






Number of Drawings Received & Years 2004 - 2020



EEG conducted its workshops virtually in 2020, enabling a larger group of students to attend and benefit from the hands-on lessons provided during the sessions. 

INTER COLLEGE ENVIRONMENTAL PUBLIC SPEAKING COMPETITION



College life is all about personal development; these years play an instrumental role in shaping the skill sets of the youth and equipping them with desirable expertise in their chosen field of study. Sustainability has penetrated all spheres of life, making the study of the environment an inevitable part of university curricula. EEG's Inter College Environmental Public Speaking Competition (ICEPSC) provides undergraduate students with a perfect blend of these features, as it enables them to research and furnish innovative solutions to contemporary environmental challenges.

The 20th Annual (ICEPSC) was conducted in a hybrid manner - the Universities and Colleges in the UAE attended the 2 day competition in person whereas all participating teams from the rest of the Arab world attended it virtually. The first-ever, virtual cycle of the ICEPSC allowed EEG to accommodate 180 undergraduate students from 5 Middle East Countries despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The 2020 edition of the ICEPSC laid special emphasis on the recovery of the environment during the COVID-19 era, as the participants provided versatile solutions to build back better for a resilient and sustainable future. The competition was judged by a group of esteemed panelists from different regional entities and corporations. The programme was a huge success, as the students stepped out of the competition with a broader understanding of issues and a fresh outlook on tackling these challenges.

The competition witnessed a large group of astute students presenting their perspectives and solutions on issues such as biodiversity degradation, sustainable tourism, mass extinction, and resource efficiency and in doing so, gained insight on the following UN SDGs:

CAMPUS OUTREACH



Besides the year-round campaigns, competitions and workshops, EEG, as an advocate of the environment, collaborates with various educational entities in the UAE to provide valuable insights into ongoing environmental affairs and discusses practical solutions to tackle imminent threats. Every year, EEG strives to reach out to a larger number of students and young change-makers to equip them with sustainable mindsets and cultivate eco-friendly attitudes.

EEG Visits Three Special Needs Schools

In the last quarter of 2018, EEG embarked on a project to celebrate the vision of the late Sheikh Zayed, the Founding Father of the Nation, wherein it created an off-shoot of a billboard titled '100 Years, One Legacy' made of more than 1,200 paintings of students from across the UAE. The billboard carried the message "I am not just a billboard", and won the hearts of residents and visitors to the country. A month after the project, it was removed and transformed into 200 unique bags, highlighting the recyclability of billboards. The bags were sold to generate funds to support rehabilitation programmes for special needs centres in Dubai. On 11th and 12th February, EEG concluded the project with visits to three special needs schools - Dubai Autism Centre, Al Noor Training Centre and Senses Residential and Day Care – to hand over the funds generated from the sale of bags. This multi-faceted project opened doors for a new way to the advertising and marketing industry in the UAE.



EEG Collaborates with Mohammed Bin Rashid University of Medicine and Health Sciences

EEG was invited to collaborate with Mohammed Bin Rashid University of Medicine and Health Sciences to raise awareness on environmental issues. In this regard, EEG attended a weekly meeting of MBRU on 17th February during which the Chairperson presented EEG's wide range of environmental programmes and activities which suits all segments of the society. MBRU and EEG also discussed potential collaboration in the future between the two institutions.

EEG and University of Sharjah Sign a Memorandum of Understanding

With an aim to build effective partnerships with academic institutions and foster research, EEG Chairperson met the Chancellor of the University of Sharjah (UoS) on **20th February** and **13th October**. The discussion focused on further strengthening ties and offering more opportunities for students to intern at EEG and acquire knowledge in the field of sustainability and environment protection. In the long

In 2020, EEG provided internships for 7 students, each of whom took back with them a unique perspective about the activities of the organisation.


They also worked hard and contributed to EEG's overall goals of environmental awareness & preservation.


Can Collection Day

EEG organised its 24th cycle of the Can Collection Day on **27th February**, under the motto, **"Don't throw it away. Recycle it for Another Day".** The event united over **180** entities from across the UAE, whose combined efforts reeled in more than **5,000** kg of Aluminium Cans for recycling which formed 25% of the set target of **20,000** kg.

Can Collection Drive

The annual Can Collection Drive of EEG was successfully organised on **7**th **November**. With all the pandemic-related safety measures in place, EEG was able to run the drive successfully at three sites - Al Mamzar Park, Al Barsha Pond Park and Zabeel Park in Dubai, while participants from other Emirates deposited their collection directly at EEG's office or was collected from them by EEG's team. The drive brought together over **120** entities from across the UAE, who collectively deposited a total of **3,500** kg of Aluminium Cans for recycling.











Earth Hour and Paper Walk

Earth Hour is an annual event when people all over the world turn off lights for an hour. Since 2008, EEG has been an active participant of the international movement to raise awareness about environmental issues. Given the exceptional situation during the COVID-19 outbreak, EEG joined the world to observe Earth Hour digitally in 2020. Usually, EEG celebrates the Earth Hour by conducting a special project known as "Paper Walk" in parts of the UAE. However, owing to the pandemic restrictions, this activity took the form of a simple paper collection. A total of **56** participating entities successfully handed over **6,746** kg of paper.

Scrap Metal Recycling Project

For the very first time, EEG launched a one month Scrap Metal Recycling Project, which aimed at further promoting environmental sustainability. This project ran from 20th September till 20th October 2020.

Green December

The last programme initiated by EEG in 2020 was "Green December". Under this campaign, student members of EEG collect a minimum quantity of specific recyclable materials. The programme witnessed 32 enthusiastic students partake in a noble cause, thus showcasing their will to become responsible citizens of the society. Through the programme, EEG was able to collect 8,395 Kg of Paper, 501 Kg of Plastic, 57 Kg of Aluminium Cans, 320 Kg of Glass, 200 mobile phones, and 53 toners. Through this, EEG was able to mitigate 34 Metric Tonnes of CO, conserve 231 BTU of energy, save 50 m³ of landfill, prevented 307 trees from being cut, and avoided the combustion of 716 gallons of gasoline.



EMIRATES RECYCLING AWARDS





PANEL DISCUSSIONS



Since its inception in 1992, EEG has been engaging with various stakeholders through its series of Panel Discussions, formerly known as the Community Lectures. EEG's panel discussions cover a wide range of environmental and sustainability issues. These discussions provide valuable insights and formulate effective solutions to deal with challenges at hand. In 2020, EEG conducted 4 panel discussions, with a total participation of over 700 people, bringing the total count of panel discussions conducted till date to 195 since its inception. The panel discussions were supported by the Arabia CSR Network, the Emirates Green Business Council (EGBC), the Clean Energy Business Council (CEBC) and the Swiss Business Council

1. Sustainable Fashion: A Moment or a Movement?

EEG hosted the 1st panel discussion of 2020 on a much debated contemporary topic "Sustainable Fashion: A Moment or a Movement?" on 20th February, hosted by Modul University Dubai.

The discussion highlighted that the fashion industry is one of the biggest industries globally, worth US\$ 2.4 trillion according to McKinsey Global Fashion Index. It is also the 3rd highest polluting industry in the world, producing 20% of global wastewater according to UN Economic Commission for Europe; therefore, developing sustainable solutions in the fashion industry needs immediate attention such as fair trade, ethical clothing, recycling plastic and PET bottles to make polyester, using large platforms such as pageants to promote awareness about the envi-

ronmental threats posed by the fashion industry, creating effective waste management programmes to monitor the disposal of garments and encourage corporates to undertake CSR initiatives in this regard.

The discussion highlighted topics that needed attention from brands, the textile industry and relevant entities involved in spreading the message of recycling. It was stressed that sustainability in the fashion industry requires balancing the growth in demand by consumers and the supply of resources


2. Feeding a Thirsty World: Food & Water Security

EEG organised its 2nd panel discussion virtually on 28th May, titled 'Feeding a thirsty world: Food & Water Security' to facilitate strong interactions on food and water security. The objectives of this panel were to explore the risks of water and food scarcity in the UAE and the Region and to understand the ways through which organisations are working to effectively contribute to the UN SDGs and to share best practices that promote water conservation and agricultural sustainability; such as agri aquaculture farming and up-to-date food security techniques. Through its very first virtual panel discussion, EEG enabled conversations that aligned with the UAE Water Security Strategy 2036 and to the UN SDG no. 2, 6, 10, 12, 13 & 17.

The discussion threw some light on the dangers and impacts of world hunger and malnutrition in its many forms and offered several solutions to combat them. The UAE Food Security Office affirmed its commitment to achieve the National Food Security Strategy 2051 using technological advancements, revised labeling systems on food packaging and engaging the community in competitions. They highlighted their strategy in enabling all citizens and residents to have access to sufficient, safe and nutritious food for and active and healthy life at affordable prices at all times. The speakers also provided insight on steps to achieve water stewardship.

3. Tackling the Climate Emergency with Climate Finance

The 3rd Panel Discussion was held virtually on **28th July** under the theme of "Tackling the Climate Emergency with Climate Finance." The session aimed to inform the participants about the financial opportunities available to combat climate change as well a key investment areas for green development.

