To attain this lofty goal, we are expanding our frontiers and establishing a 'new' presence in the social space – The GPHU.

We are embracing the principles of Diversity, Inclusivity, and Forecasting into the future learning space.

I am pleased to confirm that LiveWell Initiative LWI reaffirms its support of the Ten Principles of the United Nations Global Compact in the areas of Human Rights, Labour, Environment and Anti-Corruption.

It is the policy of the organisation that there should be no discrimination in considering applications for employment including those from the female gender and disabled persons. All employees are given equal opportunities for self-development. As at 2nd October, 2022,

- We have implemented the **PMTCT Preventing Mother to Child Transmission of Viral Hepatitis** in Blighted communities and Provided Sanitizers, Face masks and other protective gear against COVID-19 for these communities even in the post-pandemic era, as a continued commitment towards Health and the Environment.
- In addition to publishing our COVID-19 related Research works in particular Oyo State Nigeria - in open access peer reviewed scientific journals with high impact factor, we are running the only Womens' Wellness Center for Hepatitis in Africa, at our own cost as a CSO - Civil Society Organisation. This also serves as a call to partnership.
- Our **TELEHEALTH** and **TELEMEDICINE** Services in response to COVID-19, are still running well, post-pandemic.
- In the past year, as has been done in the past, we have promoted and are still promoting SDGs 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 10 and 17.
- We are representing GIANT USA as its country office in Nigeria, and we have trained over 30 Interns as Vaccine Infodemic interns in-house at LWI.
- Our Maternal and Child care services at our Health Post among low income indigenous populations (*looking for partners to scale*), is still training Harvard T H Chan School of Public Health Practicum Candidates.
- We have employed more than 70% female workforce at LWI and WIHA jointly.
- Through self effort, the first ever **Womens Wellness Center in Hepatitis (WWC-H)**, continues to cover Antenatal, Maternal and Child Health Services, Family Planning and Immunization.
- The free screening of ALL PREGNANT WOMEN for viral hepatitis, continues unabated although there is no funding for the exercise
- In its pursuit of the **SDGs 1,3,4,5,6,10 and 17** the organization continues to collaborate with government, private sector, educational institutions, developmental partners and communities.
- Although a NonProfit Organisation, LWI continues to Blaze the Trail, but seeks for partners. Thank you.

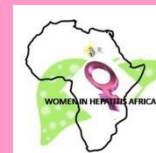

In line with SDG17, LWI last year hosted its 4th Liver Health Confab #LHC2021 Which was hosted with participants from 22 countries around the world. The event had Speakers from Leading Academic Institutions in the USA Including University of Michigan, New York University, etc Our subsidiary Women in Hepatitis Africa WIHA, continues to give a strong voice to the Women of Africa (SDG 3, 4, 5) in the elimination of viral hepatitis. We are expanding our Health Missions to the Poor and Underserved people. We are Screening Pregnant Women for Viral Hepatitis in our unrelenting PMTCT in Hepatitis programme and we are empowering low income women with IPC Training in Infection Prevention and Control.(SDG 1, 3, 6,10), accompanied with the distribution of Sanitizers, Face Masks etc We joined the Commonwealth Institute to reward Extraordinary Women Advancing Healthcare and we shall soon be hosting the first EWAH Awards in Nigeria, in December this year. (SDG 3, 17)

In this annual Communication on Progress, we provide an indepth description of our actions to continually improve the integration of the Global Compact and its principles into our business strategy, culture and daily operations. We also commit to sharing this information with our Multisectoral Stakeholders and Communities, using our primary channels of communication. We marked the World Humanitarian Day 2022 with a Resilience Programme where we distributed gifts and Wellness packs to a low income community. We also handed out IPC 'Well Mother Well Baby' Packs and gave out Haematinics to the women and children. We are Promoting Handwashing, Water and Sanitation. As part of our SDG6 Programmes on Personal Hygiene and Handwashing. In addition we marked World Patient Safety Day #WPSD2022 on September 18th 2022 and gave our Pregnant Women a Voice, to speak out on Safe Birthing for Mother and Child, which is a continuing agenda, in line with the WHO Declaration 2021 on WPSD. We Stand by our vow, to continue to support the UN Global Compact and All its Principles in entirety. Thank you.
