However, thanks to the impact of the climate change and global warming, the Everest may not be as appealing due to increasing rate of melting snow. Garbage piled up in the Everest region pose another biggest threat to its survival and the same magnificent.

Worldmed Assistance Nepal & its team member, has been continuously raising awareness against the climate change that has been hampering badly the Himalayas of Nepal. Our slogan "Snow is water and water are life, so no snow means no life," where our team coach the same verse in the mass. Raising voice to Save Mountains - Himalaya so as to save the mother earth. Our leader Mr. Ram Kumar Phuyal, Mr. PK Sherpa together with the young member Mr. Sonam

Sherpa, Worldmed Assistance joined the joint initiative to climb all the leading 7 mountains of the seven continents and collect the garbage disposed of elsewhere in the mountains.

Today, global warming has melted down the snows of the Himalayas and rocks can be clearly seen, making them ugly which usually remained covered with snow all the time. Adversely, the melted snow has risked the lives of many populated and non-populated islands and the environment. So, in regards to the following aspect, we have been organizing various activities and the program. With the same motive, our team leader Mr. PK Sherpa and his son, carry the same slogan, saving the environment and summiting the Mountain Everest under the banner, Climate Change Campaign Mt. Everest-2021 and which was successfully reached the top of the 8,848.86-metres mountain at 8:50 am, May 23, 2021.



With the main motive of spreading the message about saving the snow for carrying out life circle, our senior leader ascended mountains and spread the message. So "Worldmed Assistance" global awareness campaign about climate change and global warming and its effect on the environment was officially inaugurated and carried out the project such as collecting the garbage's in the Everest Region of Nepal.

Layers of garbage piled up on Everest Areas are getting visible due to snow melting and light snow by the effect. As the Sagarmatha Pollution Control Committee has been working to clean Mt Everest Territory. However, its activities are focused on the base camp only and not on all the locations below the camps till the Lukla Airport. According to our reports, it has been very urgent to clean up the Camp i.e., Camp 02, 03 & 04 of Everest Region. These Himalayas may not retain the same alluring look thanks to snow melting as an impact of global warming & climate changes. Our leader Mr. Sherpa has been running this campaign to clean Everest since back 2010 and we Worldmed Assistance" put an effort to join this campaign since 2019 but due to COVID-19, pandemic our campaign got postponed and literally this campaign got on the slow process and is on the work form to clean the mountains areas with the slogan, "Save the Himalayas-Save the Environment" — A clean-up Expedition.

Environmentalists call the onslaught of humans a "circus"; others criticize the "cesspit" of garbage, discarded oxygen tanks, and litter left behind. As such activities, making our environment and climate, worst an ever before. The Climbers are the main source of pollution in Everest and its environment. Since everybody is conscious to save his/her life, they throw away anything that is a burden. Besides, some climbers die in terms of the climb. Garbage since the first human successful attempt to conquer Everest in 1953 remains piled up on the Everest. Besides dead bodies, garbage on the Everest includes

food packages, can bins, oxygen cylinders, gas, tents among others the garbage we found in the region and that makes Everest Ugly every day and you do not find much snow in the mountains which makes mountains are being ugly and naked. Even as Everest still casts a majestic spell from a distance it is getting less charming to the climbers.



Worldmed Assistance and its members have completed and running a campaign to clean Everest since 2010. As of now, the member has collected six dead bodies as well as a huge amount of garbage scattered around Everest. During the period, the Cleaners spent weeks collecting food wrappings, cans, bottles, and empty toxic cylinders in the region, and such cleanup help on the environment, nature, and the mountains gain their strength back and the trekkers can feel the same beauty and majestic of our nature and Everest. Further, in reach, our organization has done a few initiatives of the Plantation program in Taplejung District of Nepal as well in relation to nature and the environment.



So, we Worldmed is happy and honored, will be taking such reasonability with the slogan of campaign, "Save the Himalayas - Save the Environment & Nature".
