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Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association works locally and nationally to ensure that women and especially girls have equal opportunities for equal rights to life. Founded in 2012 in Bursa province, the Independent Women's training center and 24/7 Violence Hotline provide services to women and children who are subjected to violence. It works to raise awareness, awareness and education about combating discrimination, ensuring gender equality, preventing violence.

Vision and values of the association

Vision; to be a national and International Women's association working on the elimination of discrimination based on gender inequality, combating violence against women and their types, ensuring and mainstream gender equality.

Values are principles that aim to be good, fair and fair in decisions and behaviors related to other parties, i.e. stakeholders.

- •People-oriented: Respecting human rights and adopting this form of behavior
- •Nonviolence: visibility, language and communication in our work ensure that there are no elements that support violence in all tools
- •**Egalitarian:** race, language, religion, color, gender identity, sexual orientation, political thought, philosophical belief, sect, etc. indiscriminate in causes
- •Democratic: ensuring democratic participation in making decisions and sharing ideas, freedom of thought and expression.
- •Participant: to receive the ideas and suggestions of our internal and external stakeholders and to shape our work. Participate in networks and platforms that support our mission.

The association works with public institutions, non-governmental organizations, local governments and the private sector and reaches many people through awareness studies. It works to raise awareness and awareness that violence should not be silent, abuse, harassment, rape should not be tolerated. The dissemination of gender equality produces projects to bring about a change of mindset. It struggles with the inequalities created by gender stereotypes and norms, as well as the gender-based violence it creates. For this reason, every year it shares its data studies with the public 24/7 and all of Turkey has a service violence line with the cooperation of the private sector and conducts work based on gender equality and provides support in the creation of company policies. 'We curb violence' 'don't mask violence', 'we speak violence in men's language' 'Purple trail', 'women's Health' 'Women and sexuality' 'parents' are part of the education and awareness work. Conducts field work in the field of child marriages, organizes educational trainings and produces policies. As a member of the European Women's lobby and the European network for combating violence against women (WAVE), it has

### a voice in many platforms in Turkey for women to achieve human rights and equal life.

The association provides cooperation with psychologists, psychological consultants, social work, sociologists, and people who have received training in the field of child development in order to carry out their work effectively. Since the association serves people who are confidential (women and children who remain and leave the shelter, whose identification numbers have been changed, who have a decision to protect), it wants people who want to become a member to benefit from voluntary work and training modules for a certain period of time. There are 29 active members and 'volunteer groups of lawyers, psychologists and translators' who provide support to public events. It also established the 'Mor Salkım youth' group to ensure the active participation of young people, and the 'Mor Salkım Academy unit to support the work of students and academics doing academic studies at the University. Since its establishment, the Association, which conducts joint work with student interns from Italy, France, Denmark, Germany, Egypt, Morocco, Tunisia, Poland and Russia, has started the 'Purple internship' program in Turkey, where all young people can apply.

The corona virus COVID-19, described as a global pandemic that began in March 2020, covering the Global Compact report preparation time period, not only threatens human health. As in the world, in our country, the inequalities experienced by women and girls in this process have increased rapidly. A decrease in women's participation in the labor force and the depreciation of their labor increased the domestic burden, an increase in the rate of economic poverty, especially during the covid-19 pandemic, a high health risk due to the large number of women working in the health and service sector, and problems living in equal access to education increased inequalities.

In addition, violence against women has increased in our country and all over the world. Homes that are called safe places for women and children have unfortunately ceased to be safe places and have become the center of violence.

As you will read in the report in this process, the association has been on the side of women with the support of lawyers and psychologists, has continued to advocate and produce policies in national and International Networks, has reached many people with two separate projects covering the fight against violence called 'We curb violence' and 'becoming a mask for violence', prepared and shared with the public the publication titled 'Effects of Covid-19 period on women and girls', which includes projects and challenges, as well as findings obtained from organizations conducting research on the effects of inequalities in Turkey and the world.



Mor Salkım is an association headquartered in Bursa. It also supports women and children applying from all regions of Turkey and abroad. Between 2012-2019, it reached 7,150 women and 4280 children. 285 of the women were refugees. 12 were Trans, and 12 were disabled. 81 men called the Solidarity Center.

We stand in solidarity in the fight against violence by women who face inequalities at the level of fundamental rights in social life, working life, health and access to education. In 2019, 1,642 women and 459 children received support from the Purple panicle Solidarity Center. 162 of the women were refugees, 2 were Trans, and 3 were disabled. 52 men called the Solidarity Center. 65% of applicants were contacted by Phone, 2% by email and Digital media channels, and 33% by coming directly to the Solidarity Center. Talks with

the Violence Hotline and Digital media were also planned and

directed together. 3 of the men called to complain about the violence, while 49 appealed for relatives. The violence hotline calls emergency cases between 24.00/06.00. 204 emergency cases were referred to law enforcement and chenim.





#### **January 9, 2019**

Mor Salkim Association is engaged in awareness and advocacy work on preventing violence and achieving gender equality at the national and international levels.

In this context, many reports and documents need voluntary translators for international dissemination. It also needs lawyer support in advocacy and legal work. It needs groups of lawyers whose clients can get opinions about monitoring their savannas and even resolving some cases. Our association, which works with the Bursa Bar Association Women's Rights Center, especially on the support of lawyers for women who do not have income, provides support in the cases





of women and children who are victims of violence who earn income, but cannot provide the opportunity for lawyers from the bar because they do not have income. It appoints its volunteer lawyers to monitor many cases of violence, harassment, rape in the local area. In addition, there is a need for psychologists and psychological consultants to provide psychological support for the strengthening of our consultants, both through field work and the development of materials. And in this context, ads for translators, lawyers, psychologists and psychological counselors are published on social media at certain intervals. After our announcements, meetings were held with our returning volunteers and social media groups were activated.

We attended a meeting of neighborhood women's associations in Nilüfer organized by Nilüfer Municipality.

Educational activities entitled discrimination, gender equality, equality in language were carried out against the students of Uludag University Community Volunteers.

The study, called 'We workshop', aims to be peer education. After the educational trainings prepared by experts for the youth group of the Mor Salkım women's Solidarity Association, the 'discrimination workshop' held by the

peer group for university youth was held. There were workshops on discrimination and its effects. Workshops; It is intended to continue with the gender and secure relationships module in language and communication.

In 2019, we continued our cooperation to raise awareness of disabled people in the community. We collaborated with the project team on the project, which

includes photography, short film and documentary film content. On the night when the results of the project were shared with the press, institutions and civil society, Faik Kaplan presented a plaque of thanks that he received on behalf of our association to our president Dilek Üzümcüler.



#### February 18, 2019

In the field of rights advocacy, we met with our volunteer group of lawyers, where we worked to monitor and produce policies on violence cases. support the litigation processes of women who do not have financial status and whose conditions cannot receive support from the bar women's Rights Center, inform our consultants about the

processes of violence cases against women and children. We discussed the processes we were moving forward with, shared experiences and planned projects together.

We participated in the Association legislation training with the presentation of Osman Dikmen within the scope of capacity development trainings of Nilüfer associations campus.

#### February 26, 2019

During the local elections, we participated in the 'Common Mind Common Happiness' Civil Society Forum, which was organized by Turgay Erdem, a candidate for mayor of Nilüfer district.

We have presented our local government expectations and suggestions on projects that can be realized in Nilüfer district. Our local advocacy work is important for us, especially in local elections, we have held talks about sharing our demands with candidates when possible and getting a say in practices. After the meeting, we were happy that our demands were included in the presidential candidate's

program. If a presidential candidate is elected, we will follow our demands.

#### February 26, 2019

We participated in the '8 March International Women's day' event organized by Bursa platform for empowerment of women, in which private sector employees are the target audience.

In order to raise awareness of gender equality, participated with our association Youth group in the event where the 'Hidden Numbers' film screening based on a true story was held and exchanged views after the film screening.

Hazal Soyucengil, a member of our association, participated in the meeting, which was attended by thousands of female delegates from 149 countries and expressed their demands.

Mrs. Acar and Mrs.Bakırcı, mentioned the subsequent signing the Istanbul Convention the Istanbul convention process with Turkey on sanctions; laws and international conventions to combat violence against women in Turkey; Istanbul Convention combating violence against women and women in the strength of directions, to take into account the parts that needed jurists, law No. 6284 supporting and reinforcing aspects of

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
the Istanbul Convention explained.

We have turned our Legal Aid Center into a women's Rights Center and assigned a colleague to get effective results only in applications to be made under law 6284," she said.

Altun stressed that the struggle for women's rights is the most important struggle left standing today, and "because many unions, associations have lost the field of struggle, despair, when there is a negative attempt to regulate violence against women and sexual abuse of children, they immediately unite and stand up. In this sense, I respectfully welcome the women's struggle," she said. After the speeches, Bursa Bar Association president Av. Gürkan Altun and Bursa Bar Association General Secretary Av. Husniye Golden Yesil and Mor Salkım women's Solidarity Association President Dilek Üzümcüler, gave a plaque to the panelists. Local press and columnists showed great interest in the work.

Emel Helvaci and Gönül Soyucengil participated in the 3-day training on 'rights-based participation and freedom of Association' organized by the Civil Society Development Center Association.

Our members completed the two-stage training, which continued on April 15, and shared their knowledge in our association.


#### March 27, 2019

Nilüfer Municipality presidential candidate Turgay Erdem participated in the common mind joint happiness workshop during the election process and conveyed our demands and suggestions.

In communicating our demands and suggestions, we stated that the Istanbul Convention considers violence against women as a problem for men and women. We noted that violence is caused by inequality between men and women, and increasing inequality will increase violence.

We have shared the following information about what is happening and that it imposes certain obligations on states parties to prevent and immediately intervene in violence under the Istanbul Convention.

\* Establishment of social work centers and shelters for women (m.23)



It's already in the Metropolitan Municipality Act. municipalities with population of more than 100 thousand have to open. In Turkey, unfortunately, it is insufficient. Bursa is also inadequate.

\* 24/7 free telephone support line (m.24)

а

There should be a 24/7 phone line that works very effectively and has an immediate incident response effect.

\* Sexual violence or rape crisis centers (m.25)

It should open up to places where women can easily reach. The fact that those who have been subjected to sexual violence are with the woman at all stages, from collecting evidence to healing their wounds and following the legal process, as soon as they apply here. It should open at least as much as the bunker.

Turkey is also experiencing an explosion in sexual crimes this is very important. It will be a deterrent when attackers know that they can easily go to a center within the state and be followed from there. In Turkey, it never opened. We have stated that we are waiting from Bursa.

According to our demands, every neighborhood will be a Women-Friendly City manager such as Day Child Care Homes, Sexual Crisis Center, solidarity Centers, shelter. We've asked all the mayoral candidates for the Sexual Violence Crisis Center plan.

They noted that education is effective, allowing them to look at it from a different perspective in their lives and relationships. We completed our peer education work with the same group of participants with a discrimination workshop, gender and secure relationships module in language and communication.

May 8, 2019

With public relations department of Faik Çelik Vocational and Technical Anatolian High School, we organized seminar called 'Not Love, Are You Aware?' by our experts psychologist Saliha Türköz Kaplan and gender equality expert Burcu Üzümcüler.

The seminar, attended by about 200 young people, discussed adolescence, dating violence, gender equality and the fight against violence against women. After the seminar, a group of students and Burcu Üzümcüler held a workshop on dating violence and safe relationships.

And at the end of the workshop we shared our declaration with the media and the public. For our charette, we prepared an awareness brochure on alimony law, in addition, following the privacy policies, we prepared a short film for the women who have problems during the alimony process and receive service from our association. Pensioner Judge Att. Eray Karınca and



one of the lawyers of Istanbul Bar Association Hülya Gülbahar made a briefing and 45 lawyers and the representatives of various women associations attended to this "Alimony Workshop".

