Bachoura district was severely ruined as a result of the civil war between 1975 and 1990. BDD decided to raise this area from ashes and transform it into one of the best and main business landmarks in Lebanon while introducing greenery and landscape areas promoting space and social sharing with the surrounding communities.



As part of the commitment of BDD & ZRE towards the community and its sustainable environment, we aim to build sustainable facilities throughout the BDD campus. Our first permanent construction BDD1227, consisting of 2 office buildings, is targeting LEED Gold certification which we hope to get in Q4-2021 when the project will be entirely completed

While rebuilding the district from ashes, BDD did not spare any effort or money to preserve and restore all the buildings classified as heritage. In this respect, BDD1082, BDD1281 and Saint-Georges Cathedral are proudly considered as living witnesses of these sustainable efforts in the district



To transform the district into a high-end business landmark, it was necessary to have both green & smart buildings. To be aligned with the business demands in terms of the latest technologies, such as Fiber-optic internet with Wi-Fi connection available throughout BDD campus, BDD App communication platform promoting all services such as Parking facilities, eateries, printing, events, news, advertisement, etc.

Innovation

BDD has been at the forefront of connectivity in Beirut from the very beginning, boasting the first ever redundant fiber campus in Beirut. In the custom multi-VLAN campus network, each tenant can have separate gateways, ISPs and redundancy all connected to the core campus switches and then propagated on a dedicated tenant VLAN.

This infrastructure allows tenants to walk around campus while still being connected to their office network with no hassle. Furthermore, the campus has a dedicated management VLAN that controls BMS, custom door locks, cameras and screens.

Digitization

The true innovation is in the custom software and hardware developed by BDD.

With a simple web interface, each tenant HR is able to add new hires and the software will automatically create access credentials to all the tenant doors, credentials for access to the VLAN and automatic access to facilities that the tenant has subscribed to. Residents are also able to pay for facilities (such as gym) through the mobile interface which would then automatically give them access for the period of their subscription as well as provide them guest Wi-Fi if needed when using the facilities.

Team

However, the greatest power of BDD's internal tech lies in the human resources needed to keep all 12 buildings of the campus functioning. The integration of smart hardware and custom software allows BDD's team of 3 people to fully manage the infrastructure and to resolve any issue often before anyone notices.

Infrastructure

BDD's campus is equipped with an access control network promoting safety and security to the community, fiber-optic internet cable networking, electricity 24/7, meeting rooms on demand, events and conference rooms as well as shared spaces.

Emergency Procedures

A qualified Maintenance and Operation team is constantly present at BDD and ready to respond to any emerging situation, in a timely and responsible manner. Emergency procedures were put in place to respond to any critical situation that may happen around BDD's campus in order to safeguard the community as well as the premises. Also, fire emergency and evacuation plans were put in place to respond immediately to any emergency that might take place.

BDD 1227 AWARDED GOLD LEED CERTIFICATION, WITH SUSTAINABILITY AT THE CORE



As part of BDD's commitment to sustainability, numerous measures were taken during the construction and planning phase, given that BDD 1227 is located in a highly populated residential area.

WE LOVE OUR CERTIFIED BUILDING

Accordingly, based on extensive simulations of the location, a 14% improvement in proposed building energy costs have been achieved at BDD 1227. This will result in a reduction of environmental and economic impacts associated with excessive energy use.

Wellbeing & Social Activities

Summer Camps

For the past few years, as part of our efforts to continuously improve STEAM skills in the younger generations, Forward MENA launched Forward MENA Summer camps (previously known as BDD Academy) in collaboration with partners. Forward MENA held different workshops targeting different industries: Fintech meet-up, Pitch to Perfect, Design talks with DIDI & BDD, How to scale & attract large corps, Ideate to innovate, Block chain development boot camp, Effective communication through story-telling, Sales trainings and much more.



| Internship Program

Forward MENA Summer internship program offers students the opportunity to discover the tech and start-up ecosystems while being part of a diversified community that develops their soft and hard skills. It is an eight-week program where interns are offered continuous support, workshops and guidance.

Microsoft Certification

World Bank in partnership with Forward MENA brought Microsoft and LinkedIn's global skills initiative to Lebanon's youth. The initiative offered FREE courses and Microsoft certifications for the 3 most wanted technical jobs, along with 7 other learning paths for 1,500 candidates. These courses have been identified as the top 10 in-demand jobs and are most likely to grow even more with the increased digital transformation post-COVID-19 – having the greatest number of job openings, having a steady growth over the past four years, and paying a livable wage. 2,868 qualified candidates joined the program, with 170 receiving Microsoft certificates.



4 EDUCATION

Code.Org

Forward MENA has teamed up with the World Bank Group, to pave the way for children to step into the world of computer science and coding, as part of the Skilling up Mashreq (SUM) Initiative. In partnership with Code.org, the global nonprofit organization dedicated to expanding access to computer science to the youth, coding courses were offered online for free, for children ages 6 to 18 across Lebanon, in English, French and Arabic. By participating in these virtual courses, children learnt how to code through basic games offered for free, from the comfort of their homes. By adding a hint of fun to learning, children enhanced their skillsets and advance in STEAM education (science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics). These courses helped children to be more competitive in the future workplace. In addition, by gaining digital skills, children can work towards closing the talent gap in the market.









| Skilling up Lebanon Project

The Skilling up Lebanon project is a one-year project, funded by the World Bank. The project aims to support the promotion of digital skills. The project aims to prepare young women and men for the local, regional and global jobs of the future and to attract digital technology (DT) players to invest in the region.

The Skilling Up Lebanon project includes 5 pilot programs:

- Career guidance for high school students
- Internship program for both undergraduate and freshly graduate
- Three digital and technical programs, each addressing one skill needed in the market







| PROSPECTS Project

The PROSPECTS project is in partnership with UNICEF and the World Bank. It aims to bring together the public sector, private sector, key digital technology players, educational institutions, and vulnerable young people to develop a more equitable, systematic, and empowering bridge from skills training to employment opportunities in the digital economy while enhancing the labor intermediation between supply, demand, educational providers and policy-makers.
