

## HIGHLIGHTING OUR NEW ARTISTS IN 2020

### JENNY HOLZER

For 40+ years, Jenny HOLZER has presented her astringent ideas, arguments, and sorrows in public places and international exhibitions Her medium is thought/text, and a public dimension is integral to the delivery. Holzer's practice rivals ignorance and violence with intellect, humor, humanity, and courage.

In 2020, THE SKATEROOM in partnership with HOLZER released the limited *IMPEACH* editions.

### **RAYMOND PETTIBON**

Raymond PETTIBON's influential oeuvre engages a wide spectrum of American iconography.

He is also famous for his work with bands like Black Flag and Sonic Youth.

In 2020, The Skateroom released two limited editions created in the spirit of Hokusai's wave, were hand-signed by Raymond PETTIBON himself.

### YOSHITOMO NARA

Yoshitomo NARA is a Japanese artist best known for his paintings of children and animals that appear simultaneously sweet and sinister, as seen in his work *Do Not Disturb!*, 1996.

For our first collaboration with Yoshitomo NARA, we launched two triptych —sets of 3 skateboards and one solo skateboard named *Peace Girl.*

### SKATEISTAN'S FIFTH SKATE SCHOOL BUILDING THE BAMYAN SKATEPARK

Bamyan is SKATEISTAN's fifth Skate School.

Afghanistan remains an unsafe place for many children and is still ranked in the world's three worst countries to be born a girl. Around 40% of Afghanistan's school aged children do not go to school.

SKATEISTAN aims to help these children pursue their own passions and dreams and ultimately, to become positive role models in their own communities.

\*Note 2021: Sadly, due to the current political climate, the operations in all three of Skateistan's locations in Afghanistan are temporarily suspended.

### ABOUT BAMYAN:

- 800+ active students
- 41% girls
- 5 ethnicities in student body
- 92% from low income backgrounds
- ambition to welcome 20% of students with disabilities
- Estimated 20 jobs for local people

# CONCRETE JUNGLE FOUNDATION THE FREEDOM SKATEPARK, JAMAICA

CONCRETE JUNGLE FOUNDATION is an international non-profit organization that uses skateboarding as a tool to stimulate positive personal and community development for underprivileged youth around the world.

Located just outside Kingston in Eight Mile Bull Bay, the 1,300m<sup>2</sup> Freedom Skatepark is the largest skatepark in Jamaica and the first and only in the capital region.

Built under the direction of CONCRETE JUNGLE FOUNDATION in early 2020 by some 40 international and local volunteers, the park runs their signature Edu-Skate programme and loans skateboards to its users.

#### ABOUT FREEDOM SKATEPARK:

- 1000 children reached yearly
- 170+ students registered for educational program with average age 11 years old and 30% girls
- 50 attendees at homework program
- 375+ users for get-on-board program with average age 13 years old and 34% girls
- 6 interns
- 10 people employed

### FREE MOVEMENT SKATEBOARDING EMPOWERING REFUGEE YOUTH WITH SKATEBOARDING

FREE MOVEMENT SKATEBOARDING is an international organization which offers skateboarding lessons to the local community in Athens and in refugee camps around the city.

They offer daily sessions, including educational programs, creative workshops and girls-only sessions.

Specializing in offering activities for kids that are suffering from childhood trauma.

### ABOUT FREE MOVEMENT:

- 1000 children reached yearly
- 60 participants weekly (250 before COVID)
- 97% refugees
- 23 ethnicities in student body
- 40% girls

Located at the heart of one of Rio de Janeiro's most dangerous favelas is Maré Favela Skatepark, a community-driven space for the empowerment of local kids.

### MONSTERS ON WHEELS RENOVATING A BELOVED DIY SKATEPARK

### BYRRRH & SKATE FREE SESSIONS FOR UNDERPRIVILEGED KIDS

In the summer of 2019, 7 artists were invited for one-week residencies at THE SKATEROOM GALLERY in Brussels, to transform it into their workshop, create works of art on skateboards and to showcase their work.

The challenge was to create a collection of skateboards that would be auctioned during Brussels Gallery Weekend to raise funding for BYRRRH & SKATE's local initiation programs allowing them to offer free skateboarding lessons to local underprivileged youth as well as MONSTERS ON WHEELS' renovation project of an indoor skatepark.

### CHANGE THE REF

CHANGE THE REF was founded to give American youth the tools they need to be empowered to make changes to critical issues that affect the United States, through education, conversation, and activism. It uses urban art and non-violent creative confrontation to expose the disastrous effects of mass shootings and gun violence.

### CASA AMARELA

Founded by the artist JR, CASA AMARELA is a house at the top of a favela in Rio de Janeiro which functions as a community center. Through collaborations with local NGOs and residents of the favela, the space offers art workshops, cultural field trips as well as languages, photography, theatre and sports classes.

### **CERTIFIED B CORP**

Certified B Corps are distinguishing themselves in a cluttered marketplace by offering a positive vision of a better way to do business.

In 2019, we achieved that goal.

We've been on a journey of self-improvement ever since. We proudly hold a score of 97.4 today, but

with the help of the B Impact Assessment we have committed to improving our B Corp score by 5% each year.

This is woven into every part of what we do at THE SKATEROOM.

### **BECOMING CO2 NEUTRAL**

Being "carbon neutral" means that –through a transparent process of calculating emissions, reducing those emissions and offsetting residual emissions– net carbon emissions equal zero.

Since 2016, THE SKATEROOM compensates our entire yearly carbon footprint through the independent audit company CO2logic and Vincotte –an international independent certification body.

### A COMMITMENT TO SUSTAINABILITY

Truly planet-friendly business is a difficult and endless journey. We make a commitment to sustainability in all our work, but we can't pretend we're there yet.

We have a commitment to realizing the following goals by 2022:

- Localize production to reduce emissions
   and improve our value chain
- Compensate our wood usage via forest conservation projects
- Reduce our plastic footprint by finding alternatives for all packaging and single-use plastic products, including the bottles we drink from in our office.

We are already well on the way to meeting these aims.