At the opening of the workshop, Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association lawyer Aybüke Çakırel said that they closely follow up the discussions regarding to the short termness or even cancelation of poverty alimony which has been ongoing in the public for a while, and for this reason, they organized a workshop and had decided to discuss all aspects this alimony issue with experts on this subject which concerns every woman living in our country

regarding to alimony issue.



#### Why did we organize an Alimony workshop?

First of all, it should be stated that; the alimony is brought over the claim to the public opinion that alimony victims exist, and the requested legal regulations have been put forward on the basis of aggrievements of singular examples. Examples expressed as singular are originated from a few days of marriages and intentions of paying alimony

for life. It is unknown that how many of the alimony files are in this situation or how many people pay alimony as in this subject. No scientific criteria, research or data have been presented for these alleging aggrievements. It is stated by the authorities that such data and studies are not available. It is extremely objectionable attempting to make a legal change based on the allegation of male victims of uncertain definition, number and ratio. Moreover, even if there is a limited number of allegations, it is necessary to consider the picture of women living in our country who have to live with poverty under all kinds of inequality and gendered policies. Discussing alimony from this point of view is taking the matter away from its essence.

#### Poverty Alimony Stems from Women's Gender Inequality.

Pensioner Judge Att. Eray Karınca, one of the speakers, especially stated that 'The poverty alimony stems from women's gender inequality and gave information on case studies and information on legal process. The women, from the moment they were born and to the moment they die are under a service and obedience relationship with men. The constitutional court has rejected two cancellation applications regarding to the request of permanent statute of alimony of poverty. Therefore, it has been confirmed that there is no contrariety to the constitution for a permanent statute of alimony of poverty. It is underlined that there is no

need to change the law or to restrict the articles by the decision of the judges because Turkish civil code predicts this subject sufficient enough by making adjustments to prevent the alimony obligation being an aggrieve. '


In addition, he stated that 'Most of the people who claim to be aggrieves of alimony pay child support. Child support is paid for the common children. These

people create a misperception by launching the child support is permanent and paid to women such as the poverty alimony. '

After the briefings, a workshop was held with lawyers.

Suggestions for Solutions were Discussed due to the Alimony Issues and The Suggestions are Shared with the public as following.

Women are the main victims of the alimony problem.



- Women's poverty stems from gender inequality. Poverty alimony is a result of the social gender roles that expose women to economical violence as a gender. So, until gender-based poverty is removed, it is an obligatory institution
- Gendered statistics on the women's poverty which is as a result of gender inequality, on poverty alleviation policies and alimony should be kept.
- There should be a transition to the registered economy. The unregistered economy reduces the amount of alimony and makes it difficult to collect. Precautions should be taken.
- Penalties should be aggravated for uncollected alimonies.
- Precautionary alimony and child support are mixed together on purpose. One should be careful about the the messages reflected on this in subject. The fact that the child support





that is paid for the children to the mother who is responsible for taking care of the children, does not mean that the alimony is paid for the woman herself. As the name implies, child support is ruled for the needs of the child and is even not enough frequently.

Precautionary alimony must be observed ex officio.

• The alimony obligator chooses to work without any insurance and to transfer their goods to third parties. Preventive and problem-solving determinations cannot be made in a short time against these people. The period for starting an action for annulments should be extended in fictitious transfers, and cancellation cases should be concluded quickly.

• Due to gender inequality, women with children who are not ever employed once outside their home, imprisoned working at home without any education and work experience falls into

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a void and have to live with an alimony of 300-500 TL. per month.

• Prolonged trials are another problem. Oblige women without any financial income and a regular job try to live on a low alimony during the trial process which can be sometimes up to 3-5 years.

• Random police reports, lack of information, insufficient social and economic researches, consisting own statements of the parties' in many cases cause a loss of right for women. For

the police, research guides that will provide access to the true materials should be prepared and trainings should be done on keeping the correct records.

• 'Precautionary alimony' is an alimony that must be ruled automatically and urgently even if not requested by the judge. It has no boundary with the poverty alimony to be ruled at the end of the case. By the judges, in practice, unfortunately, it is considered as the poverty alimony. In many cases, it is ruled after months of researches of socio-economic situation.



- When alimony is paid, an enforcement fee is requested, which must be removed.
- Persons in prison are not held responsible for alimony, however, they can pay alimony by the allowance registration books or a separate arrangement can be made for the obligators in prison or his guardian can be held responsible.
- Cumulative alimony debt should not turn into an unsecured debt.
- It creates a problem not to enforce preventive detention without any notification made personally. Since the obligators responsible for alimony do not leave any record, notification cannot be made and therefore preventive detention cannot be applicable.

Examples of municipalities to be taken as an example with the units such as social projects committees, women's solidarity, disability services, equality centers, HIV screening centers, mature youth centers, women and children's Centers, neighborhood committees, social units besides the good

With this project, the company aims to spread the corporate culture, contribute to the personal development of the employee, to improve their competencies and improve social compliance processes. Within the scope of the project, to establish a Gender Equality Committee by discussing the issue of women's empowerment at the management level, writing and improving the corporate policy, making measurements by conducting awareness surveys for all employees, 9 thousand hours trainings in total for 2 thousand employees, giving a full-day training to new employees in apparel as part of the orientation training program, raising awareness of both parents and children by organizing a Parenting School activity in the kindergarten for 3 years, providing awareness training to supplier companies as well as Yeşim Textile were discussed. Reactions from women are growing due to the statements made by the government about the restriction of poverty alimony, the change of law that abolishes the punishment for child abusers in case the child marries its abusers known as act of indemnity to child abusers in the public which are included in the second judicial package. 196 women's organizations, which are members of the Women's Alimony Rights Platform and TPK 103 Women Platform said 'we will not allow the usurpation of women's and children's rights under the pretext of judicial reform! by publishing a joint declaration. In this declaration published with the signature of Women's Alimony Rights Platform - TPK 103 Women Platform stated 'We object to the verdict of reprieve in case abusers marry the child which is said to be included in the judicial package. We repeat once again: We do not accept any adjustments that will exonerate rape and legitimize its abuse and pave the way of early and forced marriages for child.

# "IMMEDIATELY STOP THE ATTEMPTS TO MAKE REMISSIONS TO THE RAPISTS!"

In the declaration" We repeat once again: We do not accept any adjustments that will exonerate rape and legitimize its abuse and pave the way of early and forced marriages for child", it was reminded that the same draft of law was brought to the agenda of the Assembly by AKP in 2016 and at this period millions of women make protests on the streets against draft of law.

The details of the amendments to be made in the declaration are explained as follows: "The new regulation, which is claimed to be included in the second judicial package, it includes postponing the verdict in case that the age difference between the child and the perpetrator of sexual abuse is not more than 10 years and getting married each other. As we stated in 2016, we once again state by underlining that we do not accept any regulations that it will pave the way for early and forced marriages at a young age, that would legitimize child abuse and forgive rape".

In this declaration which was pointed out that this change of laws is against to the contractual rights of children and women which also Turkey is a part of, it was demanded that this issue should not be brought to the agenda again.

The conference starting with the opening speech of women from Women's Solidarity Foundation (KADAV), Mor Çatı Women's Shelter Foundation and International Migrant Women Solidarity Association continued with the presentation of the manifests, realization of the workshops and the presentation of the results for three days. The Congress Conclusion Declaration will be published on November the 25th, on the International Day of Combating Violence Against Women as the same as every year.

The meeting point of the congress on the first day is Beşiktaş Fulya Sanat- Süleyman Seba Culture Center.

The conference started with the opening speech titled Feminist Policies for Combating Violence .In his opening speech, it is said that hundreds of women gathered here today, is the guarantee that while all these attacks keep going, we will not give up the rights we have won by struggling for years .

Feride Acar, the first speaker of the first session of of the congress which is under the topic "Possibility of a Integrated Feminist Social Work Mechanism", gave information about Istanbul Convention, the GREVIO Evaluation Report and the general situation in Turkey and she said "47 suggestions out of the 65 suggestions at the GREVIO Report require immediate prevention".

# Final Declaration of 39 items from the Refugees Convention

The 22nd of Women's Shelters and Counseling Centers Congress was held on 2-4 November in Istanbul by hosting of Women's Solidarity Foundation (KADAV), Mor Çatı Women's Shelter Foundation and International Migrant Women's Solidarity Association.

This year the conference was held under the topic of "Feminist Social Policies for Combating Violence".

To this conference, 270 people in total attended from 29 provinces, 50 women and LGBTI + organizations and 33 public institutions as well as women and LGBTI + organizations fighting against male violence to women, feminists and women working in the field of struggle with violence against women from the municipalities and the institutions that are subject to the ministry of family, labor and social services.

Participants shared a concluding declaration which consists of 39 items stating a a common consensus on "the continuity of the fight male violence against women effectively."

"For a world without limits and exploitation, and with equality and freedom"

In the text in which women shared the declaration, they explained that they women will not give up the struggle with the following words:

"We declare once again that we will continue to carry out monitoring and advocacy activities in order to eliminate the shortcomings and difficulties in the implementation of our achievements, which we will never give up as women, women and LGBTI + organizations, who came together at the 22nd Women's Shelters and Counseling Centers Congress."

"We continue to fight against violence through our effective solidarity mechanisms together with our differences for a world without borders, exploitation, and with equality and freedom." Final declaration

The demands in the Final Declaration are listed as follows:

- o Frequently repeated by the upper echelons of the state, the "unequal" discourse permeates every area of public mechanisms and fuels discrimination and thus violence against women. Such discourses should be abandoned immediately.
- o In order to internalize and implement the principle of gender equality as a holistic policy in all areas of the public, mandatory in-service trainings for violence against women based on gender equality should be provided to the personnel working in the field of judicial and law enforcement agencies.
- o Integrated policies should be followed so that women who are subjected to violence do not get caught in bureaucratic obstacles and all support mechanisms should work in a coordinated and urgent manner.
- o Efforts should be made to ensure that rights-based perspective prevail, not aid, in studies conducted with women and public-NGO collaborations.
- o In order to establish holistic mechanisms, a central system should be established to ensure that the confidentiality decisions taken within the scope of the law numbered 6284 are viewed from a single point in all official institutions.

- o Municipalities and their affiliates should fulfill their responsibilities regarding the support mechanisms to be provided to women subjected to violence. Relevant directorates working in municipalities should have a women's perspective.
- o Return to education should be facilitated for women who are subjected to violence and make demands on this issue. Also, vocational training should be provided to women who demand it, and the Ministry of National Education (MEB) should provide the necessary infrastructure in this direction.
- Support mechanisms suitable for the specific conditions of women who are exposed to multiple discrimination due to their specific situations such as disability, sexual orientation, language, origin .. etc., or due to their needs should be established and access to these mechanisms should be provided. For example, in cases where women with disabilities are subjected to domestic violence, harassment or abuse, after their applications of violence, their caregivers are forced to remain in an environment of violence in order not to be homeless because they are also their families. Support mechanisms should be established taking into account such specific conditions. Disadvantaged groups who suffer from multiple discrimination should be prioritized in counseling services.
- o ŞÖNİM, women's solidarity centers and shelter workers should receive supervisor support. Employees should be assigned in a way to reduce the attrition rate and working hours should be reduced.
- o The number of professionals and social workers working in ŞÖNİM and women's shelters should be increased, and efforts should be made to provide support with experts for 24/7 service.
- o It should be ensured that ŞÖNİM regulations are applied in the same way everywhere.
- o Instead of applying specialization policies as a solution to the existing problems in shelters, it should first be ensured that the general needs and deficiencies of the shelters are determined and met, and social policies are formed according to the women's perspective.
- o Women's organizations should have a say in the functioning and control of state shelters and ŞÖNİMs and should be included in the control mechanisms. People with a female perspective should be employed in these institutions. Regular meetings should be held between those working in these institutions and women's organizations working on violence, and data on violence should be shared.
- o The physical conditions of the shelters should be improved; Special rooms for women and children should be planned; Safe areas for children should be provided. Child-adolescent studies in shelters should be carried out in a qualified manner, and the article 6284 for women who apply to the shelter with boys over 12 years old and a separate house in the "Women's Shelters Regulation" should be operated without seeking the life safety risk of women.
- o Women in shelters should be directed to certification programs according to their interests. It should be strengthened professionally. Course durations should be arranged in proportion to the length of time the women stay in the shelter.
- o The 24/7 hotline, which has expert personnel in the field of violence against women and provides support only in the field of violence against women and children, should be

designed by employing sufficient number of personnel in many languages and considering the needs of disabled individuals.