It featured a group of expert panelists who emphasised on the urgent need of increasing government and private spending on crucial sectors such as health, education, infrastructure and climate change. It also opened dialogue about financial opportunities in the UAE that can be diverted towards combating climate change.

Responding to climate change does present challenges for the oil producing and water stressed countries of the MENA Region as well as present opportunities to create new paths towards more inclusive and effective development.


The panel put across intriguing ideas for the GCC states to develop a PAN-Arab model for clean energy technology and climate change mitigation as part of their foreign aid.

The MOCCAE talked about establishing stations across the UAE to assess changes in the concentrations of pollutants during January to June 2020 which observed an average reduction of 45% in $\rm NO_2$ concentration level.

The need to create mechanisms to accurately measure pollution levels, encourage corporates and investors to expand their scope of by putting in place Carbon Strategy & Portfolio Management and setting attainable goals to achieve by 2030.

4. UAE, A Biodiversity Haven

The 4th and final panel discussion for the year 2020 was conducted virtually on **20th September** under the theme, "UAE: A Biodiversity Haven". This very stimulating session aimed at addressing the underlying causes of biodiversity loss and also injects biodiversity values across all sectors.

The session highlighted the importance of biodiversity in the cycle of life, and the efforts made by the UAE to preserve its biological diversity and therefore allowed the engagement of stakeholders.

The session dived into various methods to conserve ecosystems on a global, regional and local level and how to benefit and learn from international policies and adapt them to serve national strategies.

The speakers demonstrated facts about the wealth of terrestrial, avian and marine ecosystems found within the UAE and therefore eliminated the existing bias that the desert ecosystem lacks diversity. They focused on the challenges faced by the entities in implementing conservation practices and offered solutions to overcome that.

They raised relevant points such as encouraging environmental education in schools, strengthening practices in veterinary and wildlife management, incorporating necessary policies within the organisational principles, and implementing efficient governance and planning systems.

The discussions commended the UAE government's efforts in preserving biodiversity and duly serving its role as an up and coming sustainable hub in contemporary times.

Clean Up with Landmark Group

EEG organised a cleanup drive at the Al Qudra lakes and registered a total participation of 100 staff members of the Landmark Group, who very meticulously helped collect a total of 900 kg of waste out of which the recyclable waste collected was taken to the EEG office for proper recycling.

Water Stewardship Leaders' Forum

To accelerate water stewardship for sustainable development, EEG Chairperson was invited as a speaker in the Water Stewardship Leaders' Forum organised by Nestle MENA on 27th October. The objective of the forum was to provide a global perspective on water challenges, define water stewardship, deliberate on viable plans of action for the MENA Region, and provide perspective on the Caring for Water (C4W) framework. The presentation gave a thorough overview of the challenges and opportunities for collaborative action for water security and sustainable development in the region. EEG Chairperson also joined a panel discussion to engage with other participants on key issues related to the implementation of SDG 6.



Online Market Forum

On 7th October, EEG Chairperson participated in a virtual market forum organised by Epson Europe B.V. Middle East Office, a corporate member of EEG. The forum was based on the theme 'Sustainability in the Middle East', it provided insights based on interactions with the research specialist B2B international, targeting over 4,000 people and 26 countries including the UAE and KSA. The forum discussed the importance of sustainability and eco-value for business growth and success in the Middle East Region. In the context of sustainability in the Middle East, EEG Chairperson also shared her input on the viability of sustainable practices and touched upon the need to value a project or investment beyond its financial aspects and focus more on socio-environmental ones as well.

Tristar Virtual Stakeholder Workshop

On 8th December, EEG was invited to participate in the Tristar Sustainability Stakeholders Workshop. The objective of the workshop was to collect stakeholder feedback on Tristar's sustainability practices and achievements, which allowed Tristar to improve its materiality process.

The workshop included insightful presentations outlining Tristar's commendable work on Sustainability and their ESG good practices.

Ajman Tourism collaborates with EEG

The Director-General of the Ajman Department of Tourism Development hosted a meeting for EEG team led by the Chairperson, at his office on **19th February** to discuss the potential of collaborating in recycling and capacity building programmes.

Twelve key areas of interest were identified in the meeting to foster a long-term partnership and achieve tangible results in reducing carbon emission, energy conservation and boosting recycling.

EEG agreed to collect recyclable materials from Ajman Tourism Office on a weekly basis, host annual tree planting campaign with the Tourism Department, provide the staff with volunteering opportunities and join hands with the department for the "Clean Up UAE" campaign in liaison with Ajman Municipality.

Gulf Cultural Club

Emirates Environmental Group's Chairperson was invited to give a presentation on **22**nd **May** in an online session of Gulf Cultural Club broadcasted across the GCC region. A powerful and inspiring presentation was given on how to act on global strategies by pushing for greater awareness, development and the implementation of strategies by governments, and encouraging the private sector to make the right investments.

As a member of GISD Alliance, the Chairperson explained the vision of aligning business with the SDGs by helping them to identify opportunities for long term and sustainable investments. This new focus of converging profitability and sustainability in the business mindset is a means of scaling and speeding up the world towards resilience.

Swedish Business Council

For the seventh year in a row, in support of the Embassy of Sweden, the Swedish Business Council celebrated their National Day 2020 on, **6th June**. EEG Chairperson joined the Swedish Business Council, longtime partners of EEG, in celebrating their National Day through a virtual ceremony. The event welcomed guests from the local Swedish community, business partners, and friends and families of the council from around the world to celebrate the joyous occasion.

Partnering with HITECH Community Mask

In the fight against the corona pandemic, EEG partnered with HITECH Community Mask, which produces face masks made of more than 60% recycled textiles.

These high-quality masks are developed in Switzerland under the recommendations of the Swiss National COVID-19 Task Force and World Health Organisation.

The company generously provided these masks as a giveaway gift for EEG Gala Dinner guests. This sustainable solution allowed users to protect themselves from the novel coronavirus, while also reducing their ecological footprint. EEG's partnership with HITECH also entailed members to use a special code and avail a 15% discount on the orders placed.

Emirates Green Building Council (EGBC)

1. EEG Chairperson Moderates Emirates GBC Breakfast & Networking Event

Habiba Al Mar'ashi, Chairperson of EEG, and Co-Founder, Board Member and Treasurer of the Emirates Green Building Council, moderated a panel discussion on the topic of "The Circular Economy in the Built Environment" at the Emirates GBC Breakfast & Networking Event hosted by Shaw Contract on 2nd March. She emphasised on the growing pressure being exerted on natural resources due to growing population and increased consumption patterns.

The panelists of the discussion shared their views on how circular economy principles are being incorporated into the construction sector, and how these can be implemented effectively across the UAE.



2. UAE Green Buildings Market Brief 2020

On 24th September, EEG Chairperson facilitated a webinar for the launch of the 2020 UAE Green Buildings Market Brief. This brief shed light on the different green building policies in the UAE and current status of green buildings in the country. She emphasised on EGBC's aim to promote sustainable best practices by strengthening and promoting green building practices and initiatives across the UAE and the MENA Region. Key findings of the report were also highlighted, such as the UAE has nearly 64 million square metres built-up area as per its local green building regulations, she further added that the "UAE is one of the frontrunners when it comes to the environment and sustainability. The session also featured a presentation on the opportunities and trends for the UAE construction and building sector, followed by an enlightening discussion with the attendees.

3. EGBC Congress and Awards

EEG Chairperson participated in the 9th Annual Congress that was organised on 17th & 18th November. The theme of the congress was 'Building a Sustainable Future in Uncertain Times' under the patronage of the Ministry of Climate Change and Environment. She moderated the 1st panel discussion titled "From crisis to recovery: market overview for the green building sector".

The event discussed the impacts of COVID-19 on the construction and building sector, and how existing opportunities could be utilised to build a sustainable and resilient future for the UAE. The other areas of discussion included circular economy in the



built environment, healthy buildings, innovations and solutions within the green building industry, resilient cities, carbon neutrality in the high rise, turning climate commitments into action on projects and indoor environment quality. Following the event, EEG Chairperson was also featured in the Business Breakfast Show on Dubai Eye 103.8 FM, as she shared some highlights from the EGBC Congress and Awards on air.

4. Towards the Next 50 Years: A Sustainable Development Plan

On 30th November, Mrs. Habiba Al Mar'ashi joined the virtual Tabreed webinar that featured the UAE's prominent sustainability leaders to address the importance of embedding sustainability in the agenda of next 50 years. She spoke at the webinar and shared her views on global sustainability trends and emphasised on using the available Deep Retrofit technology to reduce on-site energy use.

She also shared the key activities of EGBC such as, MENA Green Building Awards and Annual Congress that brings the public and private sectors in joint efforts towards sustainability. She also suggested creating a blueprint of the UAE's success to lead momentum on the UN Sustainable Development Goals and the Paris Climate Agreement. The discussions drew attention to the importance of incorporating STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) in the educational curriculum.

