1. Participation and involvement in Global Network activities
2. CHANCE organized four national and regional cancer awareness campaigns:
 - A poster competition and awareness campaign about environment and cancer was organized in 2013 in all universities and schools, in collaboration with the ministry of Environment and was selected in Seoul, Korea as the best cancer awareness campaign in Asia.
 - A second campaign “Child 4Child” was conducted in 2015 over TVs and all social media and had over 1 million viewers.
 - A third public and innovative campaign in 2018 addressed the issue of Art and Therapy and the importance of Art in the treatment of cancer.
 - A fourth campaign focusing on the warning signs of childhood cancer called: Ribbons of hope is taking place currently in 2019 in several schools in Lebanon where the Ministry of Education has made it mandatory in all public schools and recommended in private schools.
3. Since 2002 and for 17 years, CHANCE organizes a drawing contest for children with cancer and the best drawing are selected by a jury and constitute the pages of a beautiful, colorful calendar: The Children’s Calendar. It started with 1,000 copies and now 10,000 copies are printed and sold all over Lebanon. Funds collected go directly towards the treatment of children with cancer.
4. CHANCE Association major activities for Children and parents: Children’s Christmas Party, Egg Hunt, Art Therapy in hospitals, outing and events.
5. Take part in different exhibitions all over Lebanon.
6. Access to cure to children with cancer and blood disorders in different hospitals all over Lebanon by funding cost of treatment.
