

1. CoP Minimum Requirements Swedish Net 2020

1.1 Introduction

Swedish Net continue to support the UN Global Compact initiative and the ten principles in the areas of human rights, labour, the environment and anti-corruption.

This is the eight Communication on Progress from Swedish Net Communication AB. In the past year Swedish Net have won more airport projects and security contracts. This has led to a series of new suppliers that are to be reviewed in our UN Global Compact supplier program, that process is integrated in our ISO certified quality management system.

1.2 Human rights

Sweden have stable governance with laws and regulations, and zero tolerance to human rights abuse in the public eye, because of this, human rights abuse is not common in serious companies within Sweden. However, the risk of complicity exists in every sector and every country, we see it as our social responsibility to boycott companies that are known to compromise human rights.

Our biggest concern is that companies abroad do not have stable governance or poor regards towards human rights. In our quality management system, we have decided to investigate those companies before making any business.

1.3 Labour

The four principles related to labour are regulated by law in Sweden. Besides that, Sweden have well established and strong worker unions. Companies from which Swedish Net hire labour must follow the collectively established regulations regarding paycheck, working hours etc.

Swedish Net now have a management system of occupational health and safety that is certified in ISO 45001.

1.4 Environment

Swedish Net have an environmental management system certified in ISO 14001.

1.5 Anti-corruption

Swedish Net believe that corruption of any kind is unacceptable.

2. Goals

Every year Swedish Net aim to do the following checks on the companies that we have or are working with:

- Crosscheck, on the internet, all foreign companies for human rights abuse, labour abuse, environmental crimes and corruption.
- Crosscheck, on the internet, most of the companies that are active in Sweden and abroad for human rights abuse, labour abuse, environmental crimes and/or corruption.
- Crosscheck, on the internet, a sample of Swedish companies that are active only in Sweden for human rights abuse, labour abuse, environmental crimes or corruption.

3. Measurement of outcome

- **Crosscheck, on the internet, all foreign companies for human rights abuse, labour abuse, environmental crimes and corruption.**

Out of 8/8 controlled companies we found 0 companies that did not fulfil at least one of the ten principles.

- **Crosscheck, on the internet, most of the companies that are active in Sweden and abroad for human rights abuse, labour abuse, environmental crimes and/or corruption.**

Out of 14/14 controlled companies we found 1 company that did not fulfil at least one of the ten principles.

5. Result

Nestlé still has problems with child labour. One reason is that nearly 20 years after pledging to eradicate child labour, the company still cannot identify the farms where all their cocoa comes from, let alone whether child labour was used in producing it. Nestlé can trace 49% of its global cocoa supply to farms, which is higher than Mars, maker of M&M's and Milky Way, they can trace only 24%.

Allegations against SAAB and Lula in Brazil are being investigated, Swedish Net won't take any actions until the investigation is finished.

Leaked documents showed that Danske bank aided in Azerbaijan corruption scandal in 2012-2014, no legal action has been taken against the company since then. The US Securities and Exchange Commission and Department of Justice are both investigating Danske in probes expected to last several years.
