


MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO



This truly has been one of the toughest years for EBCO (BITAR), our country Lebanon, and the world. The covid-19 pandemic has led to a dramatic loss of human life worldwide and presented unprecedented challenges in all work sectors. What hurts the most is that covid-19 has only been the tip of the iceberg. Economic collapse, political instability, bank sector linked to Ponzi scheme, deterioration of the lira, and the August 4 explosion. The Beirut port blast ripped the city to shreds. It killed more than 178 people, left more than 6,500 injured, 300,000 homeless, and severely damaged critical infrastructure and medical supplies.

Indeed it has been tough and still is. Despite it all, we gathered all our efforts to support our communities in all possible ways. We distributed food supplies through our sister company

Osud, a major fruits & vegetables producer and distributor in Lebanon to more than 3,500 families in need. After the blast, all our teams were gathered and instructed to help in any possible way. We cleaned streets, provided food and shelter, and renovated more than 120 homes in less than a month time. We provided support to many associations such as the American University of Beirut, Ajialouna Organization, United **Nations** Compact Network Lebanon, Save the Children, Arcenciel, Toumouh Association, to name some.

We have rooted our partnerships with many local associations and we believe more than ever in the role of the private sector to help our country and communities survive the critical period we are passing through. Hand in hand we can make it. We urge the international community to step in to help Lebanon in its toughest times.

We survived. We will survive.

We care about the environment and the community we live in.
We believe that our company has a responsibility to give something good back from the fruits of our success.





During 2018, striving for maintaining and enhancing our work environment was one of the main points in our SDG action plan.

SAFETY MATTERS

Everyone in the construction industry knows that the work can be inherently dangerous, with collapsing materials, falls and accidents involving heavy machinery all serving a legitimate threat. When an accident occurs, countless problems can result; human life is put at risk, working days are lost, materials and equipment may be damaged. Many of the common construction hazards can be contained or avoided if proper safety measures are taken. Ensuring that everyone on site is following safety protocols protects the lives of each person involved in the work and ultimately allows the project to be completed on time and within budget.

Our Occupational Health & Safety Manual is our most comprehensive health and safety guide. It's a must-have for every member on site and helps recognize and protects the team against health and safety hazards. The procedures pertaining to the implementation of safety on site are also highlighted.

10' Talk is a 10-minute safety and health awareness initiative launched in July 2018 where all site staff gather once a week for a 10-minute talk to raise awareness about a particular health and safety topic. The talk is administered by the Safety Officer along with the Foremen on site. This initiative created a positive environment whereby every individual feels the urge to report any unsafe condition on site.




COVID-19 Action Plan

We take the pandemic very seriously since day one. We have launched our "Save Us" campaign to fight Covid-19 and implement all necessary precautions to save ourselves and our community.

The kick off workshop discussed the action plan that needs to be followed in EBCO (BITAR) during the COVID-19 crisis situation and to provide clear guidance for safe operations through the prevention, early detection and handling of COVID-19 cases.

- Escalate any COVID-19 related issues;
- Follow the advice of the World Health Organization (WHO) and specific country Health Authority requirements;
- Avoid any social media fake news and forwarding of this type of medial;
- Work with the client and other stakeholders to ensure health authorities and other measures including EBCO (BITAR) measures are being taken to prevent the spread of the virus;
- Undertake all necessary measures to ensure continuity of the project;
- Brief the contents of the COVID-19 Action Plan to all team members.





Enforce COVID-19 Control Measures Inside the Office

Ensure the following measures are enforced in Beirut office:

- 2m spacing rules on desk seating;
- Avoid and minimize use of meeting rooms;
- Provide adequate face masks, hand sanitizers and disposable gloves around the office (replenish all times);
- Masks needed for face to face conversations, walking around offices;
- Insist everyone adopts self-governance for masks etc;
- Stop and challenge people who do not comply with measures and ask them to use, repeated no-compliance to be referred to HR (includes managers).



EBCO (BITAR) General COVID-19 Control Measures

These measures apply to the Head Office:

- Ensure hand sanitizers and soap are available and used across EBCO (BITAR) premises and sites;
- Minimize meetings and utilize video conferencing technology such as Microsoft Teams;
- Maintain social distancing Maintain at least 1.5-meter distance between yourself and anyone who is coughing or sneezing;
- Avoid large gatherings;
- Temperature checking. Thermal heat checking devices shall be installed at the main entrance points to the different offices and sites;
- Ensure there is one single entry point to the offices and sites to make sure all people undertake these checks as a mandatory requirement;
- Avoid clients' visits to the offices unless deemed necessary;
- Make sure that all staff members who are sick or who show COVID-19 symptoms to notify their line managers or project managers in order to take the necessary action;
- Ensure waste management facilities are managed correctly and in particular those related to the disposal of potential hazardous waste (face masks, gloves, tissues, etc.);
- Undertake regular disinfection of the offices, once monthly by a specialized company;
- Minimize (or withhold) the services of the cleaning companies for a while until this crisis is over and rely on internal resources to clean and clear the bins on a daily basis;
- Equip selected company employees with the disinfecting and sanitizing equipment and request them to disinfect the offices including the communal areas (such as toiles, kitchens) once per week;
- Ensure that the project sites have placed posters (health education) in prominent areas such as project offices, canteens, notice boards, toilets, etc;
- Ensure contractors are undertaking the same health measures as advised by the local health authorities;
- Ensure contractors are undertaking regular disinfection of project site communal areas such as toilets, canteens;
- Minimize the construction workers' ability to enter to the project site offices.