Clean Energy Business Council (CEBC)

As a longstanding partner of the Clean Energy Business Council, the Emirates Environmental Group partnered with the former on numerous occasions, as the two embarked on their shared objective of promoting awareness on energy efficiency and the renewable sector. In 2020, through a versatile range of webinars that discussed the implications of the challenges posed by COVID-19 on the energy sector, EEG and CEBC came together to successfully instigate meaningful dialogue between stakeholders on relevant matters and enabled them to derive solutions to address these challenges.

EEG attended a webinar on 12th May, wherein the expert speakers discussed the estimated trends in Energy Efficient Market due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Head of Energy Efficiency at the International Energy Agency (IEA) talked about the expected drop in energy efficiency markets in 2020 due to low CO₂ emissions amid COVID-19 and the urgency needed from governments to look for long term recovery without slowing down the clean energy transition.

2. On 20th May, EEG participated in a technologically enlightening webinar hosted by the Clean Energy Business Council, alongside the Future Mobility Club (FMC). The session shed light on the advancements and infrastructure of EV across the Arab world. They offered insights into the EV market in the region and the technological advancements it has seen over the years. In discussing Electric Vehicle infrastructure in the MENA region, the speakers tackled issues relating to the COVID-19 pandemic affecting the EV market such as the oil price crash, supply chain disruptions, and EV sales and orders being put on hold due to financial losses experienced by companies and individuals



- On 4th June, EEG attended an informative CEBC webinar that detailed the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and lockdown measures on ESCO and M&V activities in the Middle East. The webinar demonstrated the International Performance Measurement and Verification Protocol (IPM-VP) which is an internationally used framework to measure energy savings which also currently stands as the most widely recognised measurement standard in the ESCO industry worldwide. The speakers presented case studies from hotels and malls based in the UAE and their energy savings during lockdown measures.
- EEG attended on 24th June, a webinar hosted by the Clean Energy Business Council (CEBC), which focused on the digitalisation of the power sector to discuss opportunities in the MENA Region. The expert panelists explored topics on recent innovations and various technologies developed throughout the energy value chain, market trends in the energy sector, grid specific technologies and the benefits of grid digital transition, case studies of successfully-implemented digital projects, and different challenges facing digitalisation and the opportunities ahead for the Region.



- 5. On 15th July, EEG Chairperson, was invited as a speaker in a webinar and signing ceremony of CEBC's Women in Clean Energy (WICE) and Canada's Women in Renewable Energy (WiRE). She provided a research-based presentation on the 'Role of Local & International Community in Achieving Gender Diversity in the Energy Sector', shedding light on the current situation of gender diversity and global employment in the renewable energy sector. She said that in order to achieve gender equity in the energy sector and establish smart business strategies, we need to focus on the (3Es): Equal opportunity, Equal pay and Equal leadership. This requires strong concerted commitment from governments. industries and other energy stakeholders.
- 6. On 2nd September, EEG attended a webinar organised by CEBC and UNDP Regional Hub in Amman, through its regional project "SDG-Climate Facility: Climate Action for Human Security", which elucidated the role of climate finance in facilitating transformative climate action to meet the SDGs in the Arab Region. The discussion dealt with Renewable Energy systems that entail benefits from SDG 7 and 13, and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. The discussion recommended the Union of Arab Banks transition to Green banking, to work together to build a framework for the Arab financial sector to support sustainable development projects. The discussion stressed on the need for a clear Pan-Arab commitment to embrace strong forward thinking policies of the renewable energy business.
- EEG Chairperson attended the CEBC Members Virtual Networking event on 4th November. Bridging the gap of social distancing, the event proved to be a great platform for the exchange of ideas and suggestions among the members. The event focused on the achievements of CFBC over the past few months and highlighted its activities in progress. The attendees also used this platform to interact with one another and exchange their insights.

Partnering with ACSRN

Following through their deep-rooted partnership, EEG collaborated with Arabia CSR as the Environmental Partner for the 13th edition of the ACSRN's Flagship Awards, known as the "Arabia CSR Awards". It was launched in a press conference held on 20th January.

The launch marked the official commencement of a new cycle of the awards, shared its features with the media, potential participants and other stakeholders, and provided the winners of previous cycles with a space to share their experiences and insights on their awards journey.

On 20th April, EEG collaborated with ACSRN to conduct the ACSR Awards Clinic, an event that supported the companies who had registered for the awards by providing them with training on how to add value to their applications. The Awards Clinic provided an outline of the methods, categories, criteria for judgment, and hints to companies to enable them to submit a successful application. The 13th cycle of the ACSRN Awards Ceremony, regarded as the 'Green Oscars of the Middle East', was conducted on 6th October, of which EEG was a proud Environmental Partner.

The event was held under the patronage of H.E Eng. Sheikh Salem Bin Sultan Bin Sagr Al-Qasimi, Chairman of the Ras Al Khaimah Civil Aviation Department and member of the Executive Council of the Government of Ras Al Khaimah, and sponsored by McDonald's UAE and Tristar Group. It was one of the first public physical events that EEG partook in post the COVID-19 outbreak in the UAE. The specialty of this event is that it received the carbon neutral label courtesy of FARNEK. The awards is verified by one of the world's most reputed providers of business assurance DNVGI






Engaging Effectively with GUD

GUD is a worldwide non-profit organisation founded in 2001, consisting of a rapidly growing network of more than 600 dynamic and well-known urban leaders and experts in 60 countries.

They conduct education, research, and action to promote policy ideas that help generate more prosperous, sustainable, and inclusive urban development throughout the world.

In 2020, EEG Chairperson, Mrs. Habiba Al Mar'ashi, a board member of GUD, joined hands with the organisation to conduct and coordinate a wide range of enlightening meetings and webinars, each of which provided an in-depth analysis of integrating sustainability into urban development.



- On 19th June, EEG Chairperson joined the virtual board meeting that discussed issues of housing and urban development post COVID-19. The discussion focused on 3D Housing and Sustainable Development for energy and financial efficiency. The meeting also discussed the innovative work of the World Health Organisation's new global project on Urban Governance for Health and Well-being, CLIC project on cultural heritage and circular economy. Sustainable Innovation Community and Global Participatory Bud-
- The Global Urban Development (GUD) organised on 1st July, the first meeting of a new working group virtually, which was coordinated by the EEG Chairperson and a member of the faculty of Global Policy & Development at Singularity University.

The members shared their great ideas and potential actions on generating globally scalable projects around residential and mixed-use development using 3-D printing and other advanced construction technologies; the extensive use of recycled concrete and other sustainable building materials; equitable and sustainable community design, planning, and development; methods of public and private financing; job creation, business linkages, and income growth; homeownership and cooperative housing; and other closely related economic, social, and environmental challenges and opportunities.

A follow-up meeting was held on 29th July to determine the clear vision and strategy for promoting climate resilient affordable housing and sustainable community development.

On 28th July, GUD in partnership with EEG, organised the 1st virtual Urban Thinkers Campuses (UTC). The meeting of the members deliberated on the Sustainable Innovation Zones and COVID-19 Resilient Recovery Strategies.

The EEG Chairperson gave a presentation and shared her suggestions on new GUD Housing Working Group and potential plans for the UAE and the Gulf Region. She stressed on the key issues of COVID-19 and global poverty, how to mitigate the impacts and build back better, and the construction industry and its impact on economy.

- 4. GUD held a webinar attended by EEG, called "Inside ZISPOA" on 12th August. The insightful presentations were delivered by GUD Board members, who are key leaders of ZISPOA (Porto Alegre Sustainable Innovation Zone). It discussed the 6 key pillars of ZISPOA - Innovation and Technology, Entrepreneurship and Startups, Sustainability and Resource Efficiency, Creativity and Collaboration, Participative Management Community, and Friendly Environment to Business. The GUD group is engaged in some exciting projects for sustainable housing and sustainable innovation. A follow-up 2-hour webinar with extensive discussion was devoted entirely to describe and analyse the 5-year history of ZISPOA among the members. Further on 26th August, the group gathered virtually to discuss potential projects in developed as well as developing countries with strategic and innovative approaches.
- 5. On 17th December, EEG Chairperson attended GUD's annual meeting virtually, which focused on three key areas of discussion: to review GUD's progress in 2020, especially on two major initiatives Sustainable Innovation Zones and Sustainable Innovation Communities; and Dubai International Housing Conference, 3D printed affordable housing with recycled construction waste, and to engage in strategic planning for 2021 and re-elect Board Members.

Engagement and Collaboration UNEP

As an accredited NGO to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), EEG consistently strives to uphold and promote the pillars of sustainable development in the UAE, which are namely social, economic, and environmental development.

Ever since its inception, EEG has been a leading environmental advocate through its objectives that cater to raising public awareness on environmental affairs; integrating the public & private sector, and the civil society in sustainable development; and developing action plans and programmes that enable the population to take progressive steps towards building a more sustainable world.

In this regard, EEG has a similar working ethos as it collaborates with various strata of society by disseminating information, while providing a platform to 'make a difference' and advocating environmental justice. EEG has also pushed the UNEP mandate on the ground in the Middle East and beyond through its multitude of activities and programmes.

