"UNESCOHK Day" Successfully Held

On the 28th of September 2021, "UNESCOHK Day" was successfully held by UNESCO Hong Kong Association (UHKA) in Central Market Hong Kong. The event comprised of 4 sections: publishing of UNESCO World conference on Education for sustainable development - China Education for Sustainable Development Country Report - For Hong Kong Regional Report , Sharing Session on Sustainable Development Goals(SDGs), Voice from Youth and Sharing Session on Architecture Conservation and Culture Inheritance. Experts from a wide variety of industries were invited and the event was also broadcasted on Facebook live streaming, attracting Hong Kong citizens from all walks of life, across all age groups to take part.

The publishing of UNESCO World conference on Education for sustainable development - China Education for Sustainable Development Country Report -Thong Kong Regional Report was announced during the opening speech delivered by Prof. Karen Q.Cheung, Executive President & Secretary-General of UNESCO Hong Kong Association and Director of Hong Kong Institute of Education for Sustainable Development (HiESD). Over the past 18 years, UHKA and HiESD, as the member of the Chinese National Federation of UNESCO Clubs, Centres and Associations (CNFUCA), have established strong international and national networks, including: regional reporting member of United Nations Global Compact (UNGC), member of the China Academic Committee of the United Nations Principles for Responsible Management Education (UN PRME), registered association of United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA) - Partnership for SDGs, expert advisory organization and service provider of the *United Nations* Industrial Development Organization(UNIDO), member institution of the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network (UNSDSN) and networks of member schools, expert committee and partner institutions.

Prof. Cheung also shared the latest updates from the 2021 UNESCO World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development held in Berlin, including: "Education for Sustainable Development A roadmap - ESD for 2030", "Learn for our Planet" and "Berlin Declaration on ESD". To practically implement and promote the SDGs in Hong Kong, HiESD takes the responsibility of research, development and training, the "Sustainable Development Planning" teaching system was developed and the World Institute of Sustainable Development Planners (WISDP) was also established. She also highlighted that various regional cases were included in China's Country Report, for example, "the building of SDG lifelong learning system in Hong Kong" was intclueded in Chapter 3: Implementation Strategies; project by Education University of Hong Kong entitled "Life Education and Citizen Science through Tree Protection and Conservation", and a HiESD project named "Smart Healthy School" were included as implementation examples in section 5.