As per the goal #11 of the agenda, we aim to provide safe and a sustainable city through road safety with a focus on sustainable urbanization and environmental impact.

EBCO (BITAR) SUPPORTS ARDNA NGO

EBCO (BITAR) supports ARDNA NGO in its efforts to build organizations that contribute to development. ARDNA (Association of Rural Development and National Aid) is a Lebanese non-profit humanitarian organization established in 2021, whose mission is to empower the deprived small-scale producers to reach sufficiency and be provided by financial and skillful practices. At ARDNA, we invest in people through our capacity building program, so they gain the knowledge required to drive sustainable growth. Souk El Balad is our first capacity building activity focused on strengthening & supporting local producers and rural development. A multitude of ethnicities and religions are inextricably woven into the social fabric of Souk El Balad family, making it the most diverse souk in Lebanon. More than 75 producers are assembled each Saturday at Souk El Balad in Beirut Souks. Sajjette is a Lebanese youth empowerment initiative aiming to preserve Lebanese traditions with a twist. The project is developed by ARDNA capacity building as well. We likely have multiple projects in progress as we focus on benefits realization to our community. As Lebanon is facing crippling economic crisis, ARDNA is struggling to help needy families to survive and get outside the complex array of issues that the country faces. However, ARDNA is seeking an international assistance in form of donation in order to be able to achieve its mission.









Souk El Balad Beirutetna

With the aim of reviving Downtown Beirut and bringing back life to the city ahead of the holiday's season, Souk El Balad in collaboration with Beirutetna Festival, and other partners launched a festival in Beirut Souks from Dec 2 till Dec 30. The area was filled with street food area, drinks area, concerts, entertainment shows for kids, handcrafts, Christmas parades, live bands and dance shows. All the activities were free of charge. SDG 12 RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION

Striving towards making part of the achievement of the 12th SDG involves the efficient management of natural resources and the reduction of waste pollutant products.

YSIP PROGRAM

Over the course of 10 months, EBCO (BITAR) team developed a solution that is relevant to the company and at the same time addresses innovation and the SDGs. The team offered a solution that controls pollution, reduces cost and the excessive use of raw materials through minimizing concrete wastage. The company is intended to use the wastage in forming concrete building blocks that can be used in construction sites and make its own concrete decor and furnishings like benches, side table, fire pit, chairs, dining table, planters, statues, ashtrays and stepping stones. This solution not only reduces the cost of site cleaning and disposal but also yields significant environmental, social, reputational & economic benefits. At the environmental scale, EBCO (BITAR) solution will be contributing in:

- 1. Improving air and water quality as well as reducing gas emissions
- 2. Reducing ground and soil contamination
- 3. Reducing noise emission
- 4. Minimizing the extraction of resources along with reducing energy consumption which is associated with manufacturing new materials

Social value includes promoting skills & employment for designers, contractors, engineers and workers as well as creating healthier, safer, more resilient communities and promoting social innovation. If we will be delivering works to public sector, this secures the best value from the public money being spent and contributes to more inclusive growth, a vital goal for the Lebanese community. Economic value includes cost saving by introducing more efficient production practices and generating a higher profit. The application of this solution will boost the company reputation and exposure by making people more aware of EBCO BITAR values.

The program takes place on a local and global level. Innovators from around the world had the opportunity to engage with each other and exchange experiences at the end of the program. For the purpose of achieving the full capacity of the Innovators, EBCO (BITAR) team was matched with Mentors and Experts to guide them in the design, development and testing of the solution. The program included in-person and virtual learning sessions, team challenges, mentoring and coaching, live case studies and feedback/ sparring session. The program holded many advantages that benefited our team:

- 1. It increased the knowledge of our team and employees on sustainable business strategies and practices
- 2. It encouraged our employees to embrace breakthrough mindsets that will support the development of new solutions
- 3. Respond to current and future challenges and opportunities
- 4. Have access to a global network of young innovators and experts



EBCO (BITAR) team joined the program at a later time. It didn't attend the first Kick-off workshop where different teams met to discuss and align their expectations of the program. Our team was absent on Camp 1 also where YSIP innovators met to brainstorm, analyze and create solutions for their companies based on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG)s. Camp 2 emphasized the process of defining and refining challenges, while Camp 3 took place under the name of "Solutions Development". It allowed our innovators to start transforming the identified challenges in EBCO (BITAR) to sustainably-constructed solution. The fourth YSIP camp took place under the name of "Solutions Testing and Validation". This camp focused on refining and validating problem solution related to the company. The last camp took place under the name of "Offboarding". During this phase, EBCO (BITAR) team showcased the solution, and focused on how to apply breakthrough thinking within the company. It is great to mention that the 4 camps were moderated with the use of Zoom and Slack as primary online resources. The workshop facilitators were Mr. Nadim Choucair, Canadian Ecosystem Builder and Founder of 2030 Cabinet, and Mr. Hany Rizk, an experienced strategist and Founder of No BS – Innovation Studio.










RECYCLING IS OUR ROUTINE