The year 2020 has been a strange one as the world came to a standstill. However, as a collective unit, NGOs, Member States and stakeholders from across the globe have been actively working with UNEP towards the environmental agenda. Below are some of EEG's milestones and statistics in working with UNEP for the year 2020.

Meetings and webinars

From January – December 2020, EEG attended 28 meetings and webinars related to several important UNEP mandates, some of these included the Committee of Permanent Representatives, the themes of which are:

EEG attended important sessions on the launch of flagship projects such as the Emissions Gap Report 2020.

Along with these high-level meetings, EEG also provided its recommendations to a number of policy documents/resolutions.

EEG was able to provide general as well as Arab-centric perspectives through various UNEP surveys designed to analyse the future form, function, governance of Global Environment Outlook, emerging issues of environmental concern, and Product Lifetime Extension.

In **September 2020**, in the light of the strategy reveal and engagement kickstarter of the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration, EEG found an opportunity to raise awareness and empower the student population of the UAE to participate in the Decade's activities

With the support of UNEP's Secretariat, EEG offered its student members a platform to customise the brandnew Decade logo by 'Making It their Own' and personalising it with a more Arab flavour. EEG looks forward to achieving this with UNEP at the helm as the environmental hub of the world.

The article encourages the youth to reflect upon how they can use their dream to help make the world a better place, and advises them to plan their future in a manner that integrates community action and upliftment.


The Matrix Green Pill Podcast



COMMUNITY ACTION & AWARENESS PROGRAMME



Our trees and forests serve as the lungs of the planet; they play a vital role in maintaining the oxygen levels in the atmosphere and providing stable homes for all the lives on Earth. Unfortunately, rapid industrialisation and urbanisation have caused humans to cut down these trees for their own benefit, causing a rather unsettling imbalance to the ecosystem. According to a UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA) policy brief, the COVID-19 pandemic has brought to the forefront some of the most pressing global challenges that humanity has faced in recent history, especially with regards to environmental degradation.

In fact, a 2020 study conducted by economists revealed that green recovery and reforestation would be the ideal means of recovery from the pandemic and prevent further reoccurrences of diseases like COVID-19 in the future. Recognising the significance that trees hold in the global landscape, EEG conducted its annual 'For Our Emirates We Plant' campaign in 2020 under the patronage of H.E. Engr. Sheikh Salem bin Sultan bin Sagr Al Qasimi, Chairman, Department of Civil Aviation, Ras Al Khaimah, and Honorary member of EEG.

This platform serves as a tangible outcome of the recycling campaigns and it serves as a reminder to various stakeholders that their actions contribute towards creating a meaningful difference. This campaign is quite a unique one because it is born out of an incentive provided to enthusiastic members who have been dedicated towards collecting and depositing wastes for recycling. "For Our Emirates We Plant" also did a great job in wrapping up all of EEG's events for 2020, and left the community in hopes of a splendid 2021.

One Root, One Communi-Tree

Launched in 2010, the One Root, One Communi-Tree campaign is aimed at promoting recycling habits and creating a recycling culture in the UAE by engaging companies, hotels, academic institutions, and families, and encouraging them to meet set targets for different recyclable materials. The project, as usual, comprised two phases: one from January to May, and the second from August to November. The collective recycling of these wastes resulted in the mitigation of 2,023 MTCO₂ emissions and saved 13,755 BTU of energy, 3,194 m³ of landfill space, 10,780 trees from being cut and 10,559 gallons of gasoline.

Green Call

To celebrate the annual Global Recycling Day, EEG rolled out the 5th cycle of the Green Call campaign on **20th March 2020**, it called upon participants to recycle their old Mobile Phones and tablets. Recognising the grave impacts that improper disposal of e-waste lays on the environment, EEG continues to hold this annual campaign to encourage the community to actively contribute towards building a circular economy, whereby materials are reused and recycled as many times as possible. The 2020 campaign ran for a month, until **20th April**, and received participation from **32** academic institutions, corporates, and families. Collectively, the campaign was able to collect **483** mobile phones and EEG was able to mitigate **0.08** MTCO₂ emissions, save **397** trees from being felled, and save **1,684** gallons of gasoline. The commitment shown by participants led to the planting of **13** native trees on **20.12.20**.

Recycle. Reforest. Repeat

To commemorate the World Day to Combat Desertification, the Emirates Environmental Group (EEG) rolled out the 5th cycle of its popular "Recycle. Reforest. Repeat" Campaign (RRR) on **17th June**, which ran until **20th July 2020**. The campaign was first introduced in 2016, with a special focus on the collection and recycling of waste paper from academic institutions, corporates and families.

The slogan of the World Day to Combat Desertification 2020 - "Food. Feed. Fibre", served as a call for action to address the challenges to food security posed by climate change and desertification. In the year 2020, access to food, nutrition, and water was even scarcer in the vulnerable economies of the world, because of the mammoth-sized challenges brought forth by the COVID-19 pandemic. The project resulted in the collection of **44,943** kg of paper from the **133** registered participants. The contributions helped EEG to mitigate **303** MTCO₂ emissions save **1,759** million BTU of energy, **247** m³ of landfill and **1,332** trees. The RRR project enabled the planting of **57** trees under the "For Our Emirates We Plant" on **20.12.20**.

Neighbourhood Recycling Project

The Neighbourhood Recycling Project (NRP) was launched in 2011, with an aim to engage EEG's student members during the summer months. For the first time in 2020, EEG opened up the campaign for non-members to participate, thereby gaining larger outreach and creating widespread impact. Under this project, student members are required to undertake a recycling project in their respective neighbourhoods and achieve set targets within a specific time period.

This project encourages young students to cultivate recycling habits and improve their communication skills, while instilling a sense of social responsibility in them. In 2020, the NRP received the participation of 80 students, who successfully collected a total of 29,909 kg of Paper, 2,224 kg of Plastic, 195 kg of cans, 924 mobile phones and 58 toners. EEG was able to mitigate of 122 MTCO₂ emissions and save 844 BTU of energy, 193 m³ of landfill space, 1,267 trees from being cut and 3,242 gallons of gasoline. As part of this project, the students were able to plant a total of 134 trees under the 'For Our Emirates We Plant' on 20,12,20.

Planting a Greener Future

Jointly initiated by EEG and McDonald's UAE, 'Planting A Greener Future' is a programme aimed at creating sustainable green spaces across government schools in the UAE. This unique urban afforestation programme conveys the message to students that it is crucial for them to progress hand-in-hand with nature. Scientifically, urban green spaces have been found to improve the physical and mental well-being of students, in addition to carrying environmental benefits. EEG and McDonald's UAE have together embraced several UN Sustainable Development Goals. i.e. Goals 4, 12, 13, 15, 17.

Inaugurated in October 2019, the 3rd phase of this project allowed EEG and McDonald's UAE to plant Samar, Neem, Ghaf, and Sidr trees across the **7** Emirates. In 2020, the 'Planting a Greener Future' had covered **2** schools – Bida'a Al Mutawa School, Abu Dhabi, and Bidiya School for Basic Education, Fujairah.The campaign managed to create lush lawns on 1,000 square feet, and plant 100 native trees. The students participated in a very interactive workshop organised for them by EEG as part of this project.

Together We Plant

Miswak Tree Planting with Dabur

On **15th November**, EEG, in collaboration with its corporate member Dabur, organised the Miswak Tree Planting. It was supported by the management of the Saih Al Salam Protected Area, and a total 20 saplings of Miswak tree were planted on the premises.

This was a unique tree planting activity, due to the high importance of Miswak tree in Arabic culture and tradition. EEG consistently looks forward to such value added initiatives from its members and supporters to roll them out for the benefit of the society and the environment at large.

Julius Baer Tree Planting

On **8th December**, Julius Baer Dubai celebrated its 130th anniversary globally by joining hands with EEG to plant 130 native Ghaf trees in Al Qudra area. This collaboration with EEG was a testament to the bank's commitment to philanthropy and sustainability.

The planting drive will support the increase of the sustainable green and, help the country meet its Sustainable Development Goals, improve its microclimate, and provide a natural habitat for the wildlife to thrive.

In its bid to promote global environmental competencies and foster synergies, EEG acts as a focal point on several environmental issues, as it coordinates with its members, key stakeholders and institutional entities. As the world begins to adapt to the 'New Normal', EEG is committed to continue driving environmental action, engage the community and deliver on its objectives, and thus, uphold its phenomenal legacy.





LOCAL ENGAGEMENTS

The World Majlis Conversations

Inspired by the Arabic term 'Majlis', meaning council, the World Majlis is a forum under the Dubai Expo 2020 that aims at instigating global conversation on topics of relevance in today's day and age and to generate new perspectives and incubate meaningful connections between people and new ideas. The World Majilis is a series that brings together thought leaders from various government, professional, academics and cultural backgrounds.