- o For a more effective fight against violence against women and children in Turkey, qualified data and statistics should be kept, and should be shared with the public. The importance of data retention in combating violence should be addressed with seriousness and determination.
- o Since 2002, there has not been even a research on hearing-impaired women. Studies that focus on the needs of women with disabilities and reveal the forms of violence they are exposed to should be conducted.
- o Precautionary decisions should be made according to the need, taking into account the criteria for ensuring security and empowerment, depending on the content of the measure.
- o It is necessary to explain the contract clause and justification of the reconciliation duty in such files, to go back to the duty, and to explain the mechanism of secondary violence and pressure. Compulsory mediation with the perpetrator should never be applied, as stated in the Istanbul Convention.
- o Fees should not be collected in alimony enforcement files, the loss of rights suffered by women whose alimony is not paid should be compensated.
- o Persistent pursuit should be defined as a crime by making arrangements in the Turkish Penal Code.
- o Forced marriage of children aged 15-18 should be defined as rape and all mechanisms should be put into practice to protect children and to protect their best interests.
- o Women who are subjected to violence should be provided with unconditional, free complaints and support opportunities without seeking documents. The legal aid services of the bar associations should appoint a lawyer in case of violence without seeking documents. In terms of criminal proceedings, in cases that do not fall within the scope of compulsory defense, if violence is in question, a lawyer should be assigned to the victim voluntarily. The lawyers assigned should be equipped with the necessary equipment.
- o The awareness of policy makers and the public on multiple discrimination should be increased, social workers in shelters and solidarity centers should obtain information on the rights of the disabled and carry out support activities for disabled women to live independently.
- o To combat multiple discrimination, inter-agency networks should be created on local service maps.
- o In order to ensure correct communication, a multilingual, non-sexist mechanism, especially in Sign language, Arabic, Persian and Kurdish, should be designed urgently.
- o All kinds of social support mechanisms for trans people should be implemented in an efficient and accessible manner.
- o Measures should be taken against the sexist and discriminatory discourses of the media that do not reflect the truth.
- o Areas for women and LGBTI + should be opened / increased in employment.
- o Necessary legal conditions must be provided for women's organizations that were closed to reopen.

- o Women should have access to legal abortion by the end of the 10th week in all health units regardless of their age and marital status, and the obstacles in implementation should be removed. Women staying in all public institutions (shelters, prisons, etc.) should have access to abortion.
- The term of pregnancy termination should be removed from the law in article 6 of the law numbered 2827 and the consent of spouse should not be sought in abortion.
- o Women should be provided with access to sexual and reproductive health services and obstacles to access should be removed.
- o It should be ensured that women and men have free and easy access to all contraceptive information, methods and counseling in primary health care institutions, and it should be informed that people can access this information, method and counseling in primary care, a mandatory referral mechanism should be established and government policies should be compatible with this.
- o Rape crisis centers, where support for screening and prevention of sexually transmitted diseases after sexual violence is given and measures are taken to prevent pregnancy, should be opened and psychological support should be provided.
- o Effective policies should be developed to prevent child pregnancies and forced marriage.
- o All these practices and studies should be carried out in coordination with women's organizations and with the recommendations of women's organizations.
- o Ministry of National Education and Health should provide sexual health education in schools with common protocols.

# 66 Institutions Reacted to the Abuse Law: Marrying Children Is a Crime

In the statement, it was stated that "when girls aged 12-16 are married to people 10-15 years older than them who raped them, an amnesty is opened to rapists, in other words, 'impunity' is imposed".

66 non-governmental organizations, trade unions and trade associations, including the Association for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect, and the Turkish Psychologists Association, made a statement regarding the draft law that would impose an 'amnesty' to the perpetrator in case children marry men who exposed them to sexual abuse. In the statement titled "It is a serious violation of children's rights for children to marry people who rape them", it was stated briefly as follows:

"We are going backwards on the way of implementing children's rights to civilization. The regulation regarding the marriage of girls who were prevented by the Turkish Criminal Law Reform to those who raped them in 2005, has been brought before us as a situation that carries very serious risks with its legal and psychosocial dimensions and is completely against the rights of the child.

"With this legal regulation, when girls aged 12-16 are married to people 10-15 years older than them who raped them, the rapists are pardoned, in other words," impunity "is brought. This legal regulation is presented to the society as a solution and a perception is created as if it was a protective and restorative law.

"The consent of the family is justification for amnesty"

"In marriages where young girls are forced to come together with older adults under the imam marriage, a statement is made by this law that the husband in prison will be released with amnesty, the family integrity will be restored, the girl child has no complaints, the consent of the family is forgiven. Justifications are put forward.

"Studies show that, in early age marriages in our country, more than 30 percent of children are married to adults through imam marriage and this situation is with the consent and approval of the families.

"It will bring 'amnesty' to those who abused children"

"In this case, if a 12-year-old girl is sexually harassed by an adult male 15 years older than her in the context of an imam wedding, this act will not be considered a crime.

"In addition, when this law comes into effect, it will impose" impunity "," amnesty "not only to individuals within the scope of marriages with imam marriage at an early age, but also to all persons who have sexually abused girls.

"Approaches that disregard gender equality in our country, traditional and religious dogmas, especially anachronistic attitudes that see girls as a sexual object, a`property that parents can manage as they wish, an entity without their own will, orientation, emotion or thought, Perspectives that prioritize, passivate and devalue girls have become so widespread that even the issue of marrying girls to those who rape them can be brought up as a debatable issue.

"It means deprivation of the right to education"

"With a primitive point of view, the function and goal of this process is to protect and

marry a" "dishonored" girl under the grip of a traditional stigma and to offer her a solution by marrying her, and to open a way to an amnesty for the man who raped her.

"Marrying a girl means depriving her of the right to education, which is one of her most fundamental rights. Again, marrying a girl to the person who raped her causes a feeling of worthlessness, low self-esteem, anger, exclusion and abandonment, and she feels at a dead end.

- "We should take side with the children"
- \* Early marriage is basically a child bullying, a clear violation of children's rights.
- \* In terms of Children's Rights, individuals before the age of 18 are considered children and marriage is unthinkable for them both physically and spiritually. Children cannot be married because of their right to education, play, and participate in self-improvement activities.
- \* In addition, children have the right to be protected from all kinds of sexual exploitation and sexual abuse.
- \* Child marriage is a violation of the rights of the child and therefore a crime for adults who do it.
- \* In our country, girls between the ages of 12-16 are forced to live together in a husband-wife relationship with adults 10-15 years older than them under imam marriage or other definitions. In our society, such marriages should be ended through inspection, sanction and information.
- \* At this point, serious duties fall on the whole society, families and the state together with NGOs.
- \* Marrying children is a crime and all adults who have committed this crime and participated in this crime should be punished.
- \* As NGOs, families and policy practitioners, we must stand against this legal regulation that requires children to marry people who rape them and stand by them!



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# Purple panicle women's Solidarity Center and Violence Hotline data



Mor Salkım; is an association headquartered in Bursa. It also supports women and children applying from all regions of Turkey and abroad. Between the date (2012–2020) 8442 women have reached them.

In 2020, 1292 women received support from 555 children's solidarity centers. 75 of the applications were refugee, 5 disabled, 4 trans women. 54 men applied to the Solidarity Center.

Child support Rights Women's platform and TCK 103 women's platform Member Women's organizations at a press conference held in Istanbul expressed their objections and views on trying to grant amnesty to perpetrators who have committed sexual abuse against children under the name of execution discount. The press conference was attended by representatives of CHP and HDP, as well as several representatives of women's organizations.

Opening speech and moderator Hale Celebi at a press conference held today in 48 different provinces and districts across Turkey, women's organizations made a press release to share their objections and views and to say that "Child Sexual Abuse will not be forgiven". Reading the statement prepared by women's organizations, Yeşim Erkan noted that the

> state responsible for protecting children considers it irrational and conscientious to try to legitimize the sexual abuse of children without even sharing data, and called on the government; "Instead forgiving of abusers. implement measures that will protect children!.

Ceren Akkaya, who stressed that the amnesty in question means impunity, stated that they anticipate that this amnesty will encourage and encourage the perpetrators of child abuse crimes.

Religious marriages without a marriage license the killing of children, clerics, families of girls who married as children, and who condone it by not accomplishing the obligation to report the person and should be punished by the official authorities, noting that Gulbahar: "consent to sexual behavior of children under the age of 15 of the Turkish penal code that is out of the question to be stated clearly, early and forced to marry the arrangement as a crime in all circumstances, the age of marriage be increased to 18 and no space to leave a comment and become aware to them in the manner the law should be included." said. He also noted that regulations aimed at paving the

way for early and child marriages could not be considered separate from the attempt to strip women of their right to alimony.

# It should be remembered!

Early / forced marriages often lead to early pregnancies, which leads to risks in maternal and Child Health that can also lead to death and affect the child throughout their life.

Early / forced marriages take away the most basic human rights of children.



Children who are married early/forcibly face very serious health problems and psychological traumas may occur in children.

These risk situations and problems have been raised many times over the years by many countries, including Turkey, and no longer need to be questioned even at the level of society.

With such arrangements, the lives of girls are put at risk and gender equality, which is an important component of social peace, is ignored!

According to statistics, sexual abuse is largely carried out in the family or by people in the child's immediate vicinity, and the crime is often committed by someone the child knows. Any regulation that does not defend the rights of the child in relation to the crime of sexual abuse legitimizes sexual abuse, ignoring the pressure that the child sometimes suffers from a relative, sometimes his family, ignores the physical right of children!

He told the child, neither before nor after the abuse, "no! It is my right to be protected from violence," he says. With such arrangements, girls are silenced and made open to the neglect, abuse and violence of adults under the name' marriage'!

It is a right for children to experience their sexual development in a healthy way. This right should not mean that children are ready to marry and the psychological and physical trauma that will come with it!

According to the article, the state is obliged to protect the child from abuse through practices such as prevention, detection, intervention, healing and remediation of harm, providing social support and punishing the perpetrators. 

only NGO on the governor's Supreme Council for violence prevention. I care a lot about training in institutions. We also provide training on relations, "she said.

# "WE'RE THE ONLY ASSOCIATION WITH A LINE OF VIOLENCE"

"We don't have salaried people looking at our line of violence. They're all our own volunteer members. It seems so easy when you tell it, but it's not. You don't know what the other person is like. We approach him in the most calm way and help him," Dilek Üzümcüler underlined the words, "we have European Union projects and they have been concluded. I think it's all very important. We have reports for all of them. We have a project where 25 famous men talk about violence against women, and this project is very popular. We strive to be equal in terms of rights. We want a legal force on

paper, not a physical or physical force. The women come here in tears, but they come out laughing when they leave.

