### **Part II. Description of Actions**

**CHANCE** (**CH**ildren **A**gai**N**st **C**anc**E**r) is a Lebanese non-profit, non-denominational, apolitical, association that relies on volunteer work and donations to provide assistance to children with cancer and blood disorders from birth to the age of 18 years. CHANCE promotes as well cancer prevention and cancer control in Lebanon.

Founded in 2002 by Dr. Roula Farah, along with a team of medical professionals, parents and volunteers who now constitue its Executive, Medical, and Para-Medical committees.

CHANCE is an active member of Childhood Cancer International (CCI) and of the International Brain Tumor Alliance (IBTA). Dr. Roula Farah, CHANCE Association president is a member of the committee of CCI Asia.

For the past 20 years, CHANCE association teams have secured funding to cover the costs of chemotherapy, radiotherapy and surgery to children with cancer and their families in various hospitals ensuring that no child is refused state of the art care for financial reasons.