With hundreds of participants and millions of visitors, Expo 2020 is termed as the 'World's Greatest Showcase' of human brilliance and achievement. Expo 2020 is dedicated to addressing these issues and was unveiled in a keynote speech by host, H.E. Reem bint Ibrahim Al Hashemy, Minister of State for International Cooperation, Director-General of Expo 2020 Dubai Bureau and Chair of the UAE National Committee on Sustainable Development Goals, which she also hosted.



The forum was the last World Majlis session hosted before Expo 2020 and was designed to inspire a positive outlook on the future while raising awareness that polluting the planet eventually pollutes its tenants. On 12th January, EEG Chairperson, along with dignitaries such as H.H. Sheikha Shamma bint Sultan bin Khalifa Al Nahyan, H.E. Razan Khalifa al Mubarak, attended and participated in a session on the topic, "Human and Planetary Health – Blurred Boundaries".

EEG Chairperson brought across important and strong points on unsustainable consumption of the planet's natural resources, to the amount of toxic pollutants we are pouring into Earth's natural system and how can we affect our planet positively, and in turn support our own well-being and future.

Water Stewardship meeting in Abu Dhabi

The Alliance of Water Stewardship (AWS) is a global membership collaboration among businesses, NGOs and the public sector. The members of the AWS contribute to the sustainability of local water-resources by adopting and promoting a universal framework for the sustainable use of water – the International Water Stewardship Standard, or AWS Standard. EEG attended the meeting held on the **15th January** at the Centro Capital Center by Rotana at the invitation of the Swiss Agency for Devel-

opment and Cooperation (SDC). The meeting was held in the presence of private and public entities, to highlight the reflections since the past meetings in September 2019 and the AWG Global Water Stewardship Forum in November 2019. The meeting also dived into the AWS updates from the Arabian Peninsula

The UAE SDG Forum

EEG's Chairperson was a panelist on the UAE SDG Forum held on the **16th January**, in a session titled "The Future of Business: Scaling action of the SDG's Through Business Unusual", as part of the Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week. As an integral part of the Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week, the forum convened high-level government officials and leaders from business and academia, to discuss the creative implementation of the 17 UN SDGs.

At the same event, the General Secretariat of the National Committee for the Sustainable Development Goals in the UAE, in partnership with the Hamdan Bin Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum International Prize for Photography, announced the launch of a book entitled "Our World through the Lens". Her Excellency, Reem bint Ebrahim Al Hashimy, Minister of State in the Cabinet and Chairperson of the Federal Competitiveness and Statistics Authority, launched the book with the aim of spreading awareness about the 17 UN SDGs and highlighting the challenges facing human societies by capturing special moments through the lenses of photographers from around the world. The National Committee for the Sustainable Development Goals, in partnership with the Arab Youth Center, also launched the "Arab Youth and Sustainability Report", which is the first of its kind at the level of the Arab world, and aims to focus on the role of Arab youth in supporting sustainable development goals by highlighting a number of creative youth initiatives and their positive effects Societally in achieving these goals.

Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Global Water Award

EEG Chairperson attended the second cycle of the Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Global Water Award, which is organised by "SUQIA" under the "Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Global Initiatives" on 29th January. This award aims to enhance the role of the state in developing solutions to the challenges faced by poor and afflicted societies around the world and to encourage institutions, research centers, innovators and youth from all over the world to find innovative and sustainable solutions to water scarcity by using solar energy to purify and desalinate water.

- The Chairperson of EEG attended the Dubai Chamber's 1st Business Groups & Business Councils Roundtable Discussion for 2020 held at Dubai Chamber of Commerce premises on 12th March. EEG took part in the first of 4 roundtable meetings for the year 2020, as one of the working group members of Dubai Chamber, which elucidated Dubai Chamber's ongoing activities and provided updates on the much-awaited Dubai Expo 2020
- 2 On the 19th May, EEG participated in the 2nd online roundtable discussion which delved into various global, regional, and local economic challenges posed by COVID-19, and outlined Dubai Chamber's policy recommendations and potential opportunities arising from COVID-19.

- On 28th September, EEG Chairperson participated in the 3rd online roundtable discussion which provided updates on the challenges faced by the business community and the impact that COVID-19 has left on businesses and people across the world. REGIONAL ENGAGEMENTS

A webinar on Energy & Utilities

On **28th April**, EEG attended a webinar organised by The Energy & Utilities publication on the subject, 'Impact of COVID-19 on Renewable Energy Programmes'. The webinar focused on how and why the renewable market should be proactive in dealing with the current market scenario to become more resilient. The webinar initiated discussion on the emerging issues in the energy sector during the pandemic, starting with the fall in oil prices to the bigger challenges that

are expected to follow with the global push for integrating renewables into energy systems.

The rise of ESG Bond Market

EEG attended on **29th April**, a webinar organised by HSBC on "The rise of ESG bond market during the COVID-19 pandemic" led by the Chief of Staff GBM & Head of Sustainable Finance and Head of Sustainable Bonds. It also introduced the rise of Green, Social and Sustainable Bonds (GSS Bonds), which is aimed at financing the mitigation of COVID-19's socioeconomic impacts.

The Sterilisation of the GCC to Prevent the Spread of COVID-19 in the Region

On **18th May**, EEG attended the lst session of the series of webinars organised by Waste & Recycling Middle East and Africa. The webinar titled "Enhanced cleaning, disinfection and safety measures to prevent COVID-19", welcomed the Dubai Municipality, Bee'ah Oman and Bee'ah UAE as guest speakers to present best practices and methods used during the national sterilisation programmes.

During the webinar, Dubai Municipality focused on the sanitisation of densely populated areas in Dubai, mainly in public transportation and facilities as well as in streets, which see the gathering of people on a regular basis and can serve as hotspots for spreading and contracting the virus. Bee'ah prepared for the potential of the virus reaching the UAE very early which allowed for early response.

Tafahum Virtual Roundtable



EEG Chairperson attended on 17th June, the Tafahum Virtual Roundtable, Tafahum is a 3-year project that seeks to develop a roadmap for regional security in West Asia and the Arabian Peninsula. It explored the topic "Environmental Issues and COVID-19". She shared her views on the relationship between the pandemic and climate change, and how the trans-regional 'shock' of the COVID-19 pandemic could boost regional cooperation to curb the severe effects of climate change. She pointed out that the Government of UAE has been proactive in terms of the national health security level and explained the concrete efforts that were put in place which could lead to green & sustainable recovery by cutting carbon emissions.

1st Virtual Event of BMR



On 7th July, EEG attended the Bureau of Middle East Recycling (BMR)'s dynamic platform, where the participants shared knowledge and experiences during the pandemic. BMR, a voice of the Middle East Recycling industry on an international scale for more than a decade, has organised 8 successful recycling conferences in the Middle East. This virtual recycling conference hosted more than 20 booths from across the globe and facilitated engagements with finest recyclers, processors, traders, agents, recycling machine producers, service providers, recycling media & different associations from all over the world.

CAN Arab World



EEG Chairperson attended the inaugural day of the General Assembly of the Climate Action Network (CAN) of the Arab World on 7th November. This virtual dialogue between the civil society and government representatives was organised under the slogan of "Moving to renewable energies in the Arab world is not an option, but a necessity" by the CAN Arab World - an NGO-network in the field of Climate Action in the MENA Region. In the session, the speakers shared undertakings by CAN in bridging the national and regional efforts in this respect.

UN75 Dialogues-Youth in Action

EEG attended on 10th December, the 'UN75 Dialogues: Youth in Action'- a series of webinars aiming to address Arab youth's needs, expectations and ambitions, and hence the achievement of the SDGs. The webinar was organised by the office of United Nations in the United Arab Emirates. UNFPA Arab states and MBC AL AMAL.

The webinars discussed topics ranging from the contemporary challenges faced by the youth, UN Youth volunteering, a possible creation of a UN Youth Charter and the benefits of using online platforms like the Arab Youth Centre. In the presence of young

One Planet Network Webinars

EEG attended two webinars organised by One Planet Network that focused on linkages between sustainable consumption and production (SCP), and climate change. The first webinar, held on 31st March, covered important subjects such as 'Resource Efficiency and Climate Change - Material Efficiency Strategies for a Low-Carbon Future' and 'Consumer Information Tools and Climate Change: Facilitating low-carbon choices in Tourism, Buildings and Food Systems by the Consumer Information Programme'. The second webinar was held on 16th April under the topic 'Sustainability reporting: Introducing the Methodology for SDG indicator 12.6.1 (Number of companies publishing sustainability reports) was organised by esteemed professionals from UNEP, UNCTAD and Global Ai.

Thriving Amidst the Chaos of Pandemics

EEG participated in a virtual session on 13th April with Prof. Srini Pillay, a pioneer in the field of transformational neuro-coaching. The webinar organised was by the Invision Partnership, it emphasised on topics such as optimising virtual teams, building resilience in times of uncertainty during the COVID-19 crisis, and prioritising health. The session gave an insightful approach to enhance leadership development and shed light on how to be decisive and willing to make decisions without the availability of perfect information around them

2020 ECOSOC Forum

On 24th April, EEG attended a virtual meeting where the ECOSOC made history as UN members came together virtually to negotiate unified messages of restoring global economy; to reflect on the urgency for advance, bold and concerted global action towards immediate socio-economic impacts of COVID-19; and to finance a quick, inclusive and resilient recovery by conducting the "The 5th ECOSOC Forum on Financing for Development". The forum was an opportunity to re-enforce, re-purpose and re-invigorate the multilateral cooperation mechanisms.