We are investigating the sources of the projects and grants we receive. We do a motivational Dinner 2 times a year. We have one-on-one conversations with women and listen to their problems. Everyone's equal here. The person who comes in here buys his own coffee, he doesn't have to serve it to anyone else. We also have members who are Trans individuals. Anyone can come to us with a pink ID. It doesn't matter if he's a sex worker or a Syrian. Anyone can come. Some of us are asking for representation. We're afraid that if we grow up, can be a discourse, we don't want to give harm to the Mor Salkım. So we are not thinking to give representation. We're the only association with a line of violence. As of 2012–2019 December, there are 7,215 women and 3,847 children supported by reaching the counseling center or violence hotline, whose lives directly affected. Immigrant refugees and men also call the hotline for information on violence against women.

Violence against women is increasing day by day despite the laws.
Unfortunately, in 2019 in Turkey, 474 female was murdered by their partners, husbands, relative or familiar men just because they are women. As a result of the findings of the Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association,

which carries out local, national and international studies in the fight against violence against women, it says "We Brake Violence" with taxi drivers.

As a result of interviews with women subjected to violence, who received service from the 24/7 violence hotline and counseling center, Mor Salkım Association found that women used taxis, especially at night, in case of escaping violence. In addition, it was determined that the taxi drivers were concerned about the lack of information about where to take and what to do when a woman who was exposed to violence gets on their vehicle in their posts with Mor Salkım and it was



decided to establish the project.

The aim is to inform taxi drivers about the legal processes and mechanisms in combating discrimination, gender and gender-based violence, violence against women and children. In case a woman who is subjected to violence gets into a taxi, she will be informed about the laws and the institutions to be directed.



In the project realized in cooperation with Bursa Chamber of Drivers and Automobile Drivers, preparing a manifesto and taking the manifesto at the stations received all trainings, having brochures in taxis, and spreading awareness with 7/24 violence line stickers on vehicles is aimed. The launch

of the "We Brake Violence" project which 500 taxi drivers affiliated to 21 taxi stations will struggle against discrimination and violence against women, -by the cooperation of Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association, Bursa Drivers and Automobile Tradesmen Chamber and the



support of Heinrich Böll, took place on Friday, March 6, 2020 at Almira Hotel. 



Songül Öden drew attention to violence against women, while most of the people were closed to their homes due to the corona virus. Everyone reminds each other to stay home from their social media accounts, but not all of us have the same chance. Homeless people, refugees, people who have to work, especially healthcare workers. Reminding that we need to maintain our social distance, I am the United Nations Population Fund Spokesperson ...

#### SHE ADRESSED TO WOMEN

I received an e-mail from the United Nations the day before and it became

necessary for me to shoot this video. 75 percent of women

who are subjected to violence are killed in their homes. Considering the fact that the majority is at home, we want to call women "You are not alone."

Unfortunately, the exposure of women to domestic violence increased during the days when we needed to be at home. Therefore, the house has ceased to be safe for women.

- The number of people have been reached us: 213 women and 27 men
- Among the available data, 40 of the women previously received services associated with the counseling center. In particular, they are the people who call with the panic of their spouses going out in prison with the counseling and execution bill on the process.
- 40% of women reached us with a panic about what to do about their husbands who are in prison
- 90% of those who reach the hotline are married, 80% have 2 children on average and are in the 18–45 age range.
- 75% of the men who reached the hotline call for their wives. Such meetings come in intensity after women who are subjected to violence have settled in shelters. However, this rate has increased in the corona process. In addition, the counselee and 2 men over 65 years of age have reached our line of violence with the condition of being exposed to domestic violence for their sister or neighbor
- Women mostly reached from: Bursa, Kocaeli, Aydın, Antalya, Adana,
   Gaziantep, Ankara, Balıkesir, Eskişehir, Diyarbakır, Urfa and İstanbul
- Ethnicity: citizens of the Republic of Turkey as well as Syria, in Indonesia, Afghanistan, Brazil (married in Turkey) immigrants with temporary resident Turkish citizens living in Germany
- Mypes of Subjected violence: Physical violence, psychological violence, sexual violence, isolation and imprisonment at home, digital / cyber violence
- Call times: Morning, noon and night time
- 50% of women requested to settle in shelters.
- In the relevant process, solidarity is provided with women's nongovernmental organizations in the provinces.
- During the process, we have collaborated with Bar, Associations in Bursa

and in different provinces, violence prevention and monitoring centers, pollice office, women local authorities and public health institutions. We will resume our cooperation during the following time periods

## İNFAZ YASASININ YÜRÜRLÜĞE GİRMESİ İLE BİRLİKTE, DEVLET KADINA YÖNELİK ŞİDDETLE MÜCADELE KONUSUNDA SORUMLULUKLARINI YERİNE GETİRMELİ VE ACİL TEDBİRLER ALMALIDIR!

Koronavirüs önlemleri kapsamında evde kalmanın kadınlar, çocuklar ve LGBTİ+'lar için yarattığı şiddet sarmalına bir de İnfaz Yasası ile salıverilen cinsel istismar ve kadına yönelik şiddet failleri eklendi. Devlet, kadına ve çocuğa yönelik şiddetin önlenmesi konusunda üzerine düşen sorumluluğu yerine getirmeli, başta kadınlar olmak üzere tüm kamuoyunu aldığı tedbirler konusunda acilen bilgilendirmelidir!

Kamuoyunda infaz paketi olarak bilinen "5275 sayılı Ceza ve Güvenlik Tedbirlerinin İnfazı Hakkında Kanun ile Bazı Kanunlarda Değişiklik Yapılmasına Dair Kanun" 15 Nisan 2020 tarihinde Resmi Gazete'de yayımlanarak yürürlüğe girmiştir. On binlerce siyasi mahpus, gazeteci, öğrenci, avukat, yerel yönetici ve siyasetçi infaz indirimi kapsamı dışında tutularak yalnızca bir kısım mahkûmun tahliye edilmesini sağlayan ve kalıcı ve eşitsiz bir infaz rejimi getiren bu yasa değişikliğinin amacının koronavirüs kapsamında kamu sağlığını korumaktan çok uzak olduğu açıktır. Kadınlar, çocuklar ve dezavantajlı gruplar lehine hiçbir tedbir almadan salt hapishane kapasitelerini azaltmak için yapılan tahliyeler ile kadın ve çocukların can güvenliği hiçe sayılmaktadır. Kadın örgütlerinin görüşü alınmadan hazırlanan taslak mart ayının ortalarında basına yansımış, cinsel dokunulmazlığa karşı suçların infaz sürelerinde kalıcı indirim yapılması üzerine kadın ve LGBTİ+ örgütleri tasarıya kuvvetle karşı çıkmıştı.[1] Bunun üzerine tasarıda değişikliğe gidilmiş ve cinsel dokunulmazlığa karşı suçlar infaz indiriminin kapsamı dışında bırakılarak tasarı Adalet Komisyonu'na gönderilmiştir. Tasarının Adalet Komisyonu'na gönderildiği gün, iktidar "cinsel suçların ve kadına şiddet suçlarının infaz indirimi kapsamında olmadığını" açıklamıştı.[2] Ancak, iktidar tarafından defalarca vurgulanan bu hususun gerçeği çarpıttığı zaman içinde netleşmiştir.

Paket kapsamında, bazı suçların infaz sürelerinde indirime giden kalıcı düzenlemelerin yanı sıra, koronavirüs salgını nedeniyle –siyasi mahkumlar hariç tutularak– mahkumların kapalı cezaevlerinden açık cezaevlerine geçişine ve açık cezaevlerinden de "izin" adı altında tahliyesine imkân veren geçici düzenlemeler de mevcuttur. Her ne kadar kadın örgütlerinin mücadelesi neticesinde cinsel dokunulmazlığa karşı suçlar bakımından kalıcı bir infaz indirimine gidilmemiş olsa da, iktidar tarafından iddia edilenin aksine, kadına yönelik şiddetin infaz indirimi kapsamında olmadığını söylemek mümkün değildir. Her şeyden önce, Türk Ceza Kanunu'nda "kadına yönelik şiddet" diye bir suç yoktur. Eğer ifade edilmek istenen fiziksel şiddet kasten yaralama ise, kasten yaralama suçu ve kadınların sıkça maruz bırakıldığı tehdit, hakaret, şantaj suçları kalıcı infaz indirimi kapsamındadır. Bu nedenle, kadına yönelik şiddet suçunun infaz indirimi kapsamında olmadığı söylemi gerçeği yansıtmamaktadır.

Koronavirüs salgını nedeniyle getirildiği ifade edilen ve af sonucunu doğurma tehlikesi olan geçici düzenlemeler çok daha kaygı vericidir. Değişiklikler uyarınca, halihazırda cezalarını açık cezaevlerinde çekmekte olan siyasi hükümlüler hariç tüm mahkumlar 31 Mayıs 2020'ye kadar izinli sayılacak, bu izin gerekli olması halinde 31 Kasım 2020'ye kadar uzatılabilecektir. Bir başka deyişle, cinsel dokunulmazlığa karşı suçlar, kadına yönelik fiziksel şiddet, kadın cinayetleri ya da cinayete teşebbüsten hüküm giymiş olanlar da dahil olmak üzere halihazırda açık cezaevinde olan tüm mahkumlar salıverilecektir. Tasarıya Komisyon aşamasında eklenen bir madde ile açık cezaevinden salınması planlanan hükümlülerin sayısını artırmak için, halihazırda kapalı cezaevlerinde cezalarını çekmekte olan hükümlülerin de açık cezaevlerine geçiş süresi oldukça azaltılmıştır. Buna göre yalnızca birkaç ay kapalı cezaevinde kalmış olan bir hükümlü, getirilen kalıcı infaz indirim sürelerinden de yararlanarak, doğrudan dışarı çıkabilir hale gelmektedir. Her ne kadar, bu salıvermeler bir "izin" şeklinde düzenlenmişse de, izinden dönmemenin bir cezai yaptırımının olmadığı ve "iznin" 7 ay gibi uzun bir süre boyunca uzatılabileceği göz önüne alındığında bunun tümden bir salıvermeye dönüşme riski bulunmaktadır.

Koronavirüs nedeniyle "izin" adı altında cinsel saldırı, çocuğun cinsel istismarı ve kadına yönelik şiddet suçlarının faili olan binlerce erkeğin, şiddete maruz kalan kadın, çocuklar ve cinsiyet kimliği ve yönelimi nedeniyle ayrımcılığa maruz bırakılan gruplar açısından hiçbir önleyici koruyucu tedbir alınmadan dışarıya salınması, faillerin kadın ve çocuklara musallat olması, kadın ve çocuklar başta olmak üzere tüm dezavantajlı grupların hayatlarının tehlikeye girmesi anlamına gelmektedir. Yapılan çalışmalar kadınların en çok ev içinde şiddet gördüklerini ortaya koymaktadır. Salgın sebebiyle evde kalınan günlerde şiddete maruz bırakılan kadın, çocuk ve tüm dezavantajlı gruplar için evde 7/24 faillerle birlikte olmak, şiddet riskini arttırmaktadır. Dahası, 30 Mart 2020 tarihinde yayınlanan HSK kararıyla, hakimlere "6284 Sayılı Kanun kapsamında verilen tedbir kararlarının yükümlülerin koronavirüs kapsamında sağlığını tehdit etmeyecek şekilde değerlendirilmesi" talimatı verilmiştir. Bu talimat, şiddet uygulayan faillere hakkında evden uzaklaştırma kararı verilmemesi ya da kadınların sığınaklara yerleştirilmemesi riskini doğurmaktadır. Karantina günlerinde kadınların başvurabilecekleri mekanizmaların sınırlandırılmasıyla kadınların ev içi şiddetten uzaklaşmasının zorlaştırıldığı ve cezaevlerinden binlerce şiddet ve istismar failinin tahliye edileceği koşullar altında, devletin hala kadınlar ve çocukların korunması için alması gereken önlemlere ilişkin acil eylem planının bulunmaması karşısında olağanüstü kaygılıyız. Tüm bu riskler ortadayken, hiçbir sistematik koruma planı oluşturulmadan binlerce şiddet failinin salıverileceği bir dönemde kadınların koruma tedbirlerinin de ellerinden alınması, kadınların can güvenliğini hiçe saymak anlamına gelmektedir.

