We participated in the United Nations Global Compact Africa Sustainable CEO Business Roundtable which will take place on the 19th of January 2015 in Lagos. The event was jointly hosted by the UN Global Compact, the Nigerian Economic Summit Group and Global Compact Local Network Nigeria. The roundtable discussion focused on the importance of leadership and collective action in promoting the continent's development agenda. The event also showcased lessons from business leaders on how collective action has been supportive of inclusive and sustainable growth and the way forward for the African business community working in partnership with UN, civil society, and governments to set Africa's development path for the future.