Strengthening Science & Technology and Addressing Inequalities

On **6th May**, EEG attended a webinar on 'Strengthening Science & Technology and Addressing Inequalities in the COVID-19 era' organised by UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs. Led by the Assistant Secretary-General for Policy Coordination and Inter-Agency Affairs, the expert speakers accentuated that Science and Technology could be effective only when it can be used to improve global challenges and enhance exchange of information and solutions in times of crises.



High-Level Event on Financing for Development in the Era of COVID-19 & Beyond

EEG, was honoured to attend on **28th May** a live webcast of the high level event convened by the UN Secretary-General, Prime Minister of Canada and Prime Minister of Jamaica. This platform was attended by insitituions such as the IMF, World Bank, OECD among others, to address the economic devastation caused by COVID-19 and enable discussions for sustainable financing solutions.

The leaders discussed the challenges and opportunities to act quickly on the 6 major issues that include - expanding liquidity in the global economy and maintaining financial stability; addressing debt vulnerabilities for all developing countries; private sector creditors; enhancing external finance for inclusive growth; gender equality and creating jobs; expand fiscal space and foster domestic resource mobilisation by preventing illicit financial flows; and ensuring a sustainable and inclusive recovery aligning with SDGs.

Investing to Champion the Female Economy

On **2nd June**, EEG joined a webinar organised by the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida) and the Financial Alliance for Women, which explored the business case for supporting women customers and employees to promote gender equality and champion the female economy. The webinar discussed tools to develop a gender intelligent strategy to expand the financial inclusion and economic empowerment of women for inclusive economic growth and poverty reduction. The speakers from financial services companies enlightened the participants with deeper qualitative and quantitative insights and offered solutions to bridge the economic disparity for women.

COVID-19's Effects on Plastic Recycling Market

On **4th June**, EEG attended the 2nd virtual forum in a series of webinars implemented by Waste & Recycling MEA that explored the COVID-19 pandemic's effect on plastic recycling industries in India, China and Europe. The expert panelists shared their observations and analysis on long-term impacts that the pandemic poses on the plastic recycling sector. The webinar also discussed plastic waste management in the wake of the pandemic and what best practices for proper recycling of plastics ought to be used in the medical industry.

UN Global Compact Leaders Summit



On **15th June**, EEG was honoured to be a part of the virtual celebration of UN Global Compact 20th anniversary of Leaders Summit. Leaders from businesses, governments, UN and academia came together for conversations on how businesses can support communities around the world to recover better, stronger and together from three global crises – health, inequality and climate. The Summit focused on rebuilding inclusive economies and societies to set a new course for a socially just, low-carbon and climate resilient world. The leaders present in the summit appealed for new business models and lowering subsidies on fossil fuels to achieve sustainable development.

Women for Impact

The EEG Chairperson was invited on **15th June**, to a webinar on 'Giving a Voice to all Women in the International Economic Environment', which was a joint initiative of Elite Business Women in partnership with a London-based entrepreneur and award-winning communicator. The webinar probed into how women around the world are changing the way business is being done - from building bridges between countries to innovating industries and international relationships. With women redefining their ecosystems and pushing boundaries, changes on an individual, societal, economic and international level.

Future of the Environment Post-COVID

On **2**nd **July**, EEG Chairperson attended a webinar organised by Emirates Society, which is a friendship group dedicated to strengthening the UK-UAE relationship. The session featured Her Highness Sheikha Shamma Bint Sultan Bin Khalifa Al Nahyan - the President and CEO of the Alliances for Global Sustainability:

it also included the Britain's Minister of State for the Pacific. International Environment, Climate and Forest and Animal Welfare; and the Director General of the Zoological Society of London & Britain's former Ambassador to the UAE.

The core theme of the webinar was to recover from the pandemic and revive shattered economies. The speakers shared their expertise on recycling ventures. renewable energy projects, smart city developments, and animal as well as habitat conservation around the globe.

Water-Energy-Food (WEF) Nexus



On 8th July, EEG attended the concluding event of a webinar series on the WEF Nexus organised by UNEP, Africa Office/Energy Unit, and Global Programme of Action for the Protection of the Marine Environment from Land-based Activities

The key themes of the webinar were human wellbeing, poverty alleviation, and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The primary takeaway from the webinar was the importance of involvement of communities, private sectors and institutions, which can be achieved by linking social and environmental aspects with economic business models which incorporate political will and the social fabric.

Online Dialogue on Better Recovery

EEG Chairperson joined the online dialogue organised by UN DESA and the United Nations High-level Advisory Board on Economic and Social Affairs (HLAB) on 22nd July, which commemorated the launch of a compilation of essays by HLAB members on 'Recover Better: Economic and Social Challenges and Opportunities'. The main discussion during the event was about how green recovery could be used for countries to recover from the recession and challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. As a follow-up, UN DESA organised a series of policy dialogues among board members, contributing authors and prominent thinkers that further informed COVID-19 responses so that countries could build back better and avoid returning to a pre-pandemic pathway, where progress towards important objectives was not rapid enough, or was happening at the cost of significant reversals on others.

Research interview on Gender. Green Skills. and the Green Economy

US-based International Education Consultant, Olivia Casey, reached out to the EEG Chairperson for an interview on 30th July, where she requested the latter to share her valuable input on girls' education, green skills and the green economy. In the interview, Mrs. Habiba explained the importance of cultivating green skills across all stakeholders in the community and made recommendations on how to go about promoting these essential skills. She also explained the need to attain gender equality in the field of sustainability, and how this difference can truly facilitate positive change, and how green skills are incorporated into the functionality of EEG.

Women Ocean Changemakers

On 13th August, EEG attended a webinar on 'World Ocean Summit Insight Hour' to virtually meet the Women Ocean Change makers, under the "World Ocean Initiative" sponsored by The Nature Conservancy. The webinar showcased leading female change makers working to develop business solutions to achieve ocean-related sustainability. The webinar brought together the change makers and their mentors to discuss their vision for the blue economy, outline the potential impact of their projects and detail what they expected to gain from the mentorship.

Bamboo Capital Partners



On 9th September, EEG Chairperson was introduced to Bamboo Capital Partners, an impact investing platform that provides innovative financing solutions to businesses in emerging markets serving the low and middle income populations for lasting impacts. As a member of the GISD, Bamboo Capital Partners and the SDG 500 have a partnership with reputable governments and organisations like the United Nations Capital Development Fund (UNCDF), Alliance for a Green Revolution in Africa (AGRA), United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS), CARE, ITC, Smart Africa and the European Union to mobilise public and private sector capital to meet the SDGs in the midst of the pandemic.

UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration

EEG attended on 15th September, the Strategy Reveal and Engagement Kickstarter webinar as part of the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration, which is to be launched in 2021. Against a backdrop of a global environmental crisis, the UN Decade would be a golden opportunity to revive the natural world that supports us all, which has been affected severely because of human activities

The webinar introduced the UN Decade, and saw the reveal of new communication tools that would be used to inspire and support all stakeholders to collaborate and develop the appropriate skillsets for catalysing and successfully implementing restoration initiatives across the world.

WCEF: Circular, Affordable Housing



EEG attended the "Circular, Affordable Housing webinar" on **22nd September**, conducted by the World Circular Economy Forum (WCEF) in association with One Planet Build with Care. The webinar showcased several case-studies for disaster reconstruction, which highlighted the lessons learned and illustrated the potential of the UN cluster approach as an effective global framework to target disaster risk reduction.

World Circular Economy Forum

EEG participated in the World Circular Economy virtual forum organised by the Royal Institute of Technology (RIT) on **22nd September**. At the forum, the panelists from RIT and the corporate sector discussed the challenges associated with catalysing global circular economy adoption, with a special focus on understanding how the cultural and political milieus have shaped approaches to transition to circularity.

SDG Business Forum

On **23**rd **September**, EEG participated in the SDG Business Forum's 5th anniversary, co-hosted virtually by the UN Global Compact (UNGC), UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA) and International Chamber of Commerce (ICC).

The Forum, which was a part of Uniting Business series, was held on the occasion of the 75th UN General Assembly, the 2020 Biodiversity Summit and the Beijing +25 Conference. The SDG Business Forum aimed at fostering public-private dialogues, encouraging new partnerships and alliances, and exploring innovative business solutions to accelerate sustainable development.

Climate Leadership Networking Conference

EEG participated in the Climate Leadership Networking Conference, organised by the Green European Foundation with the support of the Green Economics Institute, on **26th September** to exchange insights on a variety of topics such as climate finance, climate science & narratives, and the role of Civil Society in climate diplomacy. The conference brought together actors from the civil society, policy makers, academics, campaigners, writers, and scientists, all of whom presented versatile perspectives about these issues and offered solutions to address them collectively.