Tüm bu gelişmeler çerçevesinde, aşağıda imzası bulunan örgütler olarak, Devletin kadına ve çocuğa yönelik şiddetin önlenmesi konusunda yükümlülüğü olduğunu bir kez daha hatırlatıyor, salgının yarattığı özellikli durumları da göz önüne alarak, Aile, Çalışma ve Sosyal Hizmetler Bakanlığı başta olmak üzere tüm ilgili kurum ve kuruluşları, kadına yönelik şiddetle ilgili aşağıdaki acil eylem planını oluşturmaya ve ivedilikle aşağıdaki tedbirleri almaya çağırıyoruz:

- 1- İnfaz yasası ile salıverilecek kadına yönelik şiddet ve cinsel istismar failleri konusunda İstanbul Sözleşmesi'nin 56. Maddesi uyarınca kadınların ve toplumsal cinsiyet temelli şiddete maruz bırakılan tüm diğer bireylerin bilgilendirilmesi yükümlülüğü polis, jandarma, bekçi muhtar vb. her türlü yolla yerine getirilmeli, güvenlik riski bildiren kadınlar yasal hakları konusunda bilgilendirilmeli ihtiyaç duydukları desteklere acilen ulaştırılmalıdır.
- 2- İnfaz yasası ile salıverilecek kadına yönelik şiddet ve cinsel istismar faillerinin sistematik olarak etkin bir şekilde takibi yapılmalı, koronavirüs nedeniyle faillere verilen "iznin" bir "tahliye" anlamına gelmemesi için fail üzerinde denetim tedbirleri uygulanmalıdır.
- 3- Tarafı olduğu İstanbul Sözleşmesi uyarınca, Devlet, her türlü olağanüstü halde dahi kadına yönelik şiddetle mücadelede pozitif yükümlülük sahibidir. 6284 sayılı Kanun, hiçbir ihmale veya keyfiyete yer bırakmaksızın, salgın süresince de kadın ve çocuklar öncelik alınarak ivedi ve etkin bir şekilde uygulanmalıdır. Tedbir kararları, salgının yarattığı özel koşullar dikkate alınarak kadınların ve çocukların korunması yükümlülüğüne uygun bir şekilde verilmeli, tedbir kararlarını yerine getirmeyenler hakkında cezai işlem uygulanmalıdır.
- 4- Salgın döneminde kadın ve çocuklar başta olmak üzere tüm dezavantajlı grupların şiddet görme tehlikesinin önlenmesi ve şiddetten uzaklaşabilmeleri için vakit kaybetmeden bir Acil Eylem Planı açıklanmalı ve bu bilgilere erişimin kolayca sağlanması için kamu spotu aracılığıyla bilgilendirme yapılmalıdır.
- 5- Salgın döneminde sığınak ve acil barınma ihtiyaçlarının karşılanabilmesi amacıyla sığınak olarak kullanılabilecek mekân ve alanların sayısı ve kapasitesi acilen artırılmalı, sığınaklarda gerekli sağlık tedbirleri en sıkı şekilde uygulanmalıdır.
- 6- Salgın koşullarında kadınların hastane ve karakollara erişmekte yaşadığı güçlük ve kaygılar göz önüne alındığında, Devletin İstanbul Sözleşmesi'nin 25. Maddesi gereğince oluşturmakla yükümlü olduğu cinsel şiddet kriz merkezleri önemi bir kez daha ortaya çıkmaktadır. Bu çerçevede, cinsel şiddet kriz merkezlerinin kurulması için gerekli adımlar ivedilikle atılmalıdır.
- 7- Alo 183 veya kadına yönelik şiddet için acilen kurulacak başka bir hat, sadece toplumsal cinsiyet temelli şiddet özelinde 7/24 erişilebilir ve çok dilli bir Acil Yardım Hattı olarak çalışmalı, kadınlara sosyal, psikolojik ve hukuki destek verilmesi sağlanmalıdır.



## TCK 103 Kadın Platformu Kurucusu 215 Kadın Örgütünden Çağrı: Çocuk İstismarı Faillerine Yönelik Af Girişimlerine Son Verilsin

Çocuk cinsel istismarını düzenleyen Türk Ceza Yasası'nın (TCK) 103. maddesi ile ilgili af girişimlerini kaygıyla izliyoruz, 2016 yılından beri gündemde tutulan ve en son 15 Nisan 2020 tarihli İnfaz Yasası'nın TBMM görüşmeleri sırasında tekrar gündeme getirilen TCK 103 affı, kadın örgütlerinin ve kamuoyunun tepkisi sayesinde yasaya eklenememiş olsa da kimi iktidar partilerinden siyasetçi ve milletvekillerinin bu affın 15 Temmuz 2020 öncesinde mutlaka çıkartılacağı yönündeki beyanları kaygılarımızı artırıyor.

Kamuoyuna yansıyan son af teklifi taslağına göre;

✓ Çocuklara yönelik cinsel istismar/tecavüz nedeniyle yargılanıp mahkûm edilmiş ve cezası kesinleşmiş olanlar ✓ Olay tarihinde başka bir kadınla evli değiller ise ✓ Mağdur 14 yaşına basmış ise (yani 13 yaşında ise) ✓ Mağdur ile tecavüz faili arasında en fazla 15 yaş fark varsa ✓ Mağdur şikâyetten vazgeçmiş ✓ Yasanın çıktığı tarihten önce resmi nikah yapılmış ise;

çocuk istismarcısı derhal serbest bırakılacak ve bu evlilik beş yıl sürdüğü takdirde hiçbir şekilde cezalandırılmayacaktır. Bu af teklifi, hem çocuk istismarcılarının/tecavüzcülerin cezasını çekmeden serbest bırakılması; hem de onların bu tecavüzlerini beş yıl daha sürdürerek "ödüllendirilmeleri" anlamına gelmektedir. Üstelik bu af çocuk cinsel istismarına/tecavüze iştirak edenleri, azmettirenleri, suçun işlenmesine yardım ve yataklık edenleri de kapsayacak ve bunlar hakkındaki tüm kamu davaları da düşecektir.

Bu konudaki en önemli ve olası tehlike ise; Anayasa Mahkemesi'nin, evlilik tarihi, mağdurun yaşı, taraflar arasındaki yaş farkı, olay tarihinde evli olmamak gibi koşulları iptal etmesidir. Bu durumda, "geçici" olduğu iddia edilen af, birdenbire tüm kız çocuklarını ve kadınları her yaştan tecavüz faili ile evlendirilme baskısı altında bırakacak genel bir uygulamaya dönüşecektir.

Af girişimlerini gündemde tutmak, "evlilik" adı altında 15 yaş altındaki çocukların cinsel istismarını ve tecavüzü, toplum ve yargı nezdinde meşrulaştırma girişimidir.

Oysa, Türkiye kamuoyunun hangi siyasi görüşten olursa olsun çocuk istismarına ve çocuk yaşta, erken ve/veya zorla evliliklere karşı olduğunu biliyoruz. Örneğin; Havle Kadın Derneği'nin bu yıl yaptığı Erken Yaşta Evlilik Araştırması'na göre, kamuoyunda yaratılmaya çalışılan algının aksine toplumun tüm kesimleri çocuk yaşta evliliğe karşıdır. Araştırmaya göre, toplumun büyük bölümü ideal evlilik yaşını kadınlar için 24, erkekler için 26 olarak görürken; "Kızınızı 18 yaşından önce evlendirir misiniz?" sorusuna yüzde 91,8 "Hayır" diyor. Evlenme yaşı, 9 olabilir diyenlerin oranı ise sadece yüzde 0,7.

Çocuk ve Kadınlara Yönelik Şiddet Hareketleriyle Töre ve Namus Cinayetlerinin Önlenmesi İçin Alınacak Tedbirlere ilişkin 2006/17 sayılı 4 Temmuz 2006 tarihli Genelge acilen uygulamaya geçirilmelidir.

Tüm bakanlıkların, Meclis'teki muhalefet partilerinin, kadın, çocuk ve hak temelli çalışan tüm örgütlerin, akademinin ve ilgili meslek örgütlerinin katılımı ile beş yıllık bir Çocuk Yaşta, Erken ve/veya Zorla Evliliklerle Mücadele Strateji Belgesi ve Eylem Planı çıkartılmalı; daha önce çıkartılan planlar uygulanmalı, ilgili tüm kamu kurumlarının bu planların hayata geçirilmesi konusunda yeterli bütçe ve insan kaynağı tahsis etmesi sağlanmalıdır.

Çocukların ve özellikle de kız çocuklarının erken yaşta evlendirilmesi, hemen ve çok sayıda çocuk doğurmalarının teşvik edilmesi, uzun yıllardır bir devlet politikası haline gelmiştir. 4+4+4 parçalı eğitim uygulamasına geçiş, çocuk doğar doğmaz açtırılan çeyiz hesapları, kadının kariyeri anneliğidir vb. söylem ve girişimler, bu politikanın somut ifadeleridir. Oysa, af dahil bütün bu girişim ve söylemler hem Türkiye'nin taraf olduğu çocuk hakları ve kadın hakları ile ilqili uluslararası insan hakları sözleşmelerine hem de Anayasa'ya aykırıdır.

#### Herkesi çocukların hayatını karartacak bu insan ve çocuk hakları ihlalini durdurmaya çağırıyoruz!

"Genç evlilik/akran evliliği" gibi adlar altında çocuk cinsel istismarcılarına, tecavüzcülere af isteyenlerin girişimlerini kaygıyla izliyoruz. Boşanan kadının nafaka hakkına itiraz edenlerin; çocukların velayeti, yasal mal rejimi, kadının boşanma ve miras hakkına, kadını şiddetten koruyan 6284 Sayılı Yasa ve İstanbul Sözleşmesi'ne karşı kampanya yürütenlerin de aynı kadın düşmanı zihniyetin savunucuları olduğunu biliyoruz.

Tüm devlet otoritelerini ve siyasetçileri, çocuk istismarını aklayacak, cinsel saldırıya uğrayan kadınları "namus" bahanesiyle tecavüz faili ile evlendirme gibi insanlık dışı bir uygulamaya mahkûm etmeye çalışmaktan vazgeçmeye çağırıyoruz.

Herkesi kadınların ve çocukların kazanılmış haklarına saygı duymaya, bu hakları kâğıt üzerindeki kelime yığınları olmaktan çıkarıp hayatlarımızın ve toplumsal bilincimizin ve varoluşumuzun bir parçası kılmak için çalışmaya, kız çocuklarına/kadınlara evliliğin tek seçenek olarak gösterilmesinin neden olduğu bu hak ihlali ve kötü muameleye dur demeye, çocuk yaşta, erken ve/veya zorla evlilikler ile mücadeleyi devletin en önemli politikalarından biri yapmak için mücadele etmeye davet ediyoruz.

#### Çocukların Evlendirilmesi Suçtur.

Çocukların yaşama, oyun oynama, eğitim alma, sağlıklı yetişme, iş ve meslek sahibi olma, kendini geliştirme, özgür hareket etme, geleceği üzerinde söz sahibi olma ve korunma haklarını ortadan kaldırmaya yönelik tüm girişimler derhal durdurulmalıdır!

