In the last two years SeConS has taken numerous actions in order to support the Global Compact. Some of those actions can be classified as academia, while others can be seen as civil society organizations activities. Those activities are:

- Promotion of the GC and its principles through applied research and thought leadership in relation to the Global Compact and also by delivering education on topics related to the Global Compact
- Participation in Global Compact global and local events
- Joining special initiatives and work streams

- Supported by UN Women SeConS, conducted analysis for inclusion of gender perspectives in COVID-19 short- and long-term response efforts. Main aim was to reveal how the situation caused by COVID-19 affects women in Serbia, especially in terms of their position in the labour market (with a specific focus on certain categories of women), participation in the economy of care and redistribution of unpaid care work. In order to achieve the objective of the assignment, the research team used a holistic approach, combining quantitative and qualitative research methods. Quantitative research included representative survey on the general population of Serbia that have been actively participating in the labour market (1 603 respondents), as well as on-line surveys with different categories of women, such as: women entrepreneurs (50 respondents), women working in economy of care (80 respondents) and rural women (80 respondents). Qualitative part of the research included 10 in-depth interviews with each categories of women.
- In partnership with University of Novi Sad, Nis and Belgrade, SeConS is from 2018, implementing the project "Erasmus+ Programme - Capacity Building project in the field of Higher Education (E+CBHE)". Main aim of the project is designing academic courses in public policy and assessing the capacities and needs for this topic among various actors.
- SeConS, supported by UNFPA in Bosna and Herzegovina conducted Population Situation Analysis (PSA) as a basis for a comprehensive appraisal of the population situation and trends in Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH), its linkages with sexual and reproductive health and gender, and its impacts on poverty, inequality and development.
- Members of SeConS team participated in regular meetings of Global Compact Local Network
- On Monitoring social situation in Serbia (MONS) online platform, SeConS has published 6 Issues covering various topics, such as: gender equality, public policies, employment etc.
- SeConS conducted initial assessment within UNOPS project in order to contribute to increased social inclusion of women and men, girls and boys experiencing poverty and social exclusion enabling them to live in dignity and take an active part in society. For the purpose of this assignment, more than 50 individuals were interviewed in 30 municipalities.