Meeting with the Heads of States and Governments

On **29th September**, EEG Chairperson attended the meeting of Heads of States and Governments on Financing the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development in the Era of COVID19 & Beyond under the eminent presence of H.E Antonio Guterres the UN Secretary-General. This meeting probed into the policy options and work of the six working groups that was formed as a result of the rich and tangible deliberations.

Technological and Science-Based Solutions to the COVID-19 Challenge

EEG Chairperson attended the online panel discussion organised by the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA) on **29th October**, as a part of Global Policy Dialogues. The global leaders in science and technology discussed the science-based policies and innovations that have developed during the pandemic.

The discussion led by UN DESA and the UN Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia addressed the following topics: highlighting the importance of recycling, defining afforestation, exploring carbon off-setting.

Food Systems Approach to Climate Change

On 12th November, EEG Chairperson joined a webinar titled 'Food Systems Approach to Climate Change – The NDCs we want' organised by the United Nations Environment Programme, the World Wide Fund, the Alliance of Biodiversity International and International Center for Tropical Agriculture and International Panel of Experts on Sustainable Food Systems.

The webinar shed some light on the recommendations shared from the Report that was recently published by WWF, UNEP, EAT and Climate Focus, which explains 16 specific food system-related mitigation and adaptation measures countries can take.

The key discussions included the Glasgow Food and Climate Declaration and recommendations from the report titled 'Enhancing Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs)'.

Geneva Beat Plastic Pollution Dialogues

EEG attended the virtual Geneva Beat Plastic Pollution Dialogues on Plastics and Waste on **26th November**. This session was the first dialogue hosted by the Geneva Environment Network to build recommendations towards the High Level Dialogue on Plastic

Governance Dialogue in February 2021. The aim of this dialogue, which was held in collaboration with the Basel, Rotterdam and Stockholm Conventions Secretariat, the Center for International Environmental Law, the Global Governance Centre at the Graduate Institute, Norway and Switzerland, was to create synergies by highlighting the efforts made by intergovernmental organisations and governments, businesses, the scientific community, civil society and individuals for coordinated actions.

The Climate Dialogues 2020

The UAE Ministry of Climate Change and Environment invited EEG Chairperson to attend the events of Climate Dialogues 2020 organised virtually by United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change

- 1. The first event titled 'Addressing Knowledge Gaps: Biodiversity and Climate Change Adaptation' took place on 26th November and discussed climate change and its threat on biodiversity and ecosys-
- 2. The second event, held on the same day, was under the theme, 'Global Gender Event: Recap on 2020 & the way forward'. This event emphasised on the progress achieved from the implementation of the Lima Work Programme on Gender (LWPG) and its Gender Action Plan (GAP) in 2020.

3rd Global Conference of the Sustainable **Food Systems Programme**

EEG Chairperson participated in the 3rd Global Conference of the Sustainable Food Systems Programme, which was conducted virtually from 25th November to 3rd December. The purpose of this conference was to serve as a key breakthrough for the UN Food Systems Summit, which is scheduled to be held in 2021, by providing substantial input and recommendations

The 1st dialogue of the series was hosted by the Special Envoy of the UN Secretary-General and the Co-Leads of the One Planet Network's Sustainable Food Systems Programme. It aimed at gathering the experiences and inputs of ground level initiatives contributing towards sustainable consumption and production.

The UN Secretary General, Antonio Guterres, graced the conference with his presence, and shed some light on the current state of the world's food systems, and how these have been impacted by the pandemic.

The conference also featured a side event on the topic of Multi-Stakeholder governance for Food Systems, which served as a global call for action to the political leaders, corporate members, and the civil society to undertake proactive measures to build resilient food systems.

Advancing equitable livelihoods in food systems: A UN DESA Global Policy Dialogue Confirmation

On **16th December**, she attended the virtual session on advancing equitable livelihoods in food systems organised by UNDESA, which focused on securing nutrition for everyone, generating equitable livelihoods

and mitigating climate change.

The expert speakers from the field of food systems, population trends and rural development addressed the key areas on:

- Impact of COVID-19 on livelihoods especially the developing countries
- Systemic implications of population movement—and disruptions to this movement—on food system livelihoods
- Examples of agricultural and non-agricultural technologies or tools that can be utilised in rural settings to ensure sustainable productivity.

GPML Webinar on Upcoming Digital Plat-

EEG attended on 10th December, a webinar organised under the aegis of the Global Partnership on Marine Litter (GPML) titled - "Towards a GPML Digital Plat-

This webinar provided a high-level overview of the upcoming GPML Digital Platform as well as opportunities to discuss multi-stakeholder functionalities.

The key objectives of the GPML Digital Platform are to integrate data and information from multiple sources; connect stakeholders; identify gaps and priority actions; coordinate and guide action based on the best available knowledge; and facilitate target setting and measuring progress. Following this, an overview on Global Marine Litter Tracking Simulations was provided, which discussed the source and destination of marine plastic waste. Attendees were invited to join the GPML and be a part of the growing community to coordinate actions.

IUCN Engagements

IUCN National Committee Meeting

On 14th May, EEG Chairperson, along with other members of the IUCN National Committee in the UAE, were invited to discuss the effects of the current COVID-19 crisis on the operations of IUCN and to receive updates and latest news. In the meeting, H.E Razan Khalifa Al Mubarak, the new candidate for IUCN Presidency, presented some key updates in

In her statement as Nominee, she expressed in detail her vision for IUCN, which was to bring future-oriented, inclusive, and innovative leadership and work across boundaries to define the governance, strategies, and measures of success at the IUCN.

Launch of IUCN Global Nature-based Solutions Standard

EEG attended the High-level launch event organised by IUCN for the official release of the Global Standard for Nature-based Solutions (NbS) on 23rd July.

The key stakeholders from government and the civil society presented their insights into IUCN's vision for NbS, which was followed by a high-level panel discussion with representatives from across regions The opportunities and actions to be taken in the context of climate and biodiversity crises as well as the green recovery post-COVID, were discussed as key steps towards a just transition to a sustainable future.

Engagements with EU-GCC

Climate Change & Clean Energy

EEG joined the 1st webinar of the series of webinars initiated by the EU-GCC Clean Energy Technology Network on **14th May** under the title of "Climate Change and Clean Energy in the light of COVID-19 and Oil Price Development" to learn about new opportunities for climate change action and the energy transition in the region during the pandemic.

The panelists expressed the need for structural changes in constructions, industries, and other operations. The experts also predicted a few other impacts of lockdowns due to COVID-19 crisis, such as population growth, increase in unemployment and negative impact on green building construction, initiate EV expansion projects and investigate carbon pricing.

Energy Transitions in Europe and the GCC

On **16th June**, EEG attended another webinar hosted by EU-GCC that welcomed a group of experts, representing the government and sustainability sectors in the Middle East and Europe to discuss enabling energy transition in their respective regions. The guest speakers touched upon the importance of a comprehensive policy framework and the role of financial aid, international actors, and public opinion in facilitating smooth energy transition.

Energy Efficiency in Buildings and Smart Technologies

EEG Chairperson attended on **21**st **July**, the 2nd webinar under the series entitled 'Energy Efficiency: A key driver for clean energy transition' by EU-GCC Clean Energy Technology Network, supported by Clean Energy Business Council (CEBC). The webinar addressed how the GCC countries were embarking on a clean energy transition for sustainable, efficient and cost effective methods to find solutions to the existing challenges of low energy efficiency, fuel subsidies and high CO2 emissions. SISD Engagements

EEG participated in a webinar organised by Swedish Investors for Sustainable Development (SISD), in association with Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida) and GISD, on 2nd
 June to discuss how the SDGs could be deployed as a framework for investments and to bridge the gap between investment and implementation. The session covered presentations that were linked to SDGs no. 5, 6, 8, 11 & 13. The groups committed

to exploring investment opportunities that promote diversity and gender balance; encouraging investments to provide clean water and sanitation for all; exploring investors' engagement in human rights; and engaging with the Task Force for Climate Related Financial Disclosure (TCFD).

 On 3rd June, EEG attended an exclusive virtual conference titled 'Finance and Development Leaders in Joint Action' organised by SISD in partnership with UNDESA and Sida, and in conjunction with the conference for GISD.

The conference served as a virtual call to action, as finance and development leaders join for a more equitable and sustainable world. The sessions were headed on the impact of COVID-19 on Financing for Sustainable Development and the 2030 Agenda.

Engagement with Pearl Initiative

On 2nd June, EEG attended a research-based webinar organised by the Pearl Initiative. The webinar focused on the implications of new socio-economic policies across the Gulf Region in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The webinar offered an interpretation of the oil market crash due to the pandemic, and recommended that businesses restack risks, revise strategies and review their economic models.

Special emphasis was made on numerous contemporary challenges such as slow economic growth, trade depletion, the sinking of FDI and rising youth unemployment. The speakers concluded by discussing the viability of stimulus packages, Sino Arab trade and the Belt Road Initiative (BRI).