## TCK 103 Kadın Platformu Kurucusu 215 Kadın Örgütünden Çağrı: Çocuk İstismarı Faillerine Yönelik Af Girişimlerine Son Verilsin

Cinsel istismara evlilik affi" konusunun gündeme getirildiği 2016 yılından beri cinsel istismar davalarında "mağdur şikâyetinden vazgeçti", "birbirlerini seviyorlar", "ailelerin rızası var", "evlendiler", "mahkûm edersek aile yapısı zarar görecek", "bu durum bazı etnik gruplarda saygı duyulması gereken kültürel bir pratik" gibi gerekçelerle beraat kararları artmıştı. Nitekim son olarak, Elbistan Ağır Ceza Mahkemesi, kendisinden 9 yaş küçük oları 12 yaşındaki kuzenini evlilik görüntüsü altında istismar eden ve olay gerçekleştiğinde kız çocuğunun yaşını bilmediğini savunan faili beraat ettirmiş, Yargıtay da oy çokluğuyla bu kararı onamıştır. Af söylentisinin gündemde tutulması bile; devam eden davalarda beraat kararlarının verilmesine neden olmakta, kadın ve kız çocuklarının aleyhine işleyen fiili bir hukuk sistemi yaratılmaktadır. Dahası, birçok istismar olayının üzeri yargıya bile taşınmadan, istismar faili ile aile arasında gerçekleşen evlilik pazarlıkları ile örtülmektedir.

Kız çocuklarının bedensel, zihinsel ve psiko-sosyal bakımdan daha kendi gelişimini tamamlayamadan hamile bırakılıp çocuk doğurmaya mecbur edilmesi, evliliğe sürüklenmesi, hem onların ve doğuracakları çocukların hayatını hem de toplumun geleceğini tehlikeye atmaktadır. Çocuk yaşta evlilikler kız çocuklarını yaşam boyu süren ciddi sağlık sorunları ile baş başa bırakmaktadır. Hem kız çocuğunun hem de doğacak bebeğinin ölüm riski yetişkin bir kadına göre iki ila beş kat fazladır. Ölü doğum, erken doğum, annede kemik gelişiminin durması gibi geri dönülemez bedensel sakatlanmalar, anne karnındaki bebeğin yeterli beslenememesi, güç doğum, üreme organı yırtıkları, ağır kanamalar, fistüller, kansızlık, idrar ve dışkı kaçırma gibi pek çok sağlık sorununa neden olmaktadır. Cinsel istismarın neden olduğu duygu durum değişiklikleri intihar eğilimini ve şiddette uğrama riskini artırmakta, zihinsel ve ruhsal sorunları tetiklemektedir.

#### Devlete ve tüm ilgililere sorumluluklarını hatırlatıyoruz.


Dünyadaki pek çok devlet, çocukların cinsel İstismarı ile mücadele ederken; birçok ülkede çocuk yaşta, erken ve/veya zorla evlendirmeler yasaklanırken ve asgari evlilik yaşı yükseltilirken, çocuklarla cinsel ilişki ve evlilik yaşı konusunda Türkiye'de çocuk istismarına af ve cezasızlık kapısı açan girişimler son derece vahimdir. Çocukları cinsel istismardan korumak için:

- ✓ Devletin asli ve öncelikli görevi, çocukların cinsel istismara maruz kaldığı şartları ortadan kaldırmak, koruyucu ve önleyici hizmetleri kurumsallaştırmaktır. İstismar faillerini ve onlara yardım ve yataklık edenleri affetmek/cezasız bırakmak, bu suçların teşvik edilmesi demektir; başka çocukların istismarına zemin hazırlamaktır. Devlet faillere affi değil, çocukları cinsel istismardan koruyacak önlemleri hayata geçirmelidir.
- ✓ Çocuk yaşta, erken ve/veya zorla evlendirmeleri ve çocuk istismarını önlemesi gereken ama bunu yapmayan; aksine teşvik eden, kolaylaştıran ya da göz yuman tüm sorumlular cezalandırılmalı, kamu görevlileri ise görevlerinden alınmalıdır. Evlenme ehliyeti olmayan çocuklara dini nikah kıyan din görevlileri, çocuklarını çocuk yaşta evlendiren aileler ve ihbar yükümlülüğünü yerine getirmeyerek buna göz yuman kişiler ve resmi otoriteler özellikle cezalandırılmalıdır.

Çocuk Cinsel İstismarı Faillerine Yönelik Af Girişimlerinden İstanbul Sözleşmesi'ni ve 6284 sayılı Şiddet Yasasını Karalamaktan Kadınların Kazanılmış Haklarını Tehdit Etmekten VAZGECİN!

Kadın örgütleri olarak çocuk cinsel istismarı suçunu düzenleyen Türk Ceza Kanunu'nun (TCK) 103. maddesi ile ilgili af girişimlerini kaygı ile izliyoruz.

Bu konu, İnfaz Yasası Nisan ayında TBMM'de görüşülürken de gündeme gelmişti, muhalefet partilerinin kabul etmemesi ve kadın hareketinin tepkileri üzerine bu girişim ertelenmişti.

Ancak AK Parti Grup Başkan Vekili Tokat Milletvekili Av. Özlem Zengin, 18 Nisan 2020 günü CNN Türk Televizyonu'nda katıldığı bir programda "Evlilik yaşı 14'e mi çekiliyor?' diye tartışmalar var. Yaklaşık 300 genç insan var, bunlar zamanında erken yaşta evlenmişler ama şimdi evlilik yaşındalar ve bu genç insanların yaklaşık 500 evladı var. Bu konuyu Meclis'te ortaklaşarak yapmak lazım' diyerek siyasi iktidarın TCK 103 için af ve boşanan kadının nafakasının süreli hale getirilmesi konusunda hazırlıkları olduğunu anlatmıştır.

Hemen ardından, Ak Parti MKYK üyesi ve Van Milletvekili Osman Nuri Gülaçar 27 Nisan 2020 günü sosyal medyada yaptığı paylaşımda bu konunun bayramdan sonra ilk TBMM Genel Kurul çalışmalarında gündeme getirileceğini açıklamıştır.

Sayın Özlem Zengin, 24 Haziran 2020'de TBMM'de yaptığı bir konuşmada kadınlarla ilgili olarak "Alt komisyon raporu tamamlandı, birkaç gün sonra açıklayacağız" demiş; ancak hangi konuda, hangi raporun hazırlandığına dair hiçbir bilgi vermemiştir. 2 Temmuz günü AK Parti Genel Başkan Vekili, İstanbul Milletvekili Numan Kurtulmuş ise, "Nasıl usulü yerine getirerek bu sözleşme imzalanmışsa, aynı şekilde usulü de yerine getirilerek bu sözleşmeden çıkılır" diyerek AK Parti olarak Türkiye'nin İstanbul Sözleşmesi'nden çıkması yönünde hazırlıkları olduğunu açıklamıştır.



## Kadına Karşı Şiddetle İlgili İstanbul Sözleşmesi'ne Karşı Çıkmak Şiddetçi Erkeklere Teşvik, Tüm Kadınlara Tehdittir

Özellikle TBMM Boşanma Komisyonu Raporu'ndan beri İstanbul Sözleşmesi ve 6284 sayılı yasaya karsı sistematik bir karalama kampanyası yürütülmektedir. Birkaç marjinal grup tarafından yürütülmesine rağmen, Türkiye'de bu kampanya nedeniyle ne İstanbul Sözleşmesi, ne de 6284 sayılı yasa etkili bir biçimde uygulanmaktadır. Numan Kurtulmuş'un son açıklaması da taraf olan ülke sayısının her geçen gün arttığı şiddete karşı bu çok önemli sözleşmeyi ve yasayı uygulamamak için zaten direnmekte olan tüm kamu görevlilerine, yeni ve güncel "talimat" niteliği tasımaktadır. Bu gibi açıklamaların, şiddet uygulayan erkekleri teşvik etmek; şiddete maruz kalan birçok kadının devlet mekanizmalarına başvurma cesaretlerini kırmak gibi olumsuz sonuçları olacaktır.

TCK 103 Çocuk Cinsel İstismarı Affına Karşı Kadın Platformu'nu oluşturan 237 kadın örgütü olarak;

- Kadınlara ve kız çocuklarına yönelik fiziksel, cinsel, psikolojik ve ekonomik şiddet ile ayrımcılığı körükleyen bu söylemlerinize son verin;
- İstanbul Sözleşmesi ve 6284 sayılı yasayı uygulayın;
- Çocuk istismarcılarına af çıkarmak, adındaki İstanbul kelimesi kadar "yerli ve milli ama bir o kadar da evrensel" bir sözleşmeden Türkiye'nin imzasını çekmek gibi; kadına karşı şiddetle mücadeleden vazgeçildiğinin ilanı anlamına gelecek, toplum vicdanını yaralayacak çılgın projelerden derhal vazgeçin

diyoruz.

Kadınlar ve çocuklarla ilgili konuların toplumsal ve siyasal tarafı, kadınların ve çocukların hakları için yıllardır mücadele eden kadın örgütleridir. Kadın örgütleri, birlikte kararlaştırılmayan, kadın haklarında gerileme anlamına gelecek her bir adıma sonuna kadar karşı çıkacaktır.

## Çocuk İstismarcılarına Af Girişimlerinin Gündemde Tutulması İstismarcılara Teşvik, Tüm Çocuklara Tehdittir

Kulislere yansıdığı kadarıyla çocuk istismarcılarına af girişimi TBMM'nin Ekim ayında başlayacak yeni yasama dönemine bırakılmıştır. Ancak 2016'da bu maddeye ilişkin değişiklik önerisi Meclis gündemine bir gece yarısı getirildiği için, TBMM'nin açık olduğu 15 Temmuz 2020 tarihine kadar bizlerin tedirginliği sürecek.

Ancak bu af girişimi ertelenmekle kalmamalı; bir daha asla gündeme gelmemek üzere siyasetin, kamuoyunun ve meclisin gündeminden tamamen çıkartılmalıdır.

Cünkü bu af söylentisi olduğu sürece;

- TCK'daki 15 yaş altı çocuklarla hiçbir koşulda cinsel ilişkiye girilemeyeceği ve Türk Medeni Kanunu'nda 17 yaşın altında evlilik yapılamayacağı konusundaki yasal düzenlemeler kağıt üzerinde kalıyor, uygulanmıyor, uygulanamıyor. Gençler, aileler bu yasalar yokmuş gibi yaşamaya devam ediyor.
- Çocuk cinsel istismarcıları sıfır yaşından başlayarak kız çocuklarının cinsel istismarı ve cinsel sömürüsü konusunda kendilerini özgür hissediyor. İşledikleri suçtan mahkum olsalar bile, kız çocuğunu ya da ailesini ikna edip resmi nikah yaptırmayı ve çıkacak bir af ile o kız çocuğuna beş yıl süreyle tecavüze devam etmeyi düşünebiliyorlar.
- Yargı mensupları da bu gündemden etkileniyor; sadece ailelerin "Onlar birbirini seviyor, evlendireceğiz" benzeri beyanlarına dayanarak 12-13 yaşındaki kız çocuklarının cinsel istismarı davalarında bile beraat kararları verilebiliyorlar.
- Kamuoyu algısı üzerinde oluşturulan etki sonucu, çocuk cinsel istismarı, çocuk yaşta evlendirmeler konusundan ya da "düğün adı altındaki tecavüz törenleri"nden haberdar ya da bunlara tanık olanların ihbar etmesinin önüne geçilmiş oluyor.
- Çocuk yaşta evlendirmelerin devam etmesine, çeşitli kişi ve kurumların, kız çocuklarının evlendirilme yaşının 12 hatta 9 olabileceği yönündeki propagandalarının sürüp gitmesine neden oluyor. Böylece yürürlükteki Türk Ceza Kanunu ve Türk Medeni Kanunu parça parça yürürlükten kalkıyor; kadınların ve kız çocuklarının aleyhine işleyen fiili bir hukuk sistemi yaratılıyor.

Bu nedenle, çocuk cinsel istismarcılarına af girişimlerini ertelemenizi değil; bu niyetinizden derhal ve tamamen vazgeçmenizi ve bunu kamuoyuna ilan etmenizi bekliyoruz.

