LiveWell Initiative LWI, a public health Non-Government Organization, is a Self-sustaining International award winning non-profit Social Enterprise which empowers the people through health illiteracy.

LWI is a Multiple award-winning organization, both locally and internationally including the Soroptimist Manchester Award (2005), IAPO PHOTOCONTEST (2013), International HSE Award (December 2014), Lagos Govt CSR Award (2015).

Vision Statement: To half health –illiteracy in Africa by the year 2030, and to increase the life expectancy of the people to 70 by the year 2030.

Mission Statement: To improve the health status of the people of Africa through wellness promotion and health empowerment and thereby positively influence their health seeking behavior.

Core Values: Transparency, Accountability and Ethics

A GOAL FOCUSED ORGANISATION: Since inception in 2007, LWI has reached over 1.9 million Nigerians including at least 500 disabled persons, and over 3,000 Ghanaians directly and indirectly by proxy contact. For LWI to achieve its set goal to increase the life expectancy of people of Africa, LWI put in place different unique health empowerment programmes which include the rich or poor, young or old, literate or illiterate with gender sensitivity and inclusivity as its watchwords. The programmes through healthcare delivery packages, are taken to the people in the market, taxi parks, mechanic workshops, academic institutions, corporate entities, elites, rural and urban communities... This has indeed enabled the organization to reach out to disparities and various populations.

LWI offers free basic health screenings, community health outreaches, health missions, training programmes, healthcare capacity development, wellness, health and safety, and health fairs, all health programmes are accompanied with free medicines to various communities through its highly qualified team of healthcare experts consisting of public health practitioners, doctors, specialists in various health settings, nurses, pharmacists, health educators, community health workers, nutritionists, social scientists, engineers, lawyers, accountants, physiotherapists, and other trained professionals.

LWI is affiliated to different academic institutions such as the University of Helsinki, Finland, University of Minnesota USA, Harvard T H CHAN School of Public Health, Boston USA, De Moins University Iowa USA, Mayo Clinic Rochester USA, and many Nigerian and African Universities including ERU Egypt, Arap Moi University Kenya, University of Ibadan, Madonna University, Igbinedion University, Adeleke University, University of Lagos, to mention a few. LWI is also affiliated to some corporate organizations as implementation partners such as Guaranty Trust Bank Plc, Access Bank Plc, Stanbic IBT Bank, FSDH Merchant Bank, Inlaks Computers, Nigeria Stock Exchange, Shell Nigeria, MTN, IHS Towers, among others.

LWI is a bona fide member of the UN Global Compact in good standing, with its COP online; it is also a signatory to UN WEPs and a Member of the UN CSEM.

A registered member of the World Hepatitis Alliance also an associate member of the International Alliance of Patient's organization (IAPO), LWI also actively remains a member organization of the Nigeria Britain Association, and an affiliate of NSACC and NACC (Nigeria-South Africa and Nigeria-America Chambers of Commerce).

LWI special programmes include the US Consulate endorsed Grand Health Bazar #GHB; it's a 3 days cross-cutting, multi-sectoral carnival like healthcare exposition with over 1000 attendees annually, from all over Africa and the continent.

Recently the organisation embarked on establishing **Nurse-run Health Posts** manned by state registered nurses, in the slum areas for easy access for the people of low income groups. In line with the UN UHC CSEM2030 Principles, this is in an effort to 'Leave no one behind'. The health posts attend to basic symptoms – headache, malaria, cough, etc...with formal referral linkages to care at the PHC. The programme, fashioned after the Access Afya model in Kenya, is expanding and looking for partners. A Lekki health post is in transition.

Among other unique programmes of the organization are, **Easyhealth**; a monthly mobile home healthcare delivery at client's door step, **QEHES Quarterly Executive Health Enlightenment Seminar** for the corporates, **LWI Bay**; a quick and 24hours run in-house Industrial Sickbay Service health post for the corporates by LWI qualified health care professionals, exemplified by bank sickbays.

LWI currently runs a few subsidiaries, the strongest of which is the Women in Hepatitis Africa WIHA, itself a self funded nonprofit which works in several African countries. Other subsidiaries include LWI Bay, LWI Academy, LWI GREEN, LWI Bay and easyhealth.