2. EEG joined another webinar organised by the Pearl Initiative on 11th June to learn more about the factors leading to the success and growth of the non-profit sector across the Gulf Region. Despite efforts to support the sector, there is still room for improvement, particularly in Saudi Arabia, where they have set ambitious targets for the growth of the sector and its contribution to the GDP in the Saudi Vision 2030. This webinar addressed the challenges that the non-profit sector faces in Saudi Arabia towards the fulfillment of Saudi Vision 2030.

HLPF Engagements

Global Acceleration Framework

On **9th July**, EEG attended the official launch of the SDG 6 Global Acceleration Framework organised by the United Nations and UN Water during the formal event in HLPF. This Framework aims at delivering the promise of safe water and sanitation for all by 2030. The webinar elucidated the urgent need to mobilise action towards improving access to water and sanitation. Amid the pandemic, 3 billion people still lack basic handwashing facilities and therefore, stronger commitment towards a promising and sustainable future was set through the launch of the framework.

Third Local and Regional Governments Forum on the 2030 Agenda

On 13th July, EEG Chairperson participated in the Special High-Level Forum, which was themed "The Decade of Action - Bolstering Change from the Ground-Up" organised by UN entities and partners, including UN DESA, UN-Habitat and Local 2030, UNDP, and the Global Task Force of Local and Regional Governments.

The Forum emphasised on the importance of multi-level governance, sound local finances, de-centralised cooperation, and territorial cohesion for deep-rooted transformation towards sustainability and resilience.

Financing Health Systems to Strengthen Preparedness for Future Shocks

On 13th July, EEG attended the 2020 HLPF's Voluntary National Review Lab session on 'Financing health systems to strengthen preparedness for future shocks'. The rich discussion featured panelists from WHO, World Bank, Ministry of Health of Ghana, Keio University, United Cities and Local Government (UCLG), and Medtronic, who engaged in a discussion on how the private and public sectors can work more closely to attain Universal Health Coverage (UHC) by 2030.

The session raised awareness of the financing gaps and showcased solutions to financing health systems, building on lessons learned from COVID-19.

Mobilising Support and Building National Partnerships



On 14th July, EEG joined the Voluntary National Review (VNR) Lab in the HLPF session, "Beyond the VNRs: Mobilising Support and Building National Partnerships".

The session explored practices on how countries can systematically catalyse national multi-stakeholder partnerships to share knowledge, expertise, technologies, and financial resources that support the implementation of the SDGs through the VNR process.

The Lab also explored how countries can help in creating an environment that may encourage and foster collaboration across stakeholders by sharing the success and challenges of each country.

2020 HLPF Parallel Dialogue on Sustainable Cities

On 16th July, EEG Chairperson joined the Urban Cluster Dialogue session of the UN's High-Level Political Forum (HLPF), wherein they shared their upbeat suggestions on 'Sustainable Cities and COVID-19: Plans for Action'. The interactive dialogue, featuring speakers from non-governmenta organisations, grassroots, academia, the United Nations, and other professions, focused on the importance of the implementation of the SDGs that were taking place in urban places, in the context of a global recovery.

SDGs Learning & Training Sessions

1. Session 1

EEG participated in the 1st session of the SDG learning and training programme which was jointly hosted by UNDESA and UNITAR on 7th June.

This session focused on various techniques and methods to be adopted by educational systems worldwide in order to incorporate SDG learning in a post pandemic world.

The special side event explored ways in which partnerships assist developing countries in addressing the COVID-19 aftermath and promote synergies between key sectors, including the scientific and technological community and the private sector.

2. Session 5

EEG attended the 5th session of the programme on the 9th July, which was based on Global Environmental Commons that examined ways to design solutions to integrate SDGs into policies and practices through education and capacity development.

The diverse group of speakers provided versatile solutions to promote an integrative and systemic approach to give SDGs the highest probability of success in the years to come, to provide life-long learning opportunities with a heavy emphasis on Environmental and Sustainable Literacy, and to strengthen the collective resilience in a river basin by taking into consideration social, environmental and economic aspects.

3. Session 7

The 7th session on 10th July focused on creating sustainable and just economies with transparency and clarity in national as well as global decision making.

Featuring speakers from different UN bodies and Women Organisations, the session brought into light the lessons learned from the COVID-19 crisis and enabling factors for the SDGs implementation by working on the linkages toward inclusive transformation.

The key areas of discussions were job creation, social justice, net employment gains, and need for integrated approaches and policy coherence.

4. Session 9

The last session of the programme that EEG attended was on 13th July, titled 'Teaching, Learning and Integrating the SDGs at Universities and Beyond'. The webinar discussed the key challenges in incorporating SDG training in universities, which include motivating students, implementing practical learning for SDGs, dynamic solutions for an ever-evolving status quo, incorporating innovation culture, interdisciplinary curricula, and realistically involving stakeholders for international cooperation.

GISD Engagements Engagements

The Global Investors for Sustainable Development (GISD) Alliance convened by UN Secretary-General, Mr. Antonio Guterres in October 2019 completed its 1st year with productive engagements and effective outcomes. The GISD Alliance, a group of 30 CEOs that represents all regions of the globe and a wide range of financial and non-financial companies, is the world's leading investment and business community committed to facilitate investments in sustainable development in partnership with fellow investors, governments and multilateral institutions.

The Alliance formed working groups with specific roles to drive investment for the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals. EEG Chairperson, a member of the Alliance and one of two representatives from the Arab Region participated in its various conferences and working group meetings throughout the year. These engagements materialised into the development of impactful tools towards sustainable financing and inclusive recovery as below,







EEG Chairperson participated in the virtural engagements of the Alliance as below, On **24th & 25th February**, GISD Strategy Group Meeting in Johannesburg, South Africa for WG1, 2, and 3 to target a long-term investment plan that fulfills profitability and sustainability.

On **4th June**, a webinar to discuss the role of the GISD Alliance in shaping the response to, and recovering from the COVID-19 pandemic through GISD-EC collaboration, and working group deliverables.

On **10th June**, the virtual meeting of the GISD Alliance was convened by the UN Secretary-General to reinforce the call to action for addressing the unprecedented crisis and push governments to create greener jobs and build sustainable investment, structures and policies.

On **11th June**, the UN Capital Development Fund (UNCDF) hosted a call to present four new deals that aim towards financing projects in developing countries to the GISD Alliance Working Group 2 (WG2), Deliverable Group 2 (D2) members for their consideration.

On **30th June**, further to GISD's Strategy Group deliberation, UNDP hosted a detailed presentation on the new SDG Impact Standards for SDG Bonds and Private Equity Funds to provide guidance on piloting the Standards with GISD's oversight.

On **16th July**, a follow-up meeting to the High-Level Event on Financing for Development in the Era of COVID-19 and Beyond which was organised by the Alliance.

On **23rd July**, joined a discussion group meeting, representatives of Ground Up Project presented the Impact Rescue Facility (IRF).

On **5th August**, joined a meeting held by the working group 3 on global liquidity and financial stability to deliberate on the policy options related to sustainable financing with both a long term and short term approach.

On **5th August**, EEG Chairperson contributed her inputs for 'GISD Call to Action for COVID-19 Bond Issuance' that defines the 5 pillars of UN Development System (UNDS) Response as, Health first, Protecting people, Economic Response and Recovery, Macroeconomic response and Multilateral Collaboration, and Social Cohesion and Community Resilience.

On **25th August**, attended a follow-up meeting conducted by Group 3 with over 60 members from Member states, IFIs, International Institutions and Civil Society Organisations to discuss the Global liquidity and financial stability issues in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic.

On **10th September**, attended the discussion group meeting that featured the presentation of Women's Livelihood Bond (WLB) by the Managing Director and Director of Investments for Singapore-based Impact Investment Exchange (IIX).

On **15th September**, attended a virtual meeting held for Strategy Group, led by the Director of Financing for Sustainable Development Office, UNDESA.

On **8th October**, joined a meeting to discuss the sustainable financing tools, Bamboo Capital Partners presented 'BLOC Smart Africa Fund', an Africa-led initiative working actively in collaboration with the governments and African entrepreneurs to support digitisation of Africa.

On **14th October**, attended the 2nd Annual Meeting of GISD Alliance that was organised with the UN Secretary-General to scale up investment in sustainable development. EEG Chairperson also shared her inputs in a side meeting that followed.

On **20th October**, joined an online session organised by the working group 2 to discuss the Global SDG Investment Platform to act as a clear pipeline for linking SDG-needs to actionable investment opportunities.

On **9th December**, EEG participated in the GISD Deals call, which catered to gender inclusive investments in sub-Saharan Africa and Southeast Asia.

On **15th December**, EEG Chairperson had a brainstorming session with GISD Alliance Co-Chair to discuss key deliverables of the GISD for the year 2021. The discussion touched on several issues;

- Creating a UN recognition framework to recognise companies that excel in sustainability
- Expanding GISDs participation/communication through the UN offices in each country
- An element of pragmatism is required on all GISD documents to be understood by different sectors
- To hold a virtual conference or set of panels to allow GISD members to share topics of relevance in their organisations.