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

The project implemented in Turkey for the first time in Bursa Chamber of Pharmacists realized in the

program; In addition to Bursa Pharmacist Chamber President Okan Şahin and Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association President Dilek Üzümcüler; Board members attended.

"Violence increased in the pandemic"

Speaking at the event, Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association President



Dilek Üzümcüler drew attention the fact to violence that against women is increasing day by day despite laws. the association, which keeps data on women and children receiving

service from the counseling center and violence hotline every year, increased those who reached the line of violence by 90% with the start of the Covid-19 epidemic process. The violence against women in Turkey and in the world has increased rapidly during pandemic. In addition, 40 women lost their lives in this process in Turkey. According to the data of Istanbul Police Department, violence increased by 38%. unfortunately, is the most unsafe place for women and 75% of women in the domestic context of violence against women in the home lost their lives in Turkey. Stating that this process has an important role in the prevention of violence that individuals who have been exposed to

violence or witnessed violence have information about the mechanisms they can reach, Üzümcüler said, "As a result of the interviews of women who are subjected to violence, who receive service from Mor Salkım Association's 24/7 violence line and counseling center, we have ralized that if they want to get rid of the violence, they can easily reach to with our precious pharmacist



thanks to this project. She also added that they have signed a cooperation protocol with Bursa Chamber of Pharmacists ".

Saying that their aim is to provide information about the legal processes and mechanisms in combating violence against women and children through pharmacists, President Üzümcüler said, "With our project, a woman who is exposed to violence will be informed about the laws and the institutions to be directed with the information materials that will be obtained from pharmacies. In the project realized in cooperation with Bursa Chamber of Pharmacists, it is aimed to make a difference with the availability of brochures in pharmacies and the spread of 24/7 violence hotline".

"Awareness Will Be Raised During Pandemic Process"

Speaking at the event, Bursa Chamber of Pharmacists Chairman Okan Şahin said, "In addition to the social responsibility activities we do periodically, we are launching an important project today. "It will be solved together by solidarity in the fight against violence against women, which is a bleeding wound on the basis of gender inequality."

We are struggling for years in the field of violence against women Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association, working with us on projects implemented for the first time in Turkey, Bursa Chamber of Pharmacists management and

support they are giving thanks to pharmacies.



## The 23rd Women's Shelters Congress started on 7 November

The 23rd of Women's Shelters and Counseling Centers Congress was held online on the Zoom platform on 7–8–9–10 November.

Congress, the largest platform for women in Turkey fighting against male violence against women, was held online through the Zoom platform with the participation of women from women's organizations, local governments, public institutions and organizations.

The congress was held this year under the title of Violence in Pandemic, Care Labor and Equality Struggle, on 7–8–9–10 November.

### First Day

The first of the sessions held on the first day of the congress was held with the title Pandemic, Domestic Labor and Gender Social Policies.

In this session, Melda Yaman made a presentation with the title of "Pandemic, Impoverishment and Violence", Zehra Keleş "Social Policy, State and Family" and Yasemin Dildar with the title of "Pandemic and Domestic Labor".

## Second and Third Days

The second session of the Congress was held with the title of Refugees in the Context of Applications, Campaign Centers and Struggle Strategies in the Context of the Istanbul Convention.

In this session, Berfu Şeker from the Association for Women's Human Rights and New Solutions made a presentation titled "Istanbul Convention as a Tool of Struggle". In the forum organized after the presentations that titled Shelters in the Context of Applications, Solidarity Centers made by Zuhal Güreli from Mor Çatı, the components of the congress and the women working in the field were shared about the problems they encountered and the solutions they developed against them. The second day of the conference continued with workshops.

On the last day, the workshop results were shared and the outline of Congress Final Declaration was prepared.

Final declaration on 25 November

Discussions were held in which knowledge and experiences were shared through the papers to be presented on the first day of the congress and the workshops held on the second day.

The Congress, which lasted for 3 days, ended with the preparation of the Congress Conclusion Declaration. The final declaration of the congress will be shared with press members on 25 November.

#### **About the Congress**

The Women's Shelters and Counseling Centers Congress is a platform created to share ex periences in the field of combating violence against women, to determine common policies, and to establish a permanent communication network between organizations and institutions.



The first was held in Istanbul,1998 under the name of "Women's Shelters I. Congress" in the context of the "End of International Violence Against Women" day on November 25, with the call of the Purple Roof Women's Shelter Foundation to women fighting violence against women.

In the 5th Congress held in 2002, it was named "Women's Shelters and Solidarity Centers Congress". The Congress, which changed its content and discussion methods according to changing needs over the years, continues to

be organized in a different city every year since 1998.

Congress, from the date of start to be organized, preventing the violence against women, organized with the awareness that it is only possible with a continuous and organized struggle, Turkey Women's one of the movement's most extensive platform of struggle against male violence and is a strong advocate of feminist principles and methods in this struggle.

It provides the opportunity to share the experiences accumulated in the fight against male violence, to find solutions to the difficulties encountered in the solidarity center and shelter work, to get to know each other and to cooperate with women working in public institutions, municipalities, women's organizations and making policies.





### **BURSA WAS AN EXAMPLE TO TURKEY**

Speaking at the event, Dilek Üzümcüler, president of the Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association, noted that violence against women is increasing day by day despite the laws. According to the data reflected only in the news as of the end of October 2020, 229 women lost their lives by men with spouses, lovers and relatives due to their gender, Üzümcüler said, "As a result of meetings with women who received services from the 24/7 violence line and counseling center of the Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association, it was determined that women use taxis especially at night in case of walking away from the violent environment. In addition, it was determined that taxi drivers were concerned that there were lack of information about where to take



them and what they could do when a woman who had been subjected to violence got into their vehicles, and therefore it was decided to create the project.". Üzümcüler said that there is demand in many provinces of Turkey and that their goal is to expand the project.

Board Member Burcu Üzümcüler, who informed about the project, gave a short film screening

created as a result of the project as well

as his presentation on the process of the 'Şiddeti Frenliyoruz'project. Shestated that, within the scope of the project, a total of 34 taxi ranks were reached with information, brochures, violent line published stickers in Bursa province, Bursa Chauffeurs



and Automakers Chamber of Trades, Mudanya Chauffeurs and Automakers Chamber of Trades and Osmangazi, Yıldırım, Nilüfer and Mudanya districts, the manifests of 'Şiddeti Frenliyoruz' were located in 18 stops, 1,390 drivers and 509 taxi

vehicles were applied face-to-face training/ stop visits, surveys in

Bursa province. She stated that they reached much more than the number of stops and drivers targeted in the project with the chamber and management support and thanked them for their cooperation.





### November 24th, 2020 23.CONCLUSIVE DECLARATION OF THE CONGRESS ON WOMEN'S REFUGES AND SOLIDARITY CENTERS

We held the Women's Shelters and Solidarity Centers Congress which we organized for the 23rd



time this year online between 7–10 November under the conditions of the Covid–19 pandemic. We came together with 270 women, including women's organizations, LGBTI + organizations, independent feminists, participants working in municipalities and public institutions, from 27 different provinces to discuss the policies, practices and methods of combating male violence against women under the title of Violence in Pandemic, Care Labor and Equality Struggle.

We are going through a period of increasing attacks on our rights in the world and in Turkey, especially through the Istanbul Convention and the concept of gender equality. Despite such reckless and widespread discussion of misogynistic policies, our struggle for equality grows with solidarity on a national and global scale. Our similar experiences as women from all over the world, both in the face of attacks on our rights and in the inequality increased by the Covid-19 pandemic, strengthened our common struggle.

Since March, when the first Covid-19 case was announced in Turkey, we see that instead of combating gender inequality, the state takes non-gendered measures that further deepen the gender inequality. We have seen intensified housework and care work being left to the responsibility of women, and women working predominantly in the service sector or in the informal economy become unemployed.

The pandemic has led to an intensification of male violence and an increase in women's need for support. The problems that have always been experienced in the mechanisms of combating violence deepened in this period. As women's need for support increased, it became much more difficult for women to access social support and safety mechanisms. Sexist approaches to public services and social relations were reinforced. As we pointed out before as the constituent organizations of the Congress, an urgent action plan was needed. However, the Ministry did not consider the issue of combating violence against women under pandemic conditions as a priority issue by ignoring the demands of women's organizations.

While violence is fed by existing inequalities, the difficulties in combating violence have increased with the pandemic. During this period, we encountered bad practices and guidance in many applications we followed as women's organizations. We have witnessed that it has become difficult for women to establish a life free from male violence due to the services that are not provided on the pretext of the pandemic. Especially, we have seen that law enforcement officers do not fulfill their basic duties such as making Law No.6284 decisions, receiving complaints and sending them to the shelter, and misinforming women. The deepening of inequality and women's poverty has led to an increase in applications for economic and social support. Especially students or young women who lost their income had to return to their root families during the pandemic. These women were ignored by social services and could not receive support. Migrant, disabled, elderly and LGBTI + women who were exposed to multiple discrimination had to cope with different forms of violence together. The decline in combating violence against women continued, especially in local governments where trustees were appointed. In addition to the closure of independent women's organizations, the lack of women's counseling centers and shelters in municipalities became more evident during the pandemic period when existing mechanisms did not function well.

In this process, we have once again seen that in order to prevent male violence against women in ordinary and extraordinary periods, it is essential to implement stable policies and emergency measures / action plans based on the Istanbul Convention.

As the Council of Women's Shelters and Solidarity Centers, we share our common highlights/demands with the public. We will not give up our fight for equality for our rights and our lives.

- 1. Istanbul Convention and Law No. 6284 should be implemented effectively.
- 2. In times of crisis and disaster such as pandemics, earthquakes, all parties, especially the Ministry of Family, Labor and Social Services, should come together urgently and create an emergency action plan against male violence against women.
- 3. A 24/7 accessible phone line should be established only for women who are subjected to violence and supported by experts in the field of violence against women. The line should include staff who can do video calls and speak sign language to serve deaf women, and this line should be announced to women across the country.
- 4. In addition to phone application KADES, alternatives should be produced for emergencies from where women who do not have a smart phone are also taken care of, these alternatives should include not only Turkish but also many languages, and women should be able to access police support even if they do not have a phone through these alternatives.
- 5. Women who cannot use KADES application because they do not have a

phone or internet should be given free phone and internet support.

- 6. The number and capacity of shelters should be increased in order to meet the need for shelter unconditionally.
- 7. Existing shelters and solidarity centers should be brought in line with international standards and accessible / available to all women. Quality social support should be given to women.
- 8. In order to go to shelters, women should be able to get support from the units specialized in violence against women at the nearest social service institution. In the current situation, ŞÖNİMs should be able to accept. The obligation for women to go to the police station to apply for the shelter should be abolished. It should be shared by law enforcement officials that women who apply for emergency assistance and refrain from complaining about the perpetrator can benefit from Law No. 6284 without complaining.
- 9. Women over the age of 60 with unidentified, unregistered immigrants as well as women with boys over the age of 12 should be taken to a shelter with their children. Shelter conditions should be made suitable for women with disabilities, and the necessary regulations should be made in the legislation to allow disabled women to be taken into shelters instead of being directed to care centers. An empowering shelter policy which will include young women and women continuing their working life, and that will not detach women from their lives and social networks should be implemented.
- 10. Conditions that negatively affect the quality of support provided in shelters and solidarity centers should be eliminated. A sufficient number of staff and budget should be allocated, and it should be ensured that expert personnel supporting women provide this support with empowering feminist social work principles that are indispensable for combating violence against women.
- 111. Child work should be carried out in shelters considering the best benefits of the child.
- 12. It should be ensured that migrant and refugee women who are subjected to violence are supported by considering their conditions. Even if she is not registered, she should be supported regarding the violence she was subjected to. Interpreters should be provided when working with refugee and immigrant women in shelter and solidarity centers.
- 13. In case of crisis and disasters such as pandemics, earthquakes, suitable public buildings and private campuses should be put into use and station shelters where women can go through the quarantine process should be provided, alternative services such as allocating quotas in hotels should be considered and developed. Solutions should be developed to meet the shelter need that may arise under extraordinary conditions.
- 14. Opportunities for rapid testing and diagnosis should be provided to women subjected to violence in order to facilitate shelter admissions in epidemic conditions.
- 15. Trainings should be given to public officials and personnel working in the

field of male violence against women, systematically taking into account the needs of all women subjected to violence, inclusive, containing knowledge of different types of violence, in favor of women, with a gender equality perspective and considering the experience of women's organizations.

