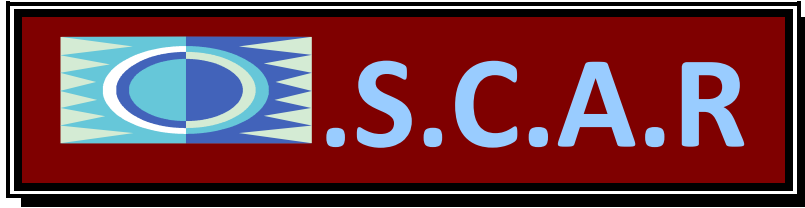

The Outreach Social Care Project- OSCAR embraces, support and enact, within their sphere of influence, a set of core values in the areas of human rights, labour standards, the environment and anti-corruption:

Human Rights Activities/ Sustainable Development Goals achieved during this reporting period:

A. Initiative one:

Together with communities and volunteers have worked to ensure that the needs of the most marginalized women and indigenous people were brought to the forefront of policy and were recipients of the resources and programs being mobilized under the Global Goals for Sustainable Development and 2030 Agenda, which offers an historic opportunity to eradicate extreme poverty and ensure no one is left behind.

Outreach Social Care Project- OSCAR has strengthened the conservation, sustainable livelihoods, environmental sustainability and social justice through re-building capacity. The organization has addressed poverty issues, a campaign to prevent large-scale deforestation in Katanga Province of the Democratic Republic of Congo, while respecting the rights and livelihoods of local Congolese people.

Mainly due to the lack of law enforcement and a lack of funding, fauna suffers from human activities such as illegal hunting and deforestation. It is quite common that local populations have a low level of information about their native wildlife populations, especially in a large country like the DR Congo, leading to immense zones where little is known and where local wildlife are not well studied... Outreach Social Care Project has a better understanding the nature of wildlife and human interactions in the Katanga Province area of the DR Congo in order to better protect endangered species, and in particular the area’s population of great apes.

The initiative has educated the Congolese Local people about the importance of taking care of the conservation of Apes as they have been a great alarming number of Apes living in poor and unregulated condition in Katanga Province of the Democratic Republic of Congo.

The initiative has enabled the transfer of knowledge and skills through a practical project that was based on a local social inclusiveness, human rights, gender equality, women empowerment, strong sustainability of results, and the management structures issue.

The initiative has targeted key members of the community, women, educators and community leaders who were able to transfer skills and knowledge broadly in the community.

The initiative has impacted 250 educators, 200 leaders, 350 girls and 500 women in their communities. They have benefited from gaining the knowledge; hand-on experience on environmental and skills required for sustainable living, the indirect impact has been approximately 550 community members and further indirect impact on the community at large through the community leaders.

B. Initiative two:

The organization has undertaken the initiative that delivered to and supported young women and young people affected and infected by COVID- 19, through the provision of prevention, awareness, livelihood as well the psychosocial support/ mental health.

The health, safety and well-being of young women and young people in South Africa and Democratic Republic of Congo, were and will remain our top priorities.

While we continue to advocating for equal opportunities, justice for all, and access to livelihoods and speaking out against all forms of gender-based violence, United Nations Global Sustainable Development Goals and COVID- 19, we will not forget to look out for the young women and young people in our circle of influence.

COVID-19 has been both a health pandemic that is killing thousands and a socio-economic crisis that has threatened the welfare of millions of young and old women, children and young people around the world, particular in South Africa and Democratic Republic of Congo where the health care systems is not in good stands, in rural areas and townships.

Young and old women, children and young people as well as the LGBTIQ2+ communities have limited access to economic and social services compounding their vulnerability to COVID-19 as well as other existing health conditions (HIV/ TB) and other disasters as well the current COVID Variants.

High prevalence of comorbidities that weaken immune systems like HIV and AIDS, maternal illness and TB were likely to increase risk of infection. As a grass-roots organization: Outreach Social Care Project advanced gender equality at the grass-roots level in advocating to access basic rights, health care, psycho-social support, mental health and livelihoods. 520 people have benefited from this initiative. Outreach Social Care Project has measured the impact of this initiative through monitoring and evaluation, numbers of beneficiaries.
