- We are working on human rights and improving working conditions and occupational health and safety (OHS) of 2,800 farmers and 280 sanitation workers in Punjab province of Pakistan.
- We are working with businesses (rice mills) to reach out to farmers and improve climate-friendly farm practices at large scale. The farmers we are engaged with, produce more than 7K tons of rice paddy.
