About SHS

SHS Holdings bring innovative eco-friendly housing, energy, water and health protection techniques and applies them at scale in the developing world. The concept aims to provide a 'turn-key solution' to reducing the current shortfall of tens of millions of decent dwellings in the developing world. SHS works with governments, the UN, NGOs and the private sector to create safer and more sustainable environments for generations to come. As part of our commitment to the UN Global Compact, the company is pleased to share the following update:

Nigeria

Nigeria's Ekiti State will join one of the largest affordable housing initiatives in the world, following a new agreement that will see at least 50,000 affordable homes built by Sustainable Housing Solutions (SHS) and partners UNOPS over the next decade. The agreement, part of UNOPS Sustainable Investments in Infrastructure and Innovation (S3i) initiative, will help address housing shortages in Ekiti State, with a focus on sustainability and local economic development.

"This is how our promise of developing Ekiti and improving the lives of the people can be achieved. This partnership has come at an important time, during the COVID-19 pandemic, which has reminded us of the need to deliver quality social infrastructure to the people," added Dr. Fayemi.

- SHS will supply proprietary state-of-the-art technology to the project, as well as oversee the development of housing by qualified contractors.
- UNOPS will provide its comparative advantages in its mandated areas, such as: infrastructure, procurement and project management.
- The government of Ekiti State will identify and allocate suitable land for potential developments, and help to create an enabling environment for foreign direct investment and mortgage finance.

The affordable homes will be built with Baupanel, the proprietary construction technology used by SHS, with features such as solar panel roofs, waste-to-energy technology and mosquitorepelling coatings. The initiative is expected to create thousands of local jobs and stimulate economic growth among a variety of local industries. "We are very pleased to support this contribution to Nigeria's national development priorities and in particular, to help meet the critical need for affordable housing, through innovative approaches to construction and mortgage financing"

UNOPS and SHS will seek to mobilize resources from third-party investors to fund the initiative – which has an estimated gross development value (based on the sales value of completed homes) of up to \$2 billion.

To date, UNOPS S3i initiative has committed to delivering at least a million homes in multiple countries over the next decade. SHS is partnering with UNOPS through this initiative to make a positive social, environmental and economic effect in countries such as Ghana, Kenya and Pakistan where hundreds of thousands of affordable homes will be built using Baupanel technology.

Guinea

The Government of Guinea has joined one of the largest affordable housing initiatives in the world, following a new agreement to partner with Sustainable Housing Solutions (SHS) and UNOPS.

The agreement, part of UNOPS Sustainable Investments in Infrastructure and Innovation (S3i) initiative, has made provision for 200,000 affordable, sustainable homes to be built over the next decade.

- SHS will supply proprietary state-of-the-art Baupanel construction technology to the project, as well as oversee the development.
- UNOPS will provide its comparative advantages in its mandated areas, such as: infrastructure, procurement and project management.
- At least 100,000 of the new homes will be made available to Government of Guinea civil servants through a scheme which supports housing payments via payroll.

UNOPS and SHS will seek to mobilise resources from third-party investors to fund the initiative – which has a gross development value (based on the sales value of completed homes) of up to \$8 billion. The project is expected to create thousands of local jobs in Guinea and boost economic growth across a number of local industries.

This announcement brings the number of affordable homes under the S3i initiative to approximately 1.3 million worldwide over the next decade, and follows a recent similar agreement with Ekiti State in Nigeria. Other countries where SHS is partnering with UNOPS in the scheme are Ghana, Kenya, India and Pakistan.

GLOBAL PROJECTS

Pakistan

- Tripartite agreement signed by government of Pakistan, UNOPS and SHS on 31 July 2019.
- At least 500,000 new affordable homes built in Pakistan over the next 10 years.
- As part of the agreement, the government will provide land and basic infrastructure including electricity, water and waste connections. UNOPS and SHS will establish a framework to manage financial aspects, and ensure project activities are timely, efficient and meet quality standards.
- In order to enable implementation, the Government enacted new law that allows for the creation of the mortgage finance solutions and the foreclosure procedures.

Ghana

- SHS, UNOPS and the Government of Ghana to build 200,000 affordable homes.
- First 100,000 homes announced in September 2018, additional 100,000 in March 2019
- Groundbreaking ceremony 28 July 2019.
- Sustainable and resilient high-quality homes to be produced by the local factories
- SHS has established a factory site in Accra, to produce advanced building materials.
- Project aims to provide at least 3,000 new jobs for local people, over 6 to 10 years.
- SHS has acquired a valuable site located beside the University of Accra where it plans to construct both student and teacher housing.
- Financial assistance for buyers includes mortgage support from Ghana's Teachers Fund.

Kenya

- MoU between the Government of Kenya and UNOPS signed on 26 September 2018 to build 100,000 affordable homes in Kenya.
- A tripartite agreement signed 31 May 2019 between Kenya's state department for housing, UNOPS and SHS.
- Construction begins: show homes now in development in Nairobi.
- Innovative finance solutions: the Housing Fund and the Kenya Mortgage Refinance Company (KMRC) will offer homes to the homebuyers either through long term Tenant Purchase Schemes (TPS) terms or affordable mortgages.
- SHS has made significant progress on the student housing front having had very positive discussions with four major universities.
- Factory Premises Nairobi: The premises where the factory will be housed is being located and a lease of the same will be finalised in the near future.

Caribbean

- The technical and project management team has been making good progress and several new initiatives have been reviewed including water reclamation and sewage solutions.
- Construction of the factory located in Antigua will commence soon. The building materials for which are being manufactured at present at the Bau factory in Spain.

India

 A bipartite agreement has been signed between the Government of India (GOI) and UNOPS. SHS has been appointed as the operations partner of UNOPS tasked with delivering 50,000 housing units in Goa. To this end SHS is in advanced contract discussions with an international construction company with both Indian origins and extensive experience of construction in India.

Other advances such as mosquito repellent paint and waste to water innovations contribute to the overall health of our home dwellers.

Obtaining a quality education is the foundation to improving people's lives and sustainable development. SHS will instigate comprehensive training for employees of Baupanel factories. As well as this we offer an on-site development programme to provide our workforce with the skills required to further their careers.

Goal 5: Gender Equality

Gender equality is not only a fundamental human right, but a necessary foundation for a peaceful, prosperous and sustainable world. SHS is committed to gender equality opportunities, both in the workplace and int the communities we create for people.

Goal 6: Clean Water and Sanitation

Clean, accessible water for all is an essential part of the world we want to live in. The developments built by SHS incorporate robust and efficient sanitation and treatment facilities to ensure that residents have access to clean potable water for everyday activities.

Goal 7: Affordable and Clean Energy

Energy is central to nearly every major challenge and opportunity. As innovators in energy efficiency, SHS champion methods such as solar power, LED lighting and smart thermostat technology, which complement our Class-A rated thermal insulation structures.

Baupanel, the proprietary technology owned by SHS, is a market leader in construction and is an efficient, effective thermal insulation that is a biologically inert, non-toxic and 100% recyclable, with virtually no waste produced.

To reduce inequalities, policies should be universal in principle, paying attention to the needs of disadvantaged and marginalized populations. SHS aim to offer the local populations in each of its regions opportunities that would otherwise not be available to them.
