and agencies rescued 105 women and children from being trafficked to Myanmar, another 71 persons including 22 men, who are suspected to target of human traffickers were rescued from different parts of the state including Imphal airport on Saturday. Strict measures are being taken up by different NGOs, police, social welfare department and anti-human trafficking unit across the state following the rescue operation on Friday, which was initiated based on intelligence inputs. In continuation of the operation, Tenggoupol police rescued five women and 15 men from Moreh areas on Saturday. A joint team led by social welfare deputy director (WP) Nongmeikappam, EEMA secretary S Radhapyari, FXB India Suraksha project officer Sunil Meitei, Anti-Human Trafficking Unit in-charge Yumnam Kheda rescued 40 women and 11 men from different parts of Imphal. The team first rescued three women from Imphal Airport on Saturday. They then rescued 31 women and seven men from Airline Hotel, which is located opposite to the Airport gate. Later, the team rescued two women and four men from Hotel Northeast, North AOC Hotel Royal Lodge. So far, the team has rescued 176 suspected victims of human trafficking in the last two days. Two persons from Nepal, who were arrested for their alleged involvement in trafficking of women and girls were remanded to five days' police custody, a team of Imphal City police station rounded up another male in connection with the same case. The City police team led by its officer in-charge inspector Ingocha Singh arrested the third suspected human trafficker from an Imphal area on Saturday. Apart from disclosing that the accused is a resident of Kangleitong, the police declined to reveal the identity of the arrestee on further investigation. Meanwhile, Chief Judicial Magistrate, Imphal granted police plea for arrested further custody of Nepalese nationals who were arrested from Hotel Paona Keithel (Bazar) on the charge of trafficking women and girls from to Myanmar.

In this way, we have touched around **4263 lives** (2687 males and 1576 females)



BUILDING INFRASTRUCTURE

While we try our best to give the people we connect with, a good 'today', we also work tirelessly to create mechanisms to build a secure 'tomorrow' for them. Various efforts through various operations have been made to create the perfect tomorrow. **1520 households** were impacted by pisci-culture (pond) awareness processes, **941 households** impacted through vet camps, **775** children were benefited by sports clubs and related events and so on.

More than a thousand, **1435** women were reached and impacted through various processes of self-help groups. FACILITATING LOW-COST, HIGH YIELD RICE CULTIVATION IN RURAL ASSAM

The 'System of Rice Intensification' (SRI) is a method aimed at increasing rice yield in farming. It is advantageous to paddy farmers because the cost of cultivation is low and the yield is very high. It is also an eco-friendly technique of cultivation where organic compost is used, making the land in use sustainable. FXBIS state team of NE had begun this initiative in the three remote villages of district Kamrup with exclusively small & marginal farmers. The area covered was 126 beeghas (approx.31.5 acres). 65 farmers had participated in the first phase of SRI cultivation. The initiative's first yield had recorded a result growth of above 30% over the usual productivity. Some 'food for thought'!

FXBIS PROMOTES WEAVERS' LIVELIHOODS

Under the CSR initiative of HDFC Bank, FXBIS assisted the traditional weavers to modernise their craft by renovating the size and strength of weaving looms, introducing new tools & techniques and providing training to work on them. This enabled the rural folk to do away with the excruciatingly time-consuming and consequently less remunerative livelihood practice, while preserving the craftsmanship of hand woven products. Weavers of women SHGs of two villages were supported through this intervention.

A practise of organising regular health camps has been adopted by our various teams across states of the country. In this year of operation, a total of **2461** adults and children were benefited by such health camps organised by our teams at various locations.



NUTRITION

Healthcare is complete when both preventive and curative measures are taken in partnership. Nutrition is one aspect that is both preventive and curative in nature in terms of general healthcare. This year, a total of **1331** adults and children were provided with dry nutrition, among who, **944** people belonged to PLHIV families.



WHY NUTRITION MATTERS

Awareness and sensitization toward any intervention is essential to both gain acceptance and sustain its impact among target groups. Thus, while the teams provide people and children with solid nutrition, they also do not neglect the need to educate them about why nutrition is important and how measures can be taken to maintain a nutritious lifestyle. Around **643** individuals participated in **nutrition session(s)** organised by teams.



TAKING THE OCCASION

While regular awareness sessions and efforts are a practice in our operations, observing occasions is also one of the major opportunities we proudly take to spread knowledge about the matters and concerns we work for. As many as **351** individuals were directly impacted by events and session organised by our teams on occasions such as World AIDS Day and World AIDS Orphans Day and so on.





CONVERGENCE IN HEALTH DOMAIN: SCRIPTING 'SHARED NARRATIVES'

Development is no one NGO's prerogative or obligation. It is in the shared narratives that hope for India lies. While directly implementing programmes on health at grassroots, FXBIS also attempts at joining heads and hands of like-minded agencies of the government, business houses, even armed forces, to work together for a healthier happier India. Seen are the photos from intervention fields in Manipur, Assam, Uttar Pradesh and Jharkhand, wherein the Army, HDFC, Max India Foundation and Arghyam have gladly collaborated - building together, what is popularly called, the "shared narratives of development".

