


































The community Service Office at the Faculty of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Manufacturing organized a medical convoy to the Borgaya Youth Center in Al-Minya. This convoy was named after "Alaa Bahgat Bakr", a third-year pharmacy student who sadly passed away on Tuesday, January 5, 2021.

The convoy aimed at improving the overall health of the village residents through conducting medical examinations and monitoring blood sugar levels for 62 elderly residents and 17 children.

The University also ran an awareness campaign inside the University campus to warn against the complications of diabetes. During the campaign, the blood sugar levels of the students, and the University staff were measured and those diagnosed with diabetes were directed to the outpatient clinics for further assessment and treatment.





How to Successfully Secure a Scholarship to Study Abroad

This was the title of a workshop offered to our community students. The workshop was organized by the Office of Alumni Affairs in coordination with the Future Pharmacist Student Association (FPA).

The workshop was moderated by Dr. Usama Ramadan and Dr. Kareem Ebeid. Dr. Ramadan is an Associate Professor of Phytochemistry at Deraya University. He received his Ph.D. from the renowned University of Würzburg in Germany. He was awarded the prestigious STATE ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD in the fields of medical sciences from the Egyptian Academy of Scientific Research and Technology in 2020.

Dr. Ebeid is an Assistant Professor of Pharmaceutics at Minia University and Deraya's President Advisor on International Cooperation. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Iowa in USA. During his studies, Dr. Ebeid received the Graduate Research Excellence Award in the Sciences. Dr. Ramadan and Dr. Ebeid received multiple scholarships during and after their Ph.D. studies. The workshop covered the requirements needed to apply for scholarships in Germany and USA. At the end of the workshop, Dr. Ramadan and Dr. Ebeid answered the students' questions, and encouraged them to plan ahead, and to properly invest time and effort to achieve their goals.



Deraya University organized a medical convoy to the Faculty of Arts at Minya University. The convoy aimed at checking the health of the Faculty of Arts staff and workers. Not only did the medical convoy measure blood sugar levels to almost 40 of them, but they also directed those who had abnormal blood sugar levels to Deraya's health services department for further assessment, and treatment.







Innovative thinking is one of the uttermost qualities that Deraya University strive to inculcate in its students. Hence, Deraya University announced its first ever Innovation and Entrepreneurship Initiative for its students with a grand prize of 50,000 EGP. The initiative encouraged students to come up with their own startup ideas, which include developing a unique product or service and bring it to market.

Amira Ali Gabr, a 5<sup>th</sup> year student in the Faculty of Physiotherapy, secured the first place in Deraya's Innovation and Entrepreneurship Initiative, for inventing a supportive suit that correct posture and avoid neck and back pain while setting down. Moreover, three more participants in the initiative won 5000 EGP/each, and were honored by the deans of the Faculties of Pharmacy & Pharmaceutical Manufacturing and Physiotherapy, for their superb work on conducting feasibility studies on their startup ideas. Those winners are:

Faculty of Pharmacy at Deraya University organized a visit to an orphanage in Al-Minya City named "Moassaset El Banen" which means "The Orphan Boys Foundation".



In addition to checking the residents' blood pressure and sugar levels, Dr Manar Samir, the Director of the Health Services at the University, carried out full physical examination to 13 residents of the nursing home to assure their health and wellbeing.











As part of Deraya University's commitment towards community service, the Faculty of Physiotherapy organized a one-day convoy to El Mataharah El Bahariya village.

The convoy aimed at checking the health of the village's residents against chronic bone and joint diseases. The team examined 304 cases, of which 10 were for children with special needs. A number of cases were transferred to the university's clinics to take the right action for physical therapy