- 16. In combating violence against women, all central public institutions and local administrations should be in coordination with women's organizations, and it should be aimed to take into account the experience of women's organizations.
- 17. Every municipality should open women's solidarity centers and make these centers sustainable as a political priority.
- 18. Alawyer should be appointed by the Legal Aid offices of the bar associations without seeking a document and unconditionally for all women who are subjected to violence, who seek to benefit from their rights within the scope of Law No. 6284, and who apply for disputes concerning family law. Periodic training should be required for legal aid representatives on violence against women, gender equality and relevant legislation.
- 19. Union of Bar Associations of Turkey and Turkey Bar Association and the Women's Law Commission (TÜBAKKOM), under the Violence and its current international conventions against Women, as well as informative studies on the subject, active and applications needed by taking an active role in the removal of barriers to access to justice for women must implement.
- 20. For women who are subjected to violence to apply to law enforcement agencies, forensic interview rooms should be established in which women feel safe and comfortable, women should be informed about Law No. 6284, in cases where delay is inconvenient and in case of life risks, law enforcement officers should immediately issue the relevant protection order in accordance with Law No. 6284. The follow-up of preventive and protective measures given within the scope of Law No. 6284 should be done by law enforcement in accordance with the legal legislation
- 21. Sanctions should be imposed by monitoring violations of duty by law enforcement agencies such as providing false and dissuasive information to women arbitrarily, mistreatment and not receiving complaints.
- 22. Support for women (including sign language) should be given in their mother tongue.
- 23. Women should be able to access the support provided due to the violence they are subjected to without being subjected to any discrimination.
- 24. In order to keep women away from violence, social assistance for women should be increased within the scope of fighting against poverty. These aids should be diversified according to the unique needs of women and the situations that may arise from their differences.
- 25. Empowering mechanisms that recognize the needs of women and support them should be developed. In crisis situations such as a pandemic, support mechanisms should increase and continue to exist.

- 26. The application procedure for women to be able to benefit from all kinds of social and economic support should be easy and clear. They should be supported by the officials if needed during the application.
- 27. Free psychosocial and legal support should be provided to women subjected to violence by specialists working with a female perspective, and the number, capacity and number of employees of existing service units should be increased.
- 28. Women support centers, which were closed after the trusteeship practice was ended in local governments, should be opened again and urgently in accordance with their function, and the expert personnel dismissed in these municipalities should be re-employed and the fight against violence against women should be continued effectively.
- 29. The consequences that the epidemic increases the impact of violence against women and emerging support needs, women's poverty, women's workload and the need for care work should be accepted by all parties concerned.
- 30. Tools and institutions that will put an end to the full burden of care work on women and resolve the taking of care work from women through a comprehensive social policy should be established, and social policies should be developed to prevent the exploitation of women's domestic labor and the deepening of gender inequality
- 31. Baby and children's nurseries, day care services, short-term and / or continuous inpatient care services should be provided 24/7, free of charge and accessible, by taking necessary precautions under pandemic conditions.
- 32. Birth control methods and termination of unwanted pregnancies should be free and accessible. The actual abortion ban and all obstacles to women from having abortion must be removed. Access to medical abortion should be provided.
- 33. Social policies should be developed for the special needs of young women, and units such as youth centers / community centers where young women can get the support they want in issues such as employment, violence and social life should be opened, and existing structures should be restructured in a way that eliminates gender inequality.
- 34. Equal support mechanisms should be offered to all women who are subjected to violence without ignoring / subordinating / normalizing patriarchal violence from the root family by public officials.
- 35. It should be ensured that unmarried young women, in particular, benefit from sexual health services free of charge, without discrimination, by protecting their right to privacy, and facilitating access to information.
- 36. Necessary systemic infrastructures should be established for existing and new services to be established in the upcoming period to serve digitally and online. Programs and trainings should be carried out to increase the digital literacy of all women, and women should have access to digital tools and free





During the International Week Combating Violence Against Women, the inequalities of the pandemic period on women were discussed with representatives of associations working in this field

Mor Salkım Women's Solidarity Association: The Association, which works on combating violence and eliminating gender inequalities, has a line of violence that women can reach 24/7. In the process, it was shared information about the situation of violence against women.

How this process was carried out as an association and the projects carried out during this period as a project-oriented association were conveyed.

Görükle Kadın Derneği: The Association distributed how the association, which is working on women's solidarity, was affected by the pandemic process, what ways they



tried their practices, and methods for supporting each other in women's solidarity, especially during the period when women suffered violence and inequality.

Tog: Digital violence, especially affecting young people, has become widespread during this period when young women are affected by inequalities. Awareness studies on the prevention of violence and young people's awareness of the types of violence and digital violence were discussed. The trainings and collaborations of Mor Salkım, which has been going on for two years, were conveyed. Their views on the anti-violence centers being established in universities and the universities women's issues research centers were shared. What can be done to raise young people's awareness of the combat against violence and legal processes have been conveyed.

Women's Economic Platform: It is a platform that supports women's entrepreneurship, which works to ensure equality in women's working life and social life in order to achieve sustainable development. You know, as of November 25th, the 16-day process involves generations of solidarity to combat gender-based violence. The economic empowerment of women can be considered one of the steps in their lives in the fight against violence. Economically strengthened women are or can continue to suffer violence. As entrepreneur women, our

efforts to combat violence against women, especially during the pandemic period, a period that further increases the unemployment and current women's unemployment, and our efforts to prevent this situation and raise awareness have been conveyed to your precaution plan (policies). As entrepreneurial women, it was reported what measures were tried to be taken in domestic and business life about the inequalities experienced by women in the workplaces we work in or own during this period.

Within the scope of the 'Şiddete Maske Olma' project as part of the November 25, International Day for The Elimination of Violence Against Women, the

As the Women's Platform for Equal Equality EŞİK, of which we are a member, we say that it is not enough to enforce the penal laws to prevent violence against women.

It is required to implement comprehensive and

holism policies. Therefore, we invite all authorities to implement the 12 steps set by the Council of Europe for the implementation of #IstanbulConvention, the most comprehensive legal basis in this issue, and which we have adapted to Turkey as the EŞİK.

Systematic violence against women is torture, persecution. Don't watch, do your duty.



We are living in a serious crisis that has turned life upside down, including home closures, due to the COVID-19 pandemic all over the world and in Turkey. Women are among the highest payers of this crisis: women's poverty, chronic women's unemployment, increasing violence against women in all aspects of life...

We are discussing the 2021 budget in our country, where at least 3 women are killed every day and where the murders of women have come to a gendercide, but we do not see any policy of power and a budget dedicated to preventing violence against women.

As the Women's Platform for Equality, we have repeatedly called for a special session of the Parliament on the prevention of violence against women on November 25th, but we have not received any response to these calls. If parliament is not going to take violence against women as a subject even on November 25th, when will it take it?

As a matter of fact, the results of our monitoring work since the opening of the Assembly on October 1st are obvious:

Since October 1st, Turkish Parliament President Mustafa Şentop has NO statements, efforts, initiatives or even promises that have passed women, violence against women or the Istanbul Convention.

The period of mention of the murders of women and the Istanbul Convention at the General Assembly of the Parliament between 1–15 October: 57 seconds! From 16 October to 15 November;

- Only 9 of the 96 deputies who spoke at the General Assembly of the Parliament used the word 'woman'; Of the 54 law proposals, only 1 has fallen on women's share
- Of the 836 question proposals, only 8 were women-related
- There was no woman's name in the laws adopted
- Of the 27 parliamentary research motions, only 2 were for women
- Of the 90 press conferences held in parliament, only 3 addressed the problems experienced by women.

The government does not promulgate any effective policies to prevent violence against women. The government doesn't even set up a risk assessment/prevention unit to prevent the murders of women. Existing laws and conventions, especially the Violence Act No. 6284 and the Istanbul Convention, are not implemented. The government is talking about new judicial reforms to stall public opinion; but it doesn't even implement reforms made years ago.

For example, Article 96 of the Turkish Penal Code, which came into force on June 1, 2005, defines systematic violence against women as torture. Public officials do the persecution; anyone can do the torture. According to the Turkish Penal Code, this is the only difference between torture and persecution.

Women are subjected to years of systematic violence, whether within or outside the family (as victims of persistent stalking, as in the case of women being harassed and threatened over 1,570 separate phone), Article 96 of the

Turkish Penal Code is not enforced, and the attackers continue these acts of violence. Ministers responsible for implementing the laws are just condemning the perpetrators.

Due to the November 25, International Day for The Elimination Of Violence Against Women, we remind you once again;

- Systematic violence against women is torture, persecution.
- Torture and persecution are crimes against humanity.
- The state itself cannot persecution, but is also tasked with preventing citizens from torturing each other.

Article 96 of the Turkish Penal Code titled "Torture" is very clear: "A person who tortures a person is sentenced to two years to five years in prison." If it was his wife or family who tortured the woman, the sentence for this crime is from three years to eight years in prison. If it involves insults, threats, physical violence, rape during this torture, each act must also be punished.

The United Nations CEDAW Committee also says in General Recommendation 35, adopted on July 14, 2017, that "gender-based violence against women (including rape, domestic violence or harmful practices) may mean torture or cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment in certain circumstances.".

Despite Turkey made this a provision of the law 15 years ago, Article 96 of the Turkish Penal Code does not apply. We call on all authorities to effectively implement Article 96 of the Turkish Penal Code when it comes to systematic violence against women, including unilateral persistent stalking.

A safe life free from fear and violence is the right of all women.

It's not enough to enforce criminal laws to prevent violence against women. It is required to implement comprehensive and holism policies. Therefore, we invite all authorities to implement the 12 steps set by the Council of Europe for the implementation of the Istanbul Convention, the most comprehensive legal basis in this issue, and which we have adapted to Turkey as the EŞİK



Twelve of women's networks and platforms inside from 1000 women's organizations, including the Women's Platform for Equality, issued a declaration to pay attention to the discrimination,

violence, financial difficulties and human rights violations faced by women globally.

The 2020 Declaration of Women's Rights emerged as a result of the international hosted meeting by the Women's Platform for Equality on October 15, 2020.At the meeting, the participants discussed the attacks of right-wing groups and governments against the Istanbul Convention. This meeting, which brought together 170 women from 15 countries from Europe and North America, confirmed that the arguments put forward against the Convention in Istanbul different



countries are similar and that these arguments stem from misogynist, homophobic and transphobic patriarchal ideologies.

The 2020 Declaration of Women's Rights draws attention to the interrelated causes of women's human rights violations, emphasizing that these violations are aggravated by neoliberal policies, rising authoritarianism, climate change, militarism and the current COVID-19 outbreak. The Declaration demands that the political institutions and international organizations of each country need to take action to realize women's human rights and achieve gender equality.

With this Declaration, despite the narrowing the democratic space, we announce to the press and the public our determination to resist patriarchal violence, misinformation, and masculine rhetoric and attacks on our hardwon rights, and to build an equal, just and peaceful world by continuing transnational solidarity.




