- o The Universal Declaration of Human Rights **AND** Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples
- o The International Labor Organization's Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work
- o The Rio Declaration on Environment and Development
- o The United Nations Convention Against Corruption

The UN Global Compact asks companies to embrace, support and enact, within their sphere of influence, a set of core values in the areas of human rights, labour standards, the environment and anti- corruption:

Human Rights

- o Principle 1: Businesses should support and respect the protection of internationally proclaimed human rights; and
- o Principle 2: make sure that they are not complicit in human rightsabuses.

Labor

- o Principle 3: Businesses should uphold the freedom of association and the effective recognition of the right to collective bargaining;
- o Principle 4: the elimination of all forms of forced and compulsory labor;
- o Principle 5: the effective abolition of child labor; and
- o Principle 6: the elimination of discrimination in respect of employment and occupation.

Environment

- o Principle 7: Businesses should support a precautionary approach to environmental challenges;
- o Principle 8: undertake initiatives to promote greater environmental responsibility; and
- o Principle 9: encourage the development and diffusion of environmentally friendly technologies.

Anti-Corruption

• <u>Principle 10</u>: Businesses should work against corruption in all its forms, including extortion and bribery.

United Nations Global Compact Cities Programme



A framework for translating the Global Compact Principles into dayto-day urban governance and management.

The Global Compact Cities Programme (or Cities Programme) is the urban component of the United Nations Global Compact; the world's largest corporate responsibility initiative.

The United Nations Global Compact recognises that cities in particular, have the potential to make enormous strides in creating sustainable societies – where economic, ecological, political and cultural issues are integrated and advanced.

To that end, the Global Compact Cities Programme is dedicated to the promotion and adoption of the Global Compact's Ten UN Principles by cities, and provides a framework for translating the principles into day-to-day urban governance and management.

In the spirit of the United Nations Global Compact, the Cities Programme focuses on collaboration between all levels of government, business and civil society

- to enhance sustainability, resilience, diversity and adaptation within cities and in the face of complex urban challenges.

The Cities Programme supports a holistic approach to sustainability that considers, plans for and measures impact across four social domains: the economic; ecological; political; and cultural.

Administered by an International Secretariat based at the Global Cities Institute at RMIT University in Melbourne, Australia, the Global Compact Cities Programme provides support, guidance and recognition to participating cities.

The Cities Programme offers three levels of engagement: Signatory, Leader and Innovating. Whilst all city and region participants are Global Compact signatories, the subsequent levels recognise and foster sustainability leadership – city leaders implementing the Ten Principles in the administration, planning and development of their city or region – in partnership with leaders in other sectors.

All cities and regions may choose to engage at the Leader and Innovating levels in the same period of becoming a Global Compact participant, or at a later date. The categories are outlined in the following section.





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1. Signatory

In a letter to the UN Secretary-General from the highest level city leader, a Signatory City commits to the Ten Principles of the UN Global Compact, endeavours to enact and promote those principles in city management, and encourages businesses in the city to join the UN Global Compact. They also commit to Communicate on Engagement

2. Leading

Cities or regions that engage with the Cities Programme at the Leadership-level are drivers of positive urban change. Such cities or regions generally have a dedicated sustainability plan or work within the framework of a comprehensive urban plan that has a holistic approach. Their work extends beyond the standard, administrative or service role of government. These cities or regions consider the future directly, are conscious of their roles as civic leaders and facilitators, and are intent on building resilient, sustainable and vibrant cities and regions.

Leading cities share their achievements and challenges with the broader Cities Programme network. This can be done through contributing case studies or elements of their reports for publication, participating in events hosted by the Cities Programme or partners, and engaging academia with their work. Engagement at this level is generally without a fee, however cities can choose to engage direct and extended support from the International Secretariat through financial contribution to research costs

3. Innovating

At the Innovation level, the highest level of engagement in the Cities Programme, a city or region is recognized for addressing a complex or seemingly intractable issue or set of issues within the city or region. This is done through a multi-year project. Whilst focused on a resolving a specific issue or transforming a complex situation, these projects are holistic. All dimensions of that community and region — the ecological, economic, political and cultural domains — have been considered in the development of projects.

