Rural Area Development Programme (RADP), a non-Governmental organization established during 1994 has been involved in the local development, capacity building and community mobilization including implementation of projects related to water, sanitation health and hygiene for well-being of disadvantaged and poor people in different districts Nepal.

Coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic has unleashed a global health emergency and an exceptional financial crisis of historic magnitude. In this context, Rural Area Development Programme (RADP) and its sister organization Women Empowerment Against Poverty of Nepal (WEAPON) are non-profit organizations working in Tanahun district, Gandaki province, have also emphasized to respond to support the containment of virus as the first order priority. To combat the pandemic through measures such as supporting infected with distributing non-food items such as masks, sanitizer, water bottles and food items to affected families and individuals, as well as distributed school materials to Tamang and Chepang children, sanitary pad to women initiative of WEAPON.

For this the fund has been collected through the pockets of board of directors and staffs of organization as prime responsibility to support the response plan of local government. As such, the organization has coordinated with local government and other actors working in community.

Main Objective:

To support the Covid-19 affected family to contain diseases and reduce vulnerability through transmission of diseases to family/other community members.

Major Activities:

Following are the major activities during the program:

- Collected cash from RADP and WEAPON members of organization. Each contributed NPR 5,000.00 Rupees and collected some clothes and school materials and sanitary pads.
- Keep record of total fund collected is NPR 2,05,000.00.
- Coordinated with local government office/Vyas Municipality/Ward and local health offices for need assessment and identification of affected families.
- Finalized the list of families to distribute materials.
- Purchase of materials, verified and make vouchers.
- Altogether 158 individuals were distributed non-food items.
