








Screen time during COVID-19 has further increased as a result of public health measures enforced by governments to curb the pandemic.



Because Arroceros has the highest coverage of crown canopy, it lowers temperature in the city decreasing the risks of heat-related ailments like stroke.

In this 2.2 hectare patch of green, you can see 3.000 species of trees. 1.567 of them are matured and endangered.



Our tree friends in the forest do their best to absorb at least 30 tons of air particulates to reduce air pollution in the city of Manila effectively decreasing risks of lung cancer and other upper respiratory diseases.

And the best thing is...they are also producing more fresh oxygen supply for the residents and anyone who visits the city!

My friends and I celebrated when Manila City Ordinance No. 8607 declaring Arroceros Forest Park as a permanent protected site was ratified.

All your efforts to #SaveArroceros allowed us to have a forever HOME!

There are a LOT of fireflies in the forest. And because of Arroceros' clean air, we are able to produce our own light!

We are just 3 of the colorful 26 resident birds in Arroceros! Would you like to meet all of us?



Did you know that Arroceros' ecosystem also improves infiltration, reduces surface runoff, and prevents siltation?

No? Well, this means that the forest park is helping prevent flooding in the whole 5th district of Manila!

And guys! We were seen on TV, newspaper and social media several times! The #SaveArroceros media coverage amounted to Php111.302.270.08 public relations value and Php 44.531.245.30 advertisement value.



Arroceros Forest Park can now continue to exist for the next generation and appreciate its majestic beauty!

Just a quick history! Arroceros used to be the trading site for Chinese rice merchants during the Spanish period and the site for the historic Fabrica de Arroceros that was used as a military garrison during the American occupation. Shards of artifacts from the Ming Dynasty were found during one of the excavation activities in the forest park.





















Solar-powered light post

Earth Day 2021's theme, "Restore Our Earth," is a reminder of the opportunities that lay ahead for us specifically in saving and conserving energy. Manila Doctors Hospital has taken several steps by committing to sustainable solutions in the utilization of its resources.

Since 2005, **LED lights** are used Hospital-wide. The average LED lasts up to 100,000 operating hours or more which proves to be cost-effective and environment-friendly solution.

Solar-powered light posts are used around the vicinity of the Hospital. Aside from it being a greener alternative to traditional lighting, its energy source is unlimited. Moreover, inverter air conditioning units utilize lower electricity consumption compared to non-inverter type air conditioners.

Aside from conserving Earth's energy, Manila Hospital committed to Doctors adapting environment friendly solutions like switching from plastic and styrofoam to eco-friendly packaging. This is made from recycled materials that greatly reduces the consumption raw materials.

Manila Doctors has prohibited the use of Styrofoam within its premises and instead utilizes food containers and utensils that are made of cornstarch biocompostables. Serving single-use plastic water bottles are also avoided.

Biocompostable packaging is made from natural materials which fully decompose into usable compost. When it breaks down, it releases valuable nutrients into the soil, aiding the growth of trees and plants.




Sustainable and cost-effective materials can also be found in Manila Doctors Hospital's infrastructures. Through this environment-friendly solution. Manila Doctors not only creates positive impact on the environment, but also protects the health of the whole MDH community and its patients.

All renovations in the Hospital even before the construction of its newest building, fiber cement and metal furring were utilized. Fiber cement is termite-free. reusable, sturdy, and resistant weather-damages. It also has neutral components unlike other materials that include volatile organic compounds (VOC), which can cause headache, nausea, asthma, and ear irritation. While metal furring refers to a non-structural metal attachment that is used to support the ceiling, which is also reusable, and stronger than other materials.

From then on, there was zero purchase of materials made of wood, except for recycled woods from sawdust.








One of the green initiatives of Manila Doctors is also manifested in its patient-centered care. In the peripheral intravenous line management for Pediatric patients, the Hospital makes use of Intravenous (IV) plastic bottles as substitute for transparent dressing to prevent IV burns.

IV burns can typically occur because an IV catheter either backs out of the vein it is situated in or causes damage to the vein wall. Thus, such innovation is not only cost-effective and environment-friendly, but is also safe for MDH patients.

Manila Doctors Hospital utilizes variable refrigerant flow, saving at least 46.5% on power bills. The entire hospital, composed of three buildings, uses Refrigerant 134A, a greener alternative and environmentally-safe chemical certified by the European standards.

The use of *Chlorofluorocarbons* (*CFC*) and *Hydrochlorofluorocarbons* (*HCFC*) as refrigerants has its impact on ozone depletion and global warming. Thus, several alternatives have been used as its replacement, specifically the Refrigerant 134A.















To continue Manila Doctors Hospital's commitment on the environment, particularly on water conservation, the reutilization of its resources is apparent to how they construct their facilities. Facilities Management Department (FMD) introduced an innovative way to harvest and recycle water from the Hemodialysis machine through the Reverse Osmosis Filter Backwash.

This machine can discharge at least 15,000 liters of backwash water in a day and the "Class B" water produced after this process is then used for comfort rooms, the internal biodiversity area of the hospital, and cleaning of air-conditioning units and the hospital vicinity. It is safe and guaranteed to not cause any possible infection to its employees and patients.

Additionally, the searing hot water from the Central Reprocessing and Sterilization Services (CRSS) used in the sterilization of instruments and medical devices were also being reutilized. Since this is directed to the main sewer line, it dissolves the oil sludge coming from the nearby restaurants. With this practice, it helps prevent the flooding around the hospital.

Women and women's groups in the Philippines have proven to be crucial partners in leading inclusive and resilient emergency and recovery efforts, as well as repairing social breakdowns, rebuilding trust, and reaching the most vulnerable. Filipino women have a strong understanding of their communities and are best placed to address the disproportionate impact of emergencies on women and girls.

Despite the limitation that COVID19 presented, the MDH internal community forged ahead in highlighting the contribution of Women in society.














Which province of the Philippines did the first Women's Suffrage bill come from?

















#### **ANSWER:**

It was in Cebu that the first Philippine bill on women's suffrage was filed in 1907 by Congressman Filemon Sotto.

















How many years have passed since Filipino women won the right to vote?















#### **ANSWER:**

It has been 82 years.

On April 30, 1937, in a special plebiscite, Filipino women won the right to vote.

The general elections held on December 14, 1937 became the first balloting in the country in which Filipino women were allowed to vote and run for public office.

















Who was the founder of the Asociacion Feminista Ilongga (Association of Ilonga Feminists), one of the first and most impactful feminist organizations in the country?

















What was the name of the feminist organization joined by Jose Rizal's sister, Trinidad?

















#### **ANSWER:**

Trinidad was part of the Asociacion Feminista Filipina, the first feminist organization in the Philippines.

They worked to increase female presence in political office, increase reforms for prisons, education, and labor sectors, and combat prostitution and gambling in the country.

















# TRIVIA QUESTION #5

In 1937, Filipinas won the right to vote. What was the quota of women voters required by the 1935 constitution?

















### **ANSWER:**

Women's suffrage was included in the 1935 Constitution, with the requirement that it will be passed with a vote of at least 300,000 women voters, a rather steep threshold at that time. Suffragists worked hard to achieve this target by raising awareness. The bill was passed when 444,725 Filipinas voted yes.