These projects have a transformative quality. They are managed cross-sectorally, engaging government, business and civil society in the development and implementation of the project. The project has clear monitoring and evaluation processes. At this level, dedicated support and recognition is provided by the Cities Programme Secretariat. The project is documented; and learning from this project is shared across the Cities Programme network and more broadly. A fee is associated with this level of engagement. This fee can be used to provide research support to the specific Innovating City project. Please Note: All cities and regions are signatories. All cities can access Cities Programme's resources and tools. Cities can participate at the three levels simultaneously.



THE AFRICAN SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT MAP

This brochure illustrates "at a glance" the support that the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) is providing to its member States towards the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

ECA's support currently falls under four broad areas to support evidence based policymaking for the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as well as Africa's own development vision, Agenda 2063 -The Africa We Want. These efforts are namely in the areas of:

- Data collection and analysis;
- ii) Technical support, advisory services and capacity development;
- Development of knowledge products, facilitating knowledge-sharing as well as South-South & triangular cooperation; and
- iv) Reporting and follow-up support on the implementation of the SDGs and Agenda 2063

These areas will continue to progress as ECA responds to the evolving needs and demands of its member States in Africa.

To situate the SDGs in the African context, in January 2015, the African Union Heads of State and Governments adopted Agenda 2063, a strategic vision, for inclusive growth and sustainable development in Africa which was developed before Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development was endorsed. In September of the same year, Africa also signed Agenda 2030, the global framework for achieving sustainable development which largely accommodated Africa's voice, presented through the Common African Position. Africa's agenda does not contradict the SDGs, it is more specific and more focused on the transformative policies that can make a difference for the continent.

Given the levels of congruence, synergies of both agendas have been harnessed in an integrated Regional Indicator Framework which is being finalised. This will allow for a coherent approach to implementation, monitoring and evaluation as well as facilitate efficiency and effectiveness of reporting on both agendas. Going forward, ECA will promote the combatting of illicit financial flows to help finance the implementation of both agenda.

The first Sendai Framework Progress Report is expected in 2019 and will exceptionally cover trends in implementation for the two biennial cycles 2015-2016 and 2017-2018. In 2019, reporting on progress in achieving the SDG targets related to disaster risk reduction and in implementing the Sendai Framework, will be shared at the High-level Political Forum and Sixth Global Platform for Disaster **Risk Reduction respectively.**

Urban Eco Farms: The model is food coops, where 1 member = 1 vote. A member gets an equity share through time, talent or taxes.

The Alley is a joint venture between the residents of the community and the participants who need the support. The project needs to be 1) sustainable; 2) replicable; 3) scaleable, so the 5,000 alleys that were closed after the riots can benefit from the model.

There needs to be considerable outreach to break the cycle of poverty (lack of economic opportunity), which leads to not being educated, which leads to more crime and then more poverty. The project needs to turn Unemployment to Employment; Lack of Education to Education.

Anthony talked about gardens = jobs, from fish nutrients to drip irrigation.

John B's focus is production: tying everything together to grow into a more stable whole.

Nery's focus is distribution of product.

TEAM 9 - represented by Ricardo Chavez / Les Hamasaki

"Hub Nursery" to be converted from old warehouses. Would create training and jobs for local people.Emphasis would be on reducing waste, using what we have. For example, cuttings from existing / excess plants could be sold for \$4 each, earning money for the hub at a price that is affordable.

The nursery would be a sort of genetics laboratory, where people could learn to recycle waste as mulch and find other innovative solutions to urban problems.

Training sites don't have to be centralized or large; micro sites can be leased or rented throughout the city. Hydroponics can be started in apartments, schools, and churches.

