EDP Redes España committed to the 10 Principles of the Global Compact

On December 16, 2020, EDP and Macquarie signed an agreement for the development of the electricity distribution activity in Spain through the creation of a holding company, called EDP Redes España, which owns the distribution companies E-REDES (previously Hidrocantábrico Distribución Eléctrica), VIESGO Distribución and BEGASA (grouped in Viesgo Infraestructuras).

During the 2021 financial year, all the Environmental, Sustainability and Environmental Management Policies and Systems have been approved in a staggered manner, in order not to cause disruption to the activity and to ensure the quality of management in the new company, incorporating best practices from existing systems.