ACCESS TO QUALITY EDUCATION

EDUCATION OF ALL FORMS

523 children were enrolled through Suraksha Education Centres at various locations, 262 children were benefited from Non-Formal Education (NFE) classes, 565 children were benefited from tuition classes, 52 children were benefited from life skill classes among several other interventions. Approximately, 1402 children were impacted.

TOOLS OF EDUCATION

Apart from an opportunity, equality of accessibility is one of the major elements that influence success of any endeavor toward empowerment. While FXBIS teams work toward providing the platform for education, they also work toward enabling the students in absorbing the most of the opportunity. For this purpose, school/education material was supplied to more than 3500 minds.

WHERE LIFE IS SKILL

FXBIS believes that life is all about the skills one is able to acquire and adopt. More than 1000 children, to be exact 1249 (74 male and 1175 female) were trained in different life skills to enable them to tackle various life situations with ease and efficiency. The power of skill is one of the most superior forms of empowerment.

KEEPING AN EYE

The importance of monitoring and assessment is as important as the actual intervention. With a strong belief in that, teams working with FXBIS have mastered the mechanism of assessment. Through several assessment visits targeted at children and their progress at schools, 631 children (279 males and 352 females) were assessed and 486 were taken under the ambit through health cell activities.

ASSISTING SLOW LEARNERS AND SCHOOL DROP-OUTS

FXBIS runs 28 Suraksha Education Centres pan-India for marginalised children with poor academic competence and also for the school drop-outs. Each Centre admits not more than 30 children to ensure individual attention. The teachings are through NFE classes with regular assessments and interactions with parents as well as the teachers (for school going kids). Each Centre also runs a small library, which is instrumental in nurturing reading habit among the children. [In pic: 1 of the 3 SECs at Darrang, Assam]

THE SCHOOL UP-LIFTMENT PROGRAMME, PUDUCHERRY

At one of our intervention locations, Puducherry, FXBIS, through its corporate partner Whirlpool India Ltd., has revived a 55 year old school completely. The school had lacked basic amenities such as hygienic toilets and urinals, adequate classrooms. The rural school ground was in a low lying area where stagnant rainwater caused waterborne diseases (dengue, malaria, typhoid) thus increasing absenteeism among students. This government school catering to 864 students has undergone a 180 degree change - Installing glass boards, pin boards to present and project exercises, developing reading corners, closed wall cupboards, murals, painting of school building, a proper kitchen, staff rooms, repairing of electrical items like ceiling fans and tube light for proper lighting and aeration for each classroom, RO water system and separate restrooms for boys and girls. A kids play zone was also developed because all work and no play makes both Jack and Jill dull children. Improving the infrastructure has resulted in a rise in school attendance. This renovation has taken a whole year and in appreciation, the State's Honorable Chief Minister chose to inaugurate the 'rejuvenated' school.

PROTECTION & SAFETY

SENSITIZATION

State teams of FXBIS through their various efforts have successfully sensitized more than 1000 children and adolescents in matters of human trafficking. We, at FXBIS, believe the first step to empowerment is knowledge and this knowledge is conveyed through this process of sensitization.

THE THREE R'S

FXBIS teams touched lives of several children and adolescents through its various operations. 121 children/adolescents were rescued, 180 rehabilitated and 180 reintegrated throughout the year. In this fight against human trafficking, 481 lives were saved. A total of 764 distress calls were handled during the year.

AWARENESS

The one's who propagate the values in the society need be reached out to too, so that awareness and sensitivity in the flow of knowledge and beliefs must be maintained. Working on these lines, through their awareness processes (for example sessions, rallies etc), FXBIS state teams impacted 61 religious leaders by sensitizing them against human trafficking and making them aware of its process and impact.

LEGAL AID & ENGAGING STAKEHOLDERS

Many survivors choose to restore their lives first, others choose to fight. While we stand with the ones who need our assistance, we fight with the ones who choose to take back their dignity. Team FXBIS provided 140 such fighters with legal aid to fight against the evil of the society to restore what's theirs. Over 4500 related stakeholders were engaged through workshops to build a conducive environment for survivors.





CONNECTING WITH STAKEHOLDERS: MANIPUR TAXI UNION JOIN THE FIGHT AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING

For the first time in the history of Ukhrul District in Manipur 70 representatives from the 500 member Taxi Union met to show solidarity and join the movement to prevent human trafficking and child sexual abuse in their district. They unanimously decided to include a 18th point in their Union Charter proclaiming that they will act as early warning system and will work closely with police to report any suspicious movement. All 500 taxi drivers will sign this charter which is the guiding principle of the taxi union. FXB India Suraksha has started to work closely with the Union to orient them on different aspects and modus operandi of human trafficking and will assist them in implementing their action plan. Mukti programme supported by ECPAT Luxembourg is in its way to become a people's movement in Ukhrul.

“CHILDREN'S MANIFESTO” OF JAIPUR DIVISION

140 children and 60 representatives from various organizations, Child Welfare Committees, government schools, shelter homes from the districts of Jaipur rural, Jaipur urban, Bassi, Sikar, Dossa and Jhunjhunu came together on a common platform - FXBIS in association with UNICEF and RIHR, Jaipur organized a two-day regional level workshop on 'DASHAM- Participation of Children in Democracy'. The young minds came up with a "charter of demands" to be heard upon and addressed by different political parties in their respective manifestos and present it during the Vidhan Sabha elections scheduled for 2018.