TEAM 10 – represented by Eugene Shirley / Pando Populus

"Rejuvenate L.A."

Use the government land to serve veterans by creating jobs for the future, transitioning from military. Create jobs for the mind, body and soul by using vacant properties as "skills incubators." Provide co-working space. Space can be used to host start-up opportunity jobs, and to provide education to hone individual skills and to learn technology skills. Teach to write resumes, gain other types of useful information that can be used in existing and new ways.



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



United Nations Global Compact Cities Programme



A framework for translating the Global Compact Principles into day-to-day urban governance and management.

The Global Compact Cities Programme (or Cities Programme) is the urban component of the United Nations Global Compact; the world's largest corporate responsibility initiative.

The United Nations Global Compact recognises that cities, in particular, have the potential to make enormous strides in creating sustainable societies – where economic, ecological, political and

cultural issues are integrated and advanced.

To that end, the Global Compact Cities Programme is dedicated to the promotion and adoption of the Global Compact's Ten UN Principles by cities, and provides a framework for translating the principles into day-to-day urban governance and management.

In the spirit of the United Nations Global Compact, the Cities Programme focuses on collaboration between all levels of government, business and civil society - to enhance sustainability, resilience, diversity and adaptation within cities and in the face of complex urban challenges.

The Cities Programme supports a holistic approach to sustainability that considers, plans for and measures impact across four social domains: the economic; ecological; political; and cultural.

Administered by an International Secretariat based at the Global Cities Institute at RMIT University in Melbourne, Australia, the Global Compact Cities Programme provides support, guidance and recognition to participating cities.

The Cities Programme offers three levels of engagement: Signatory, Leader and Innovating. Whilst all city and region participants are Global Compact signatories, the subsequent levels recognise and foster sustainability leadership - city leaders implementing the Ten Principles in the administration, planning and development of their city or region - in partnership with leaders in other sectors.

All cities and regions may choose to engage at the Leader and Innovating levels in the same period of becoming a Global Compact participant, or at a later date. The categories are outlined in the follow section.



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1. Signatory

In a letter to the UN Secretary-General from the highest level city leader, a Signatory City commits to the Ten Principles of the UN Global Compact, endeavours to enact and promote those principles in city management, and encourages businesses in the city to join the UN Global Compact. They also commit to Communicate on Engagement...read more

2. Leading

Cities or regions that engage with the Cities Programme at the Leadership-level are drivers of positive urban change. Such cities or regions generally have a dedicated sustainability plan or work within the framework of a comprehensive urban plan that has a holistic approach. Their work extends beyond the standard, administrative or service role of government. These cities or regions consider the future directly, are conscious of their roles as civic leaders and facilitators, and are intent on building resilient, sustainable and vibrant cities and regions.

Leading cities share their achievements and challenges with the broader Cities Programme network. This can be done through contributing case studies or elements of their reports for publication, participating in events hosted by the Cities Programme or partners, and engaging academia with their work. Engagement at this level is generally without a fee, however cities can choose to engage direct and extended support from the International Secretariat through financial contribution to research costs…read more

3.Innovating

At the Innovation level, the highest level of engagement in the Cities Programme, a city or region is recognized for addressing a complex or seemingly intractable issue or set of issues within the city or region. This is done through a multi-year project. Whilst focused on a resolving a specific issue or transforming a complex situation, these projects are holistic. All dimensions of that community and region — the ecological, economic, political and cultural domains — have been considered in the development of projects.

These projects have a transformative quality. They are managed cross-sectorally, engaging government, business and civil society in the development and implementation of the project. The project has clear monitoring and evaluation processes. At this level, dedicated support and recognition is provided by the Cities Programme Secretariat. The project is documented; and learning from this project is shared across the Cities Programme network and more broadly. A fee is associated with this level of engagement. This fee can be used to provide research support to the specific Innovating City project...read more
