Human Rights: A conference was organized with IFI-AUB revolving around Genocide, Freedom of expression, and social media. It attracted more than 100 attendees. Moreover, each panel discussion ended with an extensive Q&A session.

Human Rights: AGBU Lebanon's food box distribution program reached more than 500 households from February 2020 till May 2020.

Human Rights and Education: The AGBU dispensaries open their doors daily to the people who need medical surveillance and medication.

Education: AGBU schools has fully waived the tuition fees of more than 250 students.
